This month, the answer is: A member of the world's largest service club organization. Lions International has almost 1.4 million members in 200+ countries and territorial areas around the world, and nowhere is that more apparent than at the International Convention. Lion Jeff and I attended our first International Convention held this year in Boston July 7 – 11. During the convention, we marched a mile down the streets of Boston with the Lions of Indiana, nestled between the Lions of India and the Lions of Indonesia. Lion Zone Chair Frank Faulkner carried the American flag for Indiana and Lion Jeff carried the Lions flag. We voted to elect Past International Director Mark Lyon of Connecticut as the new Third International Vice President and approved changes to the Bylaws around eligibility to run for International Director and roles of the district governor team. We were joined in Boston by Past International Director Doug Lozier, Past District Governor Kathy Lozier, Vice Area Leader/ Immediate Past Council Chair Scott Smith, Past District Governor Isabel Atcheson, newsletter editor Christine Woodward and Marion Lion Kassie Lemons. We met Lions from India, Taiwan, Nepal, Australia, the Netherlands, Germany, Brazil, Canada, Japan, and all over the United States. We were fired up about Lionism and we hope to attend the International Convention in Melbourne, Australia next June.

New International President Dr. Patti Hill announced her theme for 2023-24 as "Changing the World." She asked that we work on environmental projects, which is why we have a goal in 25D that every club <u>perform and report</u> an environmental service project. She also announced Mission 1.5 – a plan to increase our global membership to 1.5 million members by June 20, 2027. Your 25D delegation has accepted the challenge, and we will be working to form new clubs and encouraging our existing clubs to recruit at least one new member or increase membership by 10%. Our district leadership team, including our new 2nd vice district governor Jim Dubeansky of Union City, is ready to visit your clubs and induct new members, and GMT/GET Jeff is working on district-wide new member orientation. Join us in making the **world's largest service club organization** bigger and better at serving a world in need.

Greeting! I hope everyone is doing well. As mentioned last month, I will be using games to talk Lions because I feel games (and Lions) should be fun, work to achieve a positive outcome, and allow you to spend time with people. Related to achieving a positive outcome, one of the things I love most about games is there is a clearly defined objective you are trying to achieve. There are rules that define the game play and the objective, but knowing the objective allows you to develop plans and strategies to reach the objective. Noblesville Lion Julia Kozicki is Installed as 25-D District Governor

Julia, and her husband Jeff, are both Noblesville Lions and recently attended the 105th Lions Club International Convention in Boston, MA. The convention was held from July 6th thru the 11th.

While there, Julia completed her 4th day of District Governor Elect training, and was given her diploma by the class trainer, Past District Governor Chief Bassey Edem of Nigeria.

Julia and Jeff marched in the Lions International Parade with the Indiana delegation as Jeff carried the Lions flag, and the other district governors and Julia carried the banner.

The convention included comments from keynote speakers and incoming international officers during the 3 plenary sessions. Attending were more than 11,000 delegates, and on Tuesday Julia was officially sworn in as 25-D District Governor.

The Wednesday following her induction as Governor, Julia was off to a Muncie Lions Club event. And the next day Thursday, the 13th she hosted her first 25-D Governor's meeting at the Carmel Lions Club. The Noblesville Lions Club is proud of Julia Kozicki and her leadership, as she is the first District Governor from Noblesville since Roy Kirk in the 70s.

Information and Technology Article for District 25D

Information security, social media, Artificial Intelligence, phishing, two-factor authentication, hacking, dark web and all manner of technical subjects are in the news daily. You can't avoid it. During this Lion year, we will attempt to help you stay safe online whether that be on a desktop or mobile device.

This month: passwords. Passwords give you first-level security for your account or device. However, the wrong password stops hackers as much as does a chain link fence trying to stop blowing sand. When choosing a password, it should ...

 Not contain common dictionary words, names of family members, pet names, birthdates, anniversaries, university name, etc. This information about you is online and aids hackers.

- Contain numbers, special characters (e.g., \$, #, %, *), letters (at least one lower and one upper case)
- Should not be used across multiple logons or devices.
- Be unique for all online banking. Never repeat your banking password elsewhere even for other banking accounts.
- Not be shared with anyone. Distrust any company that asks you for your personal password.

Below is a grid from **HIVE Systems** showing how long it can take a hacker to brute force hack your password given the number and type of characters in it. Yearly, the time decreases significantly in each category. See where your password falls.

District 25D Eyeglass Recycling Update

On July 21. 2023, District 25A Eyeglass Recycling team came to District 25D Eyeglass Distribution Center at the Greentown Lions Club and picked up approx.. 45,000 eyeglasses to be recycled. They loaded approx.. 200 boxes of used eye glasses. District 25A sorts these eyeglasses and sends them to be cleaned, graded, read, boxed ready to be sent to mission fields all over the world.

District 25A has been working with the Westville Correctional Facility for over 20 years. The Westville facility has processed over 6,000,000 used eyeglasses since 1994. Look under District 25A recycling center to see a complete booklet of how Westville recycles the used eyeglasses.




