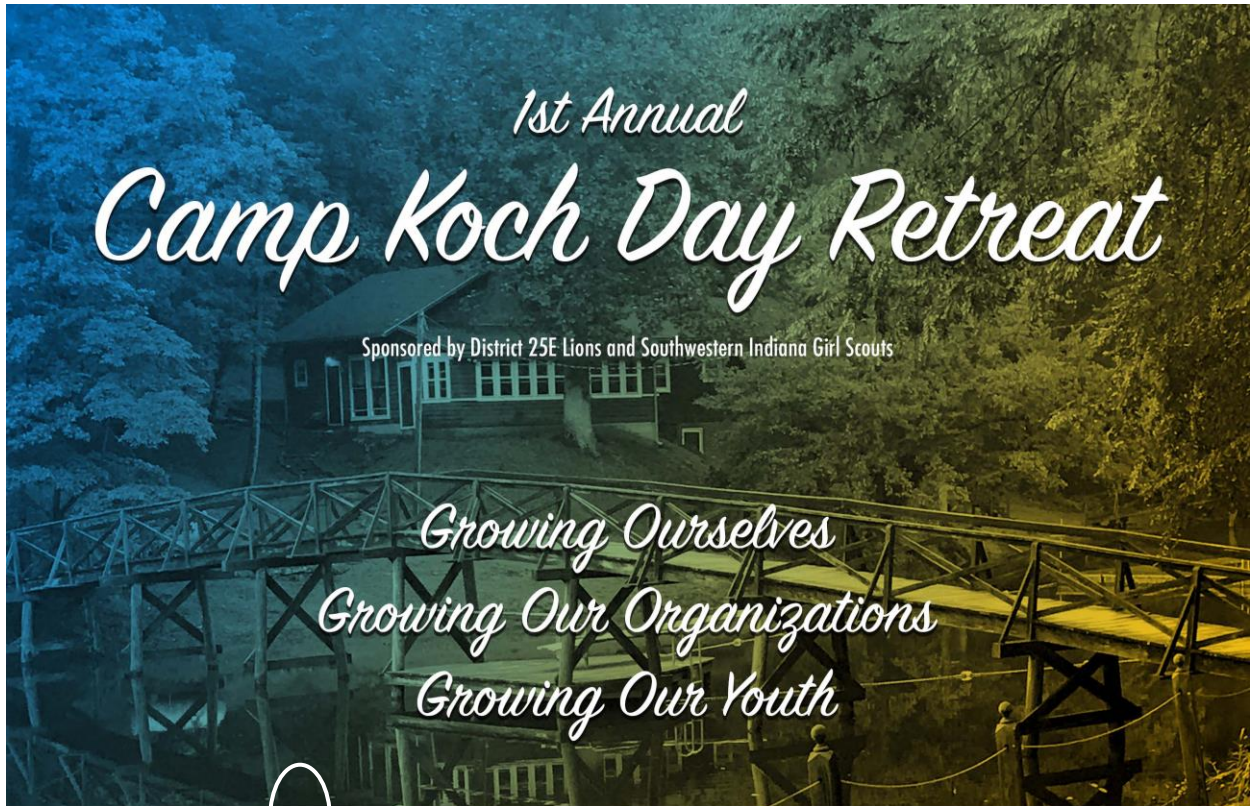

Directions to Convention Center and Courtyard Hotel:

From I-69 Indianapolis: Exit 234 (Daleville) at Indiana State Road 67, East 9 miles to Cowan Road. Turn left on Cowan for 2.1 miles and turn right onto Hoyt Road Exit. North on Hoyt to end, bear to left onto Liberty. North three blocks (1 block north of railroad tracks) and turn right into convention center parking lot or hotel parking garage.

From I-69 Fort Wayne: Exit 245 (State Road 28/35) East onto State Road 28 6.5 miles to Wheeling Pike. South on Wheeling for 6 miles when road becomes High Street after crossing White River. Continue south on High Street to Adams Street (one way west). Turn right on Adams for two blocks then left on Liberty for two blocks, then turn left into convention center parking lot or hotel parking garage.

