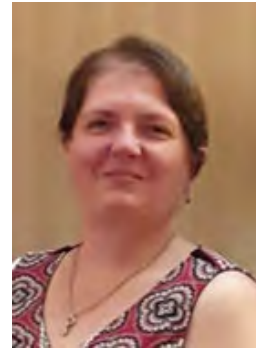

Here we go again! Another tool for the clubs' toolbox: Recruiting New Members!

First thing: The club needs to be prepared. What does the club want to accomplish and how will new members help achieve these goals? Has the club developed a member recruitment team? It is best to begin with 3-4 men and women.

Second thing: Create club growth plan. Develop an action plan that clearly outlines the efforts. Determine who will be focus of recruiting. Determine where the recruiting efforts will be focused. Gather all the materials needed for the community outreach. Plan and promote the informational meeting.

Third thing: Implement the growth plan. Reach out to target members. Host informational meeting. Follow up with attendees. Review the growth plan and adjust timelines if necessary.

Fourth thing: Welcome new members! Provide Induction Ceremony and make it something special. Properly onboard new members with Orientation! Provide Mentors (not the same as sponsors)! Use the New Member Questionnaire right away!

Other helpful hints: Ask those who completed the Community Needs Assessment for recommended potential recruits. Make a list of businesses and other organizations that focus on the club's service areas (great future partners!). Recruiting list to include: community leaders, relatives, folks that members do business with, colleagues, other professionals, neighbors, friends, religious affiliates, build a Lions network form, and use a conversation flowchart.

Diabetes is a Dirty Word

You are what you eat. Most people have heard that before, but have you really taken the time to realize what it means? I had not, until I realized my health and my life depended on it. A majority of Americans are overweight. That does not mean everyone has Diabetes, but it means you should get checked out. Getting a physical once a year and having your blood sugar and A1C tested is important.

Your Blood-Glucose reading is how high or low your sugar is right now. Taking it after eating can cause it to be higher than when you have not eaten anything. Your A1C is a compilation of the last three months of Blood-Glucose readings and is a better indicator of whether you are diabetic or not. An A1C reading of 7 or higher is generally considered diabetic, with most doctors wanting your reading below 6. Your eating and exercise have to be good for longer to get your A1C down.

OK! My reading is high. Do I have to go on insulin? There are ways to get your sugar where it should be. You can eat better and exercise. Best thing to do is check with your doctor for recommendations. A change in eating and exercise habits coupled with medication can improved your A1C and help you lose weight. It does not mean you have to skip your favorite foods and desserts. It means to eat in moderation and get off the couch.

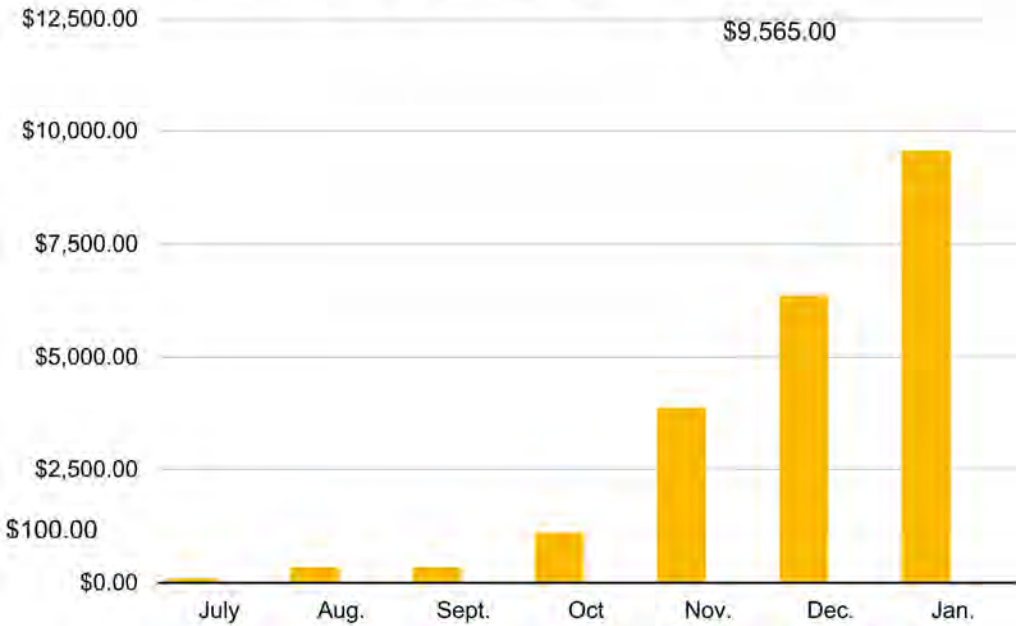

UPDATE FOR THE RILEY CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL MATCHING GRANT

NEW GOAL OF \$10,000.00



Clarification of the new rules regarding delegate counts and who can serve as a delegate for a club.

