Lions from around Indiana had good fellowship while participating in the fundraising effort for the Indiana Lions Foundation, which supports local grant opportunities. Past International Director Doug Lozier and Past District Governor Kathy Lozier deserve extra appreciation as they were at the Fair every day manning Gate 12. If you didn't join the fun this year, consider saving a day for the Fair next year.

This year I am focusing on ways to recognize and appreciate those Lions in our midst. Everyone needs a pat on the back now and then, and offering one is an act of service. This month, I'm specifically sharing about the Lions Club International Foundation and the Melvin Jones Fellowship. For those who are newer to Lionism, Lions Club International Foundation (LCIF) is the non-profit arm of Lions International. Its primary purpose is to have funds available for five priority areas: vision, youth, diabetes, disaster relief and humanitarian efforts (which includes childhood cancer, hunger and environmental causes). For the last few years, LCIF has been focused on their Campaign 100, which ultimately raised more than \$325 million to support things such as relief for the Kentucky tornado victims, relief for Ukrainian refugees and a number of vision and youth empowerment issues. If your club has an idea for a project in these areas, you may qualify for a LCIF grant. Talk to our LCIF contact, PDG Steve Holtzleiter, if you need assistance.

Just as the Indiana Lions Foundation recognizes Lions with the W.P. Woods Fellowship, LCIF offers the Melvin Jones Fellowship as a recognition of Lions worldwide. The Melvin Jones Fellowship is named in honor of Melvin Jones, one of the founders of Lionism. The Melvin Jones Fellowship can be awarded to Lions or non-Lions who have given service to Lions. It also recognizes contributions to LCIF in the amount of \$1,000. LCIF awarded more than \$33.3 million in grants in 2020-21.

If your club has donated regularly to LCIF, you likely have the credits to honor a member with a Melvin Jones Fellowship. Who can your club thank for their service to Lionism? Take the time to thank your dedicated Lions this month.

One of our Lions is...

when I was in Cub Scouts (trust me, this will tie back into Lions and Membership in a minute), our meetings were always immediately after school. Our Den met on the other side of town, but it was easy to get there, as all eight of us were in the same class, so we got on the school bus headed to the home of our Den Leader. Webelos was pretty much the same, although our Webelos Leader's house was only about five blocks from school, so we all walked. I remember a lot of laughing and joking on the way and there was a White Hen Pantry mini mart that we would pass...well, stop in and get candy and



baseball cards. The point is we had as much fun on the way as at the meeting.

This all changed when I moved into Boy Scouts. The meetings were at school, but in the evening. One of my parents had to drive me, as it was quite a distance. No one else in the Troop lived in my neighborhood, so there were no opportunities to carpool. Often, it was hard to get to meetings with my parent's and sister's schedules affecting who could be taken or picked up and at what time. The Scout meetings were OK, but they were basically meetings that didn't have a lot of fun in them. After a while, I stopped going, and no one ever asked me why.

I see a lot of similarities between my Scouting experience and what can happen in Lions (see, I told you I'd tie it back). We are all extremely busy. I know often, I am racing to get from work to our Club's meetings. When we get there, the meetings are a lot of fun. But there are always some members not there, and we normally say, "it's a shame ... isn't here". I'd like to challenge all Lions to look at this differently and to act differently. Maybe the reason they aren't at the meeting is they don't have a good way to get there. Or they feel they will be looked at oddly since they haven't been around for a while. Or they don't know anyone that well and feel like an outsider. I have always found Lions open and excited to see and talk with people at a meeting. Let's prove we want them at the meeting by reaching out to missing members and offer to pick them up. In fact, even if you don't need a ride, carpool when possible. This can be a benefit for everyone involved, as the time going to the meeting and coming back can allow for a lot of fun conversation and getting to know each other better. Like Scouts, our meetings are often Meetings and we might wave at each other and say a few pleasantries, but that is about all. I encourage you to take someone with you to the meeting, giving you more time to connect.

And I'd encourage you to do come as a group, not just for Club Meetings, but for District events and State events, the Banner Night in your District, or any Lion event. Often people don't attend these because they are far, or they feel awkward going alone, or they don't think they will be welcome. Going as a group will overcome this and give lots of time to chat and have fun on the drive. Wherever you go, think about taking other Lions with you.

Thank you for being a Lion. Thank you for all of the time and energy you put into your Club and your community. Thank you for helping others have a great time as Lions.




25D Banner Night
