Governor's Corner

If you missed the District Convention, you missed a blessing and a good time. International Director Gwen White and PDG Rhett Butler White brought messages and information useful to all Lions, Clubs and our district. Motivation is a key element in everything we do and maintaining our membership is equally important. While we continue to add new members, we still lose them. Retention is our main issue. To retain members we need to maintain activities everyone can participate in, listen to member's ideas, and insure members feel an essential part of the club. Sponsors can assist in this role to insure the members stay engaged.

The challenge is for April growth. District Governors, 1st Vice District Governors and 2nd Vice District Governors each have donated a sum of \$1400.00 in a growth challenge. The District having the highest number of paid members during the month of April will win the money. So, if our District wins, the Club with the most paid members during the month of April will receive half of the winnings or \$700.00. So, let's go to work to bring in those new members to serve our communities and keep the members we already have. Remember, new members may be inducted by our International President Gudren Yngvadottir during the State Convention.

Reports continue to be an issue. Some clubs just want to consider their communities and so don't think the reports are important. Not only are the reports important, the content is important as well. Did you know philanthropic organizations donate to LCI based on the number of hours lions report on their Service Activity Reports? So those clubs not submitting reports limit the amount of donations these entities donate. Reports are very important! To assist clubs, LCI has made available a Club Administrator to assist in reporting.

While we are on reports, your Officer reports are needed for the District Directory for next year. Elections should be completed and the reports due in April. Assembling all the data for the Directory takes time as well as scheduling and completing printing. All the other Districts are getting their Directories ready for printing and we need to be ready to get on the printing sequence. Please verify all the data for each officer, including birth day as well as month and year, meeting time and place, and address.

LCIF also deserves our support. As a district we have benefitted far more than we have given, and it is our Foundation. Donations are lagging behind as so far only 22 clubs have donated so far. Let us not forget the disaster relief grants we have received in the past as well as large grants we've received to help us serve our communities better. For those contributing, THANK YOU!

Three months are left in this Lions Year. More than enough time remains to meet our goals of Membership, Leadership, Service, and LCIF.

To start a new club we need a team to work together for a short time. Newburgh is on our radar on the Ohio River East of Evansville, but it could be another community. Just 2 Guiding Lions and some help attaining 20 or more members interested in community service is all it takes, and we have time yet this year.

Women add new ideas, contacts and enthusiasm to our clubs men can't achieve alone. We are just 5% from our goal of 40% women in our clubs. Again, we have time to enlist Women's Development methods to appeal to ladies for membership. Remember they want to be busy in our clubs, not just stand by. Provide a service in your club appealing to the women in your community.

Reporting MMR's is so easy. Every club reports dropped and new members, but during months of no change iust go to My LCI, log in and in Membership click the box of no change. It is that simple and requires so little time. It is important because LCI cannot assume your club has made no change in any given month; you must report it that month to be counted for LCI usage.

We all agree LCIF is important to our individual clubs. The question is how does a small club support an organization outside our own community. The answer is very easy. Everyone has loose change or even a dollar they can spare. During your meetings, place a "tin Cup" on the table and announce it is for loose change or dollar donation for LCIF. Give the amount to your club treasurer to send to Lion Cabinet Treasurer Richard Kaiser noting on the check it is your clubs donation to LCIF. Individuals may make their own donations the same way, and many do. Just send a check in any amount you determine to Lion CT Richard noting it is your donation to LCIF and let him know the club you are in.

April is Environmental Awareness Month. Earth Day is April 22nd. Is your club doing anything for April? If you read the Lion Magazine for March 2019 you will see all kinds of projects Lions have done all over the word. A lot of trees are being planted. If you go on line to lionmagazine.org there is more service ideas.



The earth has lost its share of trees to floods, fires, high winds and other natural disasters. Trees according to Morton Arboretum, a living museum in Illinois say, "Trees make communities healthier, clean the air we breathe, save energy, shelter and feed wildlife, naturally manage storm water, and increase property

How much is a tree worth? According to TreeBenefitCalculator.org one tree is worth \$215 per year. How is this figured out? Intercepting approximately 3,336 gallons of storm water per year, raising the property value by \$38 a year, conserving 302 Kilowatt hours of electricity for cooling, and reducing atmospheric carbon by 907pounds. You thought a tree was just to climb.

