



Lions Tackle Diabetes

Your service and our commitment to diabetes were on display at the 2018 Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl in Atlanta. We had a great in-game advertising campaign, including a new video showcasing Lions.

For the past two years, Lions Clubs International has been partnering with the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl. This partnership provides the opportunity to team local Lions with college athletes to work on service projects in their communities.

It also gives the Association a platform at the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl and the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Game to market our causes. This year, we worked with Auburn University, University of Central Florida, University of Tennessee, and the University of Alabama.

Our 2018 Peach Bowl service projects and messaging were focused on our primary new global service cause, diabetes. We effectively highlighted the urgency surrounding the disease—nearly 1 in 4 people with diabetes don't know it—and then informed them that Lions are ready to "tackle" the problem.

The campaign was a huge success, and a great way to kick off our global causes to the general public. We're proud to participate in events like the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl and look forward to another great showing next year. Be sure to visit our website for more information on our new global causes.

In January, **we had 73% MMRs** submitted and a **34% on the Activity Reports** submitted. The MMRs average went up by 6% and the Activity Reports decreased slightly by 4%. Overall, we completed 1,357 volunteer hours, collected over 350 eyeglasses and 14 hearing aids, raised over 2,300 and donated over \$3,150 and completed 120 activities. Traveling Trophy

Is there a club out there in the District that can take the Traveling Trophy away from the Petersburg Lions? What does it take to do this? The points are computed by taking the number of Lions from each club times the distance traveled for each day at the District Convention. So, if you have 4 Lions attending the "Meet the ID Dinner" on Friday and then stay over or come back to the Convention on Saturday, and the distance traveled is 100 miles round trip (RT), then that club gets 800 points (= (4 Lions * 100 miles RT) * 2 (number of days)).

So let's get everyone from your Lion's Club to attend the District Convention in Nashville on March 10 & 11. Don't forget to check your mileage when you sign in.

State and District 25-E Dues Reminder

A great big shout-out goes to all the clubs who have paid their January district and state dues assessment and to those whose "check is in the mail". "THANK YOU!".

A reminder to the remaining clubs to be sure the dues are paid by February 23, 2018. This is so those Lions representing your club as delegates to the District Spring Convention, on March 9-10, will be able to participate in the election of the next district governor, vice district governors, and project trustees. Article IX (District Convention), Section 6 (Accounts) of the District 25-E Constitution and By-Laws states: "Delinquent accounts may be paid and good standing acquired fifteen (15) days prior to the close of credential certification." In this case delinquent accounts refers to unpaid district and state dues billed in January. If your club treasurer has not received a dues statement, please contact Cabinet Treasurer Richard Kaiser immediately.

Paying your dues at the district convention just before delegate certificate closes will not be accepted.

Be sure payments are mailed early enough to reach the Cabinet Treasurer on or before February 23, 2018.

OUR CONCERN for OTHERS in LCIF

The goal for LCIF relative to Clubs is to have 100% participation. In our District a slight improvement was realized over last month. As of the end of December, 17 clubs have donated to LCIF and 13 individuals have donated. Only in two clubs did individuals and clubs donate together. Donations received from 23 clubs, out of 65 clubs in the district



computes to only 35.4% of our clubs. In January additional clubs donated, but those numbers are not available yet. Monetarily our District has donated \$8,515.22 toward a goal of \$12,000, or about 71% of our financial goal.

LCIF will have a larger responsibility as LCI takes on the added needs of Pediatric Cancer in addition to our Diabetes Awareness. All these initiatives are serious needs in all our communities and the information in the form of printed materials are quite expensive.

A sincere thank you to those clubs that have already donated. For those clubs not donating yet, please consider a donation and place a line item in your budgets for ongoing support.
