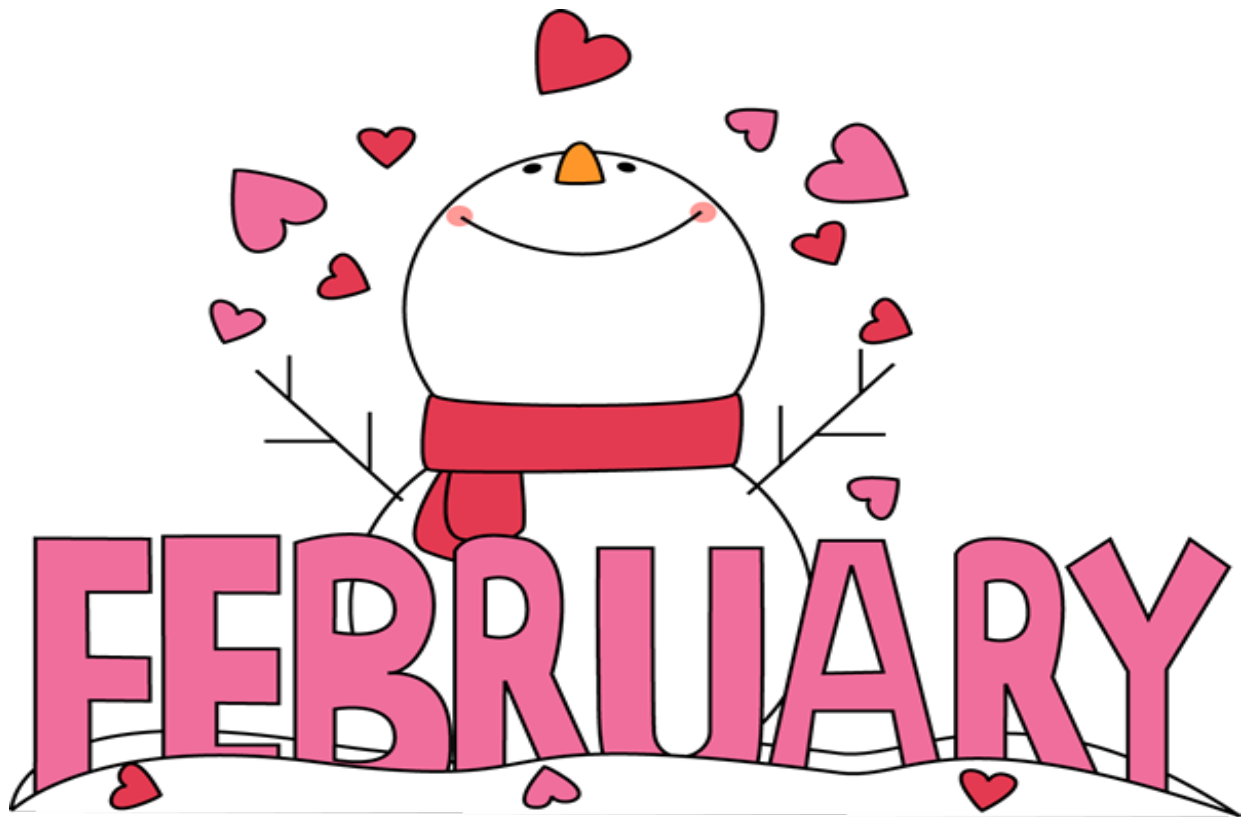

In the meantime, following up on my thoughts for the new year, here is a goal that I believe EVERY club can achieve. This goal may seem a little off topic from Membership, but I firmly believe that if we have a goal which includes members doing service, when we achieve that goal, the positive feeling of pride (Lions Pride??) will become infectious and we will have many more happy and active Lions.

What is this magical goal? Have your club earn the Club Excellence Award! You may not have known this exists, or care about “awards”, but this award is really just a list of things that positive energetic clubs are doing. There is a form that needs to be completed and signed by the governor within 12 months of the end of the Lions year. If you search anywhere for “Lions Club Excellence Award,” the first listing takes you to the LCI page with the criteria and the form, or feel free to email me, and I will send it to you. The requirements cover five areas:

- 1 **Membership** – Have a net growth of the greater of 10% or 2 members.
- 2 **Service** – Start a new service project and participate in, and report to LCI, 3 service activities.
- 3 **LCIF** – Make a donation of (the lesser of) \$20 per member or \$1,000.
- 4 **Leadership** – The club is in good standing and the club officers have been reported to LCI and have been trained.
- 5 **Marketing** – The club has published service activities through local and social media.

I encourage every club to set a goal to do this. I know you can do it! As always, thank you for being a Lion and not only wanting the best for your community but leading the way in serving it.

Your efforts are greatly appreciated.