With Lions Club having more than 1.4 million members all over the world, Lions should be able to help bring back the trees. Trees were currently disappearing at a rate of 73.4 million acers per year in 2017. The rate is higher in the year 2019. Do you think this would be a great project for your Community?

Disasters strike all over the world, seemingly every day. Sometimes, significant disasters occur in different areas all at once. During times like this, Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) is able to offer support to local Lions Clubs International for their disaster relief work.

In the past few weeks, several of our constitutional areas have experienced devastating tragedy. Catastrophic floods are overwhelming the central United States and parts of Mozambique, Malawi, and Zimbabwe.

In the US, hundreds of levees were breached and entire towns have been destroyed. The land and the farmers whose livelihood depends on it are devastated. In Nebraska alone, livestock and crops losses are expected to reach \$1 billion. It will likely take years to recover from this disaster.

In the days immediately following the disaster, LCIF awarded five Emergency grants totaling US\$50,000. The gravity of the situation has become more apparent, and your foundation has responded with another US\$50,000 Major Catastrophe grant for all affected regions.

In Mozambique, Malawi, and Zimbabwe, thousands of people are missing in the wake of Cyclone Idai. The death toll cannot even be estimated right now. Residents of these countries are in dire need of food, water, medical supplies, shelter and sanitation.

To assist local Lions in their relief efforts, LCIF initially awarded two US\$10,000 Emergency grants. As the devastating effects of this disaster have become more apparent, your Foundation has responded again with a US\$50,000 Major Catastrophe grant for the affected countries.

We are only able to offer this assistance because of your generous support. Your donations to LCIF's disaster relief fund enable us to provide Lions with the tools they need to help those who need us most.

For all the reasons you serve, please give.



Optional offices that can be elected and reported are as follows:

- LCIF club coordinator which reports LCIF related items and works to raise funds for LCIF.
- Club Administrator which assists the club in reporting.
- Club Service Chair which helps the club in reporting activities.
- Club Marketing Chair which is responsible for the club public relations.

It is important that each officer's information is updated before you file the report. You will need officers' birthday in order to update their information. Please make sure names, addresses, phone numbers, spouses' names and e-mail addresses are correct. It is very important that e-mail addresses for all officers are included and correct. Most communication is now done by e-mail and your officers will not receive that communication if their e-mail addresses are not known or are incorrect.

Once all your incoming officers' information has been updated, click on "More Officers" in the lower right corner of your club's Home Page. Then click on "Select Term" in the upper left corner and then "Next Year." Then click on "Add Officer" for Club President. Then click on "Select Member." Find the correct member and click on that member. As you report each officer for next year, be sure to click "save" if that box shows up before starting to report the next officer. Once you have the president in place then go on and report the rest of your officers. Before you log out, click on "Club Information" on your club's Home Page and check to make sure the correct days of the month and meeting times are recorded along with the address of your meeting place.

Once you have finished, click on "Reports" and then "Lions Club Officer Report for Next Year." Save the report to your computer and then e-mail it as an attachment to DGE Sheryl Schafer at Sheryl.schafer1@comcast.net so that she can get a head start on the directory.

Dear Club President and Club Secretary

Many multiple district and district conventions are held in March, April and May, so now is the time to get ready for them! Using MyLCI, you will be able to access information about them such as the number of delegates allowed for your club and any outstanding dues or fees that need to be remitted.

The information will be available in MyLCI in the first week of the month in the month preceding the convention, or the day after the convention is reported in MyLCI, whichever is later.

To access this information in MyLCI, select "Convention" from the "My Lions Club" menu, and scroll to the district convention.

Finally, your club's balance must be paid at least 15 days prior to participation in your district and multiple district's convention. Nonpayment may make your club ineligible to vote.

Lions Club International Convention Updates – Milan, Italy July 5th thru 9th, 2019



Lions Clubs International is pleased to announce that Mr. Tony Blair, former Prime Minister of the United Kingdom and founder of the Tony Blair Institute for Global Change, will be the Keynote speaker at LCICon 2019 in Milan.

Serving as Prime Minister from 1997 to 2007, Mr. Blair redefined modern, progressive politics and implemented major domestic reforms. Through record investment and reform, the education and healthcare sectors were transformed. Mr. Blair's New Labour Government implemented the largest hospital and school building program since the creation of the UK's welfare state. 
