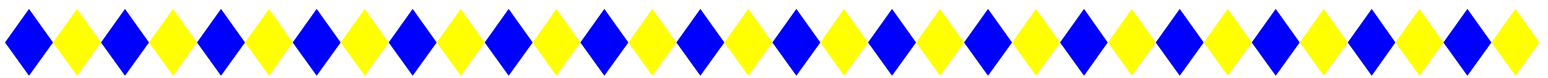

## LeaderShip

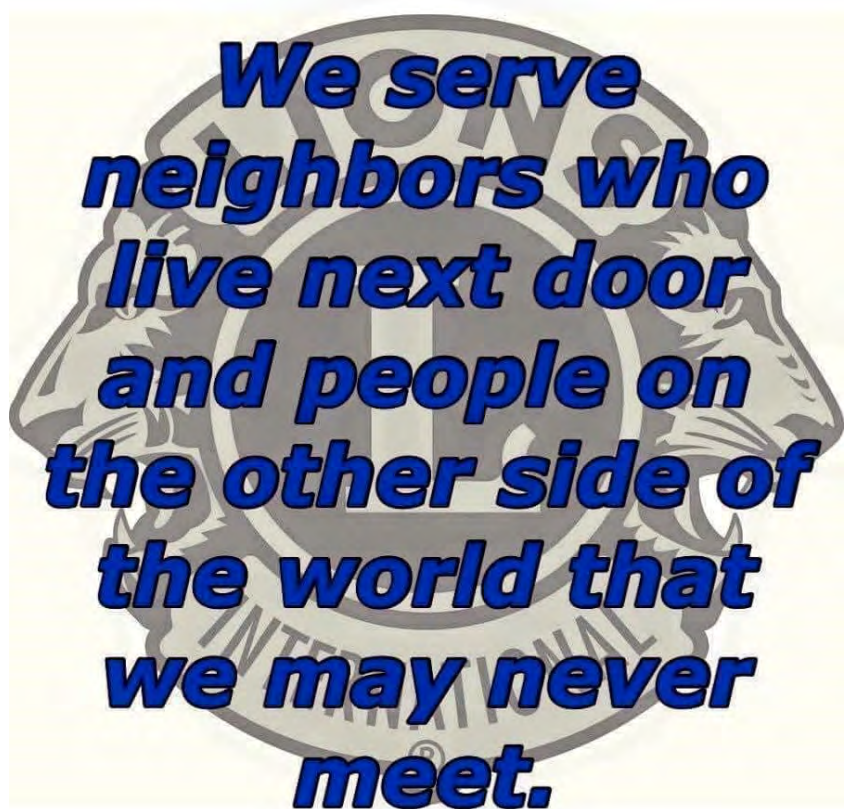
Continuing through the letters of LEADERSHIP, this month's focus is **S** for **Service**. This is an easy letter for Lions, because of course 'We Serve.'

## Club Dynamics

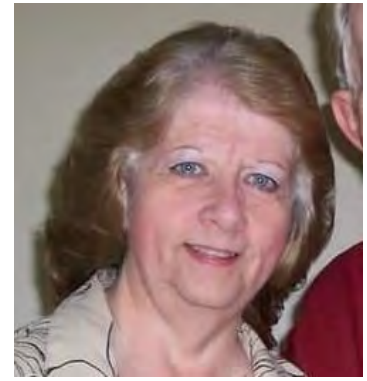

## Global Service Team – Lion Cindy Wright

This month I am going to express to you the importance of the “Chain of Command” in any organization, job, sport, etc. It is not to show authority but to show how a “well oiled machine” works.

You, as the Lion member, will start the machine working. Once you complete your service projects or fundraisers, the project chair needs to turn in information to your club secretary. It is the secretary’s responsibility to report the results to MyLion. MyLion is the information program that keeps track of your clubs activities. It also gives Lions International the information they need to promote Lions and to inform businesses, etc., when applying for grants or asking for donations for the hundreds of service projects 1.3 million Lions are doing all around the world. The various committee chairs have to follow-up with clubs to assist clubs with completing projects, find a resource, or whatever they need. The chairs are very important as they are another “link” in the “chain” to keep things running smoothly.



One of the positions I hold, is Region 2 - Zone A Chair. It is my responsibility to inform the clubs of various changes made in our district, district events, help with resources, club reporting, work with clubs to solve issues they are having, help with training officers, inducting new members and officers, work with other Zone Chairs to keep the “machines” of District 25D up and running.

In District 25D, there are over 60 committee chairs needed to be filled to make this “machine” work. Several Lions in our District hold more than one committee chair. In fact, several hold 2 to 4 positions in our District, which then, doubles or triples their work load. When the club’s membership reports are not posted to MyLCI or the service and fund raiser reports are not posted on MyLion, we have a “break in the chain”. If even as much as one club fails to post their information, all the work the committee chairs have done, has gone to waste. If and when the info is finally posted, the reports have to be redone. The “chain” has been “broken”. It does not take but about 10-15 minutes to post your information if you keep up with it. If you don’t have access to post your reports, assign another member in your club as the “Club Administrator” or contact PDG Lion Betty Weist, as she is the district administrator. Various committee chairs need to report to the 25D District Governor, the information that the clubs have reported. The information he collects is used at the District meetings, District Governor meetings, at State and International conventions. It is also used all the way up to Lions International. It is valuable information that is used to spread the word of how “We Serve” the world in so many ways.