Alternate from I-69: Exit 241 (County Road 800 North/Jackson Street/McGalliard Road). East on McGalliard to Chadam. Turn right for one block and pick-up Bethel again. Continue southeast on Bethel to Wheeling. Turn right on Wheeling going south to High Street. High Street (one way south) into downtown Muncie. Turn right onto Adams Street (one way west). Turn right on Adams for two blocks then left on Liberty for two blocks, then turn left into convention center parking lot or hotel parking garage.

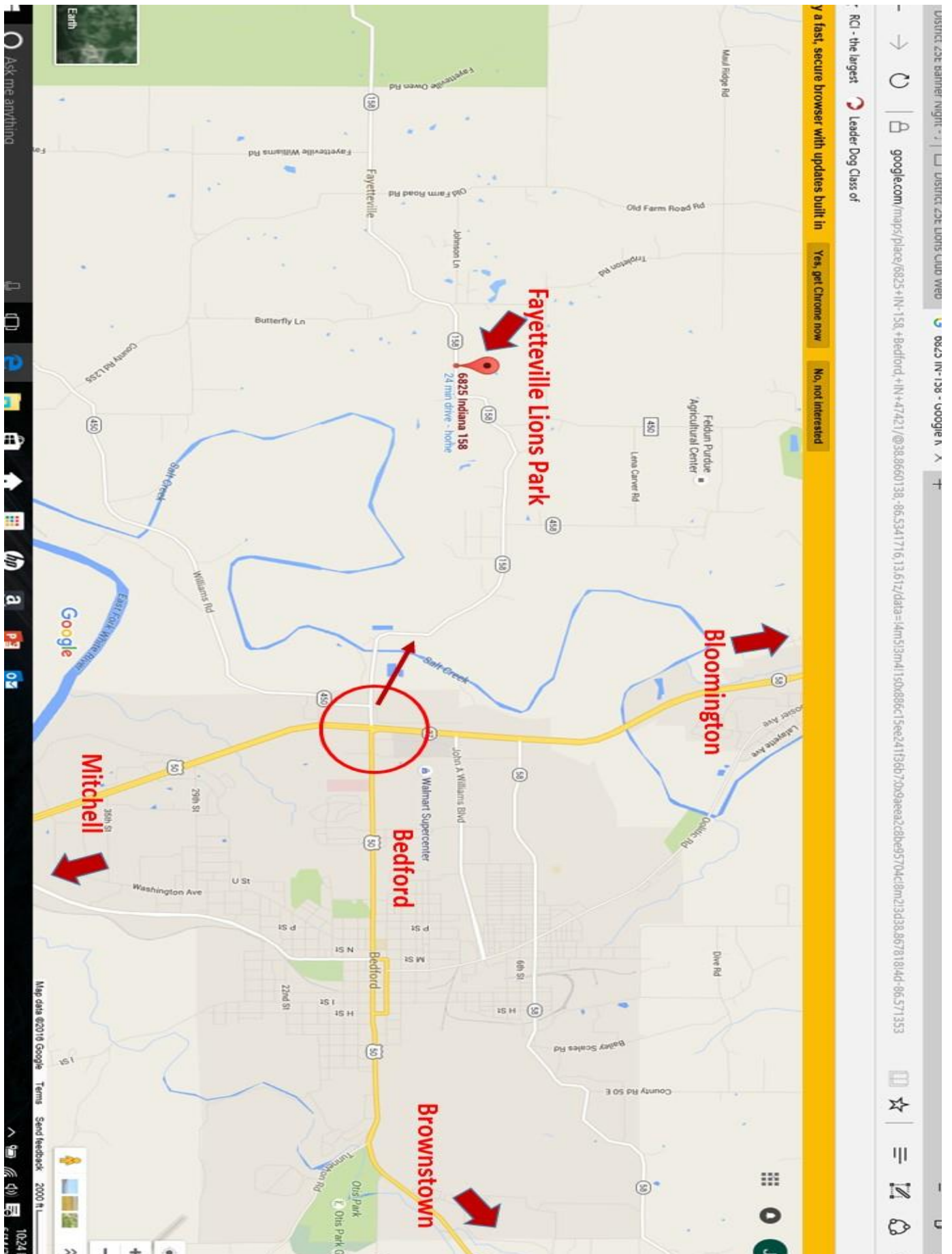

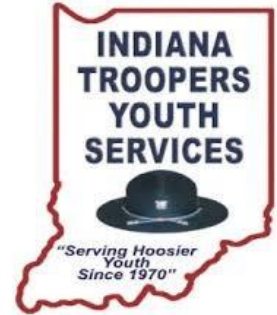

SUPPORT FOR THE INDIANA TROOPERS YOUTH SERVICES

Similar to the Indiana State Police Academy, Career Camps give high school students an in-depth and hands-on law enforcement experience. Utilizing many of the same experts that train our very own Troopers, campers get to experience some of the same things that officers do during their careers. Additionally, campers will create friendships with other campers for across and/or outside the state!

With this five day co-ed Career Camp, high school youth get to find out what it takes to be a Trooper, experience many of the other specialties within the law enforcement field and also other civilian positions that translate into experience outside the law enforcement field as well. During this five day experience, campers will be involved in a wide range of instruction, be it from conducting a crime scene investigation to speaking with Emergency Medical Services (EMS), Fire Departments, Federal Agents, defense attorneys, prosecutors and judges. The Indiana State Police will