

This is a great fundraiser for the foundation and helps to fund the yearly \$750 grants available to all Indiana Lions Clubs, so if your club needs money to start a new project for the year get your application into the foundation. Lion Katherine and I attended a very informative Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) committee and training meeting at the Lions State Office building, Lion Katherine had also attended an Emergency Preparedness Committee meeting in Kokomo led by PDG Jane Ford. All of which later became very helpful as the tornado outbreak in Howard County hit Kokomo in the end of August. I applied for a LCIF Emergency Disaster Assistance Grant which was quickly approved by Immediate Past International President and LCIF Chair Lion Dr. Yamada for \$10,000. We initially utilized \$10,000 from our District 25D funds to expedite getting aid to the affected area. The district's money was replaced when the LCIF check was received.

I wish to commend the Lions Disaster Relief team and the volunteers on the ground for their quick and planned response to the disaster to aid the victims of the disaster. The Lions Clubs in the area and our district responded with even more donations to help eight families that had to be turned down when the money from the \$10,000 LCIF grant ran out. The donations kept coming in and will be used to help our disaster partners The Red Cross and The United Way in the Kokomo area to continue long-term assistance. WOW! What a great witness of how Lions live up to our motto "We serve" and "Where there's a need there's a Lion." I am so proud to be your 25D District Governor.