So the next time you post your membership information, your service projects and your fund raisers, just remember, you are keep this “well oiled machine” running smoothly. We need to hold true to our motto, “We Serve” and prove to the world that “Where there is a Need, there is a Lion”.

## VISION SCREENING

As you all should know, Vision is one of the most important service projects Lions International is known for. In 1925, Helen Keller challenged the Lions to be "Knights of the Blind". We work hard to keep that promise to her.

BUT....How are the people of the world going to know this if we do not report the number of people we service. Vision screening is a very easy service project to complete and is very rewarding.

SO...DO YOU...

- 1) Contact your local school systems to set up screening dates?

Best time to do this is about a month after school starts. The school nurse has to have these mandated test figures by a deadline to the State of Indiana.

- 2) Supply the information form to the school nurse or each student to be completed and presented at the time of screening?
- 3) Is your Vision Screening team properly trained?
- 4) Do you have a standard team that screens?
- 5) Do you wear your Lions Club gear (shirt, vest or hat)?
- 6) Do you work with social media (facebook, LC newsletter, local newspaper) to present a completed service project to your community?

MOST IMPORTANT!!.....

- 7) Do you report your numbers to your District Vision Screening Chair?

- 8) What you need to report:

- a) School name
- b) Number screened
- c) Number passed
- d) Number referred, and of course
- e) Your Club name

- 9) Report this service project to MyLion -- preferably as soon as it is done.

It is very important that Lions of Indiana get these numbers. We need to know that these programs are working, that vision screening is being offered to your local schools. The State Vision Screen Chair passes along these numbers to Lions International so they can report to the public what our 1.3 million Lions are doing. This helps bring in donations for a much needed service project for children all around the world.

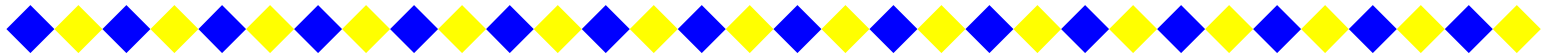

## District 25D Contests

### CLUB VISITATION CONTEST

1. The Visitation Contest will run from July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022.
2. Only visitations to other clubs at their regular meetings will be counted.
3. The following minimum number of visiting Lions are required to qualify.
  - Clubs with 20 or less members – 2 members
  - Clubs with 21-35 members – 3 members
  - Clubs with 36 or more members – 4 members
4. The following are the categories of Club Visitation awards:
  - Long Tail Award – Visiting 100% of District 25D Clubs
  - Short Tail Award – Visiting all Clubs in your Region
  - Ambassador Award – Visiting all Clubs in another Region
  - Nomad Award – Visiting 20 Clubs or your choice, within or outside District 25D
5. It is wise to contact the club to be visited to verify that they will not be dark, the location of the meeting, time, etc.
6. No visitation may be used for more than one category of award. No visitation may be used twice.
7. Clubs may earn as many awards or combination of awards they wish.
8. The following are considered “District Lions” and **will not** be counted when making their official visits: Governor, Vice Governor, Cabinet Secretary, Cabinet Treasurer, Region Chairperson and Zone Chairperson.
9. When there is a Zone or Region Meeting, visiting members will receive credit for only one club and Region.



### REPORTING VISITATIONS

1. Visitation slips should not be larger than 8 1/2 x 11 or smaller than 5 1/2 x 8 1/2.
2. All visitation slips must show the name of the visiting club name of the visited club, names of visiting Lions, date of visitation, and be signed by the Secretary/President of the visited club to qualify. The Club Secretary will report all visitations to the District 25D Cabinet Secretary by the end of the month the visitation takes place.
3. Winners will be announced at the first Cabinet Meeting of the 2022-2023 Lion Year.

### ENVIRONMENTAL PHOTO CONTEST

The 2021-2022 Environmental Photo Contest is open to all Lions in District 25-D, and Leos. This year's contest will depict four categories and one special theme. No people in photos submitted in the categories BELOW.

Animal Life

Plant Life

Urban or Natural Landscape

Weather phenomenon

Special Theme Environmental Service projects—This category can include individuals in the photo. (Example: Lions planting trees, or kids playing in a new park, etc.)

Photos should be original, unaltered and taken in your area this Lion Year. Photos should measure 8"x10" and printed borderless on high quality photo paper. Photos with white borders will be disqualified. All photographers accept responsibility for the cost of taking and processing all photos. Lions Clubs and Leo Clubs are invited to submit one photo in each category to the District Environmental Chair pdf Mike Imbler by January 1, 2022. The photographer should specify which category they want their photo(s) entered. Each photo should list location where picture was taken and date.

Winners and awards for the contest will be announced at the District 25-D Convention in March 2022.

First contest: July 1 2021—December 21, 2021

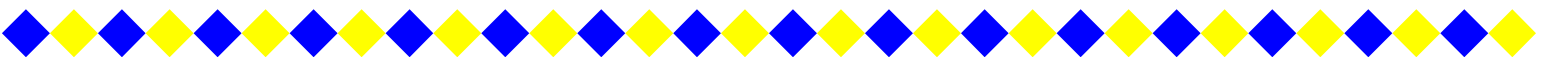
Second contest: January 1, 2022—June 30, 2022

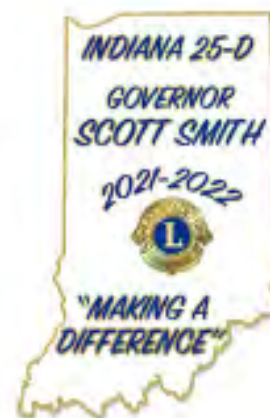