have presenters and demonstrations from many of the specialties available to you as a Trooper to include, but not limited to: SWAT, K-9, EOD (bomb squad), Scuba team, Tactical Intervention Platoon, Emergency Vehicle Operations, Defensive Tactics and Firearms, just to name a few!!



LAW CAMP

Law Camps give students entering the 6th, 7th and 8th grades a behind the scenes look at the criminal justice system.

This four day co-ed camp offers an advanced look at law enforcement through field trips, exciting demonstrations, motivating programs and some hands-on learning.

Campers meet peers from around the state, participate in recreational activities and learn with a greater understanding of the police field, as well as forming friendships to keep as they grow.

JUNIOR PIONEER CAMPOUT

Unlike the leadership camps, the Junior Pioneer Campouts are designed specifically for students between the ages of 11 and 14 who need a structured program with close supervision. Group housing, western departments, law enforcement agencies, probation departments or school counselors may recommend young people for campouts.

These co-ed campouts are held at scenic parks and allow campers to prepare their own meals, set up campfires and explore the outdoors. Additionally, campers receive one-on-one time with law enforcement officers, helping to develop and inspire a more positive outlook for the child's future, as well as creating friendships and bonds with other camp goers.

Pioneer camps are by recommendation only, as the other camps may be a better fit for your child.

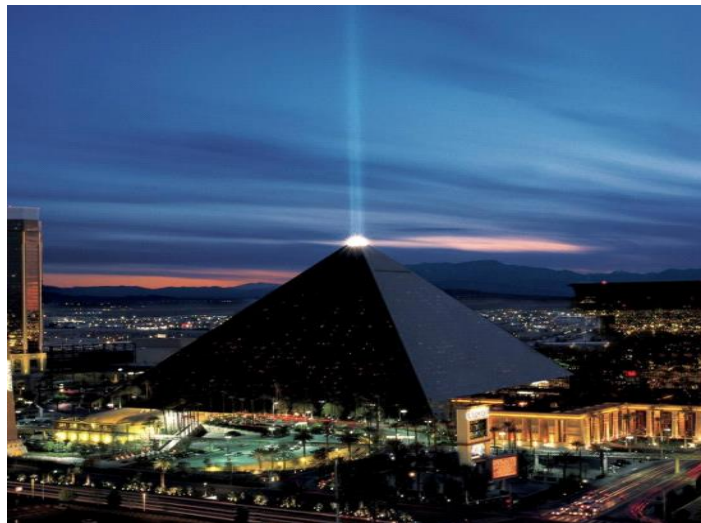
