Ms. Shelley Wieske, an outstanding physical trainer who conducts fitness classes at The City of First Gym in Kokomo came to a Russiaville Lions Club meeting. Shelley and three of her “Fitness Queenagers” demonstrated several exercises that are designed to improve one’s “functional fitness”. So what is “functional fitness”? As an example, it involves the basic moves and muscle strength needed to pick up something off the floor and put it on a shelf. Or perhaps, emptying the clothes dryer or unloading the dish washer and putting the dishes away.

Shelley’s fitness clients testified that she is definitely highly skilled as a motivator for personal movement, stretching and healthy food choices. Most importantly, her group of “Queenagers” testified that Shelley is a real expert in putting the fun into “functional fitness”. The message of her talk was clear, “Start now, but start slowly”, to make your moves towards improved functional fitness during 2024.” Some words of wisdom from Shelley and the Fitness Queenagers are:

1. “Running late does not count as exercise.”
2. “It’s better to be the oldest person in the gym than being the youngest person in the nursing home.”
3. “Some people dream of success, while others stay awake and work hard at it”

On a cold January evening, we Russiaville Lions were twisting, stretching, pulling and rolling over the floor. Shelley’s presentation definitely called for audience participation and left some of us... asking for more. But early this morning this Russiaville Lion woke up feeling more fitness inspired...but just a little bit sore.

Some Lions may twist and some may shout but during 2024, movement towards the goal of improved functional fitness is what we Russiaville Lions are about. Service to others and intentional movement towards improved functional fitness. These are both very good goals for 2024. So... Can I get a witness?
