
Fellow Lions Of District 25-D

There will be a letter to be submitted to the School Board, Principal and Superintendent to request permission for a one home game collection for the Special Olympics program. Your club must have a representative there to sign for the bucket and determine which School is going to be collected for. There will only be one Club collecting for that Football game and we should do it but once per calendar year.

This will count for Service to the Community and your Secretary will be able to document the Service hours for that game for your Club. PDG Steve or Treasurer Christine will then tally the amount of money you collected and report the effort at each Cabinet meeting.

Lions Holding Corporation Trustees Meeting of June 8, 2024.

The trustees of the Indiana Lions Foundation and Indiana Lions Holding Corporation met at the state office building in Indianapolis on Saturday, June 8th, 2024. At this meeting the trustees approved six, \$1,000 matching grants for projects of the Auburn, Plainfield, South Haven, Decatur Central, Clermont and Lafayette clubs. This brings the total of matching grants for the current fiscal year to \$17,368. A \$1,000 disaster assistance grant was given to the Union City club to assist with needs caused by the storm damage earlier this spring.
