

#### MANDATORY CLUB OFFICER ELECTIONS

(DEADLINE FOR OFFICER REPORTING IS May 15, 2020)

Even though your Lions Clubs may not be meeting, every Club must still elect officers for the coming Lions Fiscal Year. There are three very important reasons:

- Election of officers is constitutionally mandated
- Election of officers ensures proper Club leadership and leadership transition
- Creation of the yearly District Directory depends on accurate officer information in MyLCI

You can elect officers without holding face-to-face meetings. A few suggestions are . . .

Mailing campaign

Conference call with all members invited

Direct phone calls by your election committees

Mail out the slate of candidates to all members. If you think meeting restrictions will be lifted by mid-April, schedule a special meeting the first of May to complete the vote.

With any of the above approaches, start now to ensure completion by May 15, 2020.

#### **REGARDING THE SPRING MEMBERSHIP ROUND-UP**

The Spring Membership Round-up originally scheduled for April 1 through May 31 is being adjusted to May 1 through June 30. Once we Lions have shown to make a difference for others even in the face of adversity like COVID-19, we should be able to attract even more members to help further service.

#### It's Spring Round-Up Time!!

Yes, it's time to get out there and **ROUND-UP** all the new Lions we want to build great clubs! It's time for our Spring Membership Drive!

When: May 1 through June 30, 2020

Goal: 100 new members logged into MyLCI by Jul 15, 2020

**How** are we going to do this?

**Find** new member *prospects* at fundraisers, Spring festivals, news articles, TV news, Facebook, wherever you meet people! **Refer** prospects if you're not comfortable making the approach.

**Tell** them that you think they are doing great and have they ever considered being a Lion? You may get their permission to ask them to be a Lion quicker than you think!

**Follow-up** on your *contacts* with a message inviting them to talk more about being a Lion if they want to hear more, later.

**Make the ask.** "So, would you like to be a Lion with us?" is a great suggestive ask. Fill out the paperwork, and get their card or check.

**POST YOUR SUCCESS.** Welcome your new members on your club Facebook page and website with photos and their permission. Their example will bring their friends and family! Send pictures to the newsletter and Hoosier Lion!

**Make them your newest recruiter.** Once sworn in, ask them who else they would like to bring along to the party!

### **Lions HQ Oak Brook office closure extended to May 30**

The Illinois State government in the USA announced that its stay-at-home order will be extended until at least May 30 to slow the spread of the coronavirus. The measures included the requirement to cease all nonessential services in the state. Lions Clubs International is identified as "nonessential." To comply with the state mandate, the Lions Clubs International Headquarters in Oak Brook will be closed at least until May 30, 2020. While staff will not physically be in the building, staff teams will be working remotely and available during business hours to respond to the needs of Lions. You may contact LCI staff or LCIF staff as needed. The performance of systems may be impacted due to the increased number of people working remotely, and response time may be affected. Some of our business operations that require physical interaction will likely be limited. More details will be provided as the situation evolves, but here is some preliminary guidance:

- Regarding payment of outstanding dues, we recommend that districts allow clubs that are able to demonstrate they have sent or submitted payment to participate in voting. This could be via a bank statement, copy of demand draft, etc. Clubs will not be cancelled during this time based on the challenges related to receiving and processing physical checks and electronic payments.
- For Lions International payments, please utilize online payment options via MyLCI or any other electronic payment method (ACH, SEPA, Boleto, NEFT, etc.) instead of sending checks to the office.
- Please submit LCIF donations via the website instead of sending checks to the office. Please also note that grant disbursements and recognition will be delayed while the office is closed.
- There will be delays in shipping awards and recognitions, club supplies orders, as well as delays in processing reimbursements.

We appreciate your patience during these extraordinary times and wish for the health and safety of all our Lions and staff around the world.