Regarding the delegate quota for a club:

Discounted members do not count toward the club delegate formula.

Regarding who can serve as a delegate:

Discounted members can be sent as a delegate for the club to cast a vote at an election.

An extreme example may be:

A Campus club exists and consists of 20 student members paying half dues. This club would receive one vote, as all active clubs get a vote, but it would not get any additional votes based on membership. The club could select any of the 20 student members, paying half dues, to serve as the delegate for that club at a convention for an election.

Another way to look at it – as far as the individual member is concerned, there is no impact – they can hold office, serve, take courses in LLC and cast votes as a delegate.

Hope this helps clear things up.

Reminder of dues deadline for voting and delegate counts for District, State, and International Convention.

Hello, I am sure everyone is anxiously awaiting Spring, which is not far away! District dues notices were sent out to the clubs on January 01, 2024 and follow-up correspondence continues to be sent out as we speak. This is a gentle reminder, that in order to vote in the Spring Convention, your club must be in good standing. This occurs when all dues have been paid to both the International Association of Lions Clubs and the Lions of Indiana no later than 15 days prior to the close of credential certification. Please take appropriate action to enable you to vote in this important upcoming election!

Reference MD-25 2022 Constitution
Page 10, Section 4.

(a) Each club in good standing shall be entitled to one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate for each ten (10) members or major fraction thereof, who have been enrolled for at least one (1) year and one (1) day in the club, as shown by the records of the International Office on the first day of the month preceding the month during which the convention is held, provided, however, that each such club shall be entitled to at least one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate. Each club shall be considered in good standing when all dues have been paid to the International Association of Lions Clubs and the Lions of Indiana fifteen (15) days prior to the close of credential certification.

LAWRENCE COUNTY LIONS CLUBS REACH NEW MILESTONE RECYCLING OVER 90,000 EYEGLASSES AND 1,700 HEARING AIDS

Across our country eyeglass and hearing aid wearers have millions of old unwanted eyeglasses and hearing aids stashed throughout their homes in drawers. Simply donating these old specs and aids to a local Lions Club can become a very special way of recycling and at the same time greatly change the quality of life for a needy person. These used eyeglasses are repaired and distributed at no cost by the Lions Club Collection Centers(eyeglasses) to help underprivileged people in need in many developing countries and Lions Club Loaner Program(hearing aids) for repair and distribution to needy people living in Indiana.

The Bedford Lions Club started this collection project in 1980 and has collected a total of 69,118 pairs of eyeglasses and 921 hearing aids with all the other Lions Clubs in Lawrence County joining to help in the recycle effort. The Bedford Noon Lions Club has collected a total of 13,389 pairs of eyeglasses and 683 hearing aids since 2002. The Mitchell Lions Club has collected a total of 6,023 pairs of eyeglasses and 75 hearing aids since 2006 and the Fayetteville Community Lions Club has collected a total of 1,950 pairs of eyeglasses and 39 hearing aids since 2010.

The Lions Clubs would like to thank all the businesses, churches, eye doctors, libraries, and organizations for their support of our ongoing collection project. The Lions could not have had such a successful project without their cooperation in placing the collection boxes at their locations for the community to drop off their used eyeglasses and used hearing aids. We would also like to thank all of the people who donated these eyeglasses or hearing aids to support this recycle program and help many people with vision or hearing problems improve the quality of their lives. There are now over 35 locations in the Lawrence County area where used eyeglasses and hearing aids can be dropped off so please find one or just give them to any Lion you know and help the Lions help people in need.

Shown in the photos are collection boxes to look for at these varies locations around our county to drop off your used eyeglasses and used hearing aids. These eyeglasses and hearing aids will be going to the Indiana Lions State Office Building in Indianapolis for recycling distribution to people in need.



This year the Constitution and Bylaws Committee has 5 Amendments to be voted on this year at the Spring Convention in March. Please review before the Convention. If you have any questions, please send them to me at kthomas@threeidesign.com and I will forward them to the committee.

Amendment #1

To amend ARTICLE IV of the 25E Constitution

Reason: At the 2023 Lions Clubs International Convention, an amendment was adopted to the Bylaws. It defines that “discounted members” (those paying less than full international dues) do not count in the delegate formula for clubs at a convention.

NEW- ARTICLE IV, Section 6. Discounted members is a member who does not pay full dues. Lions Clubs International defines a discounted member to be a “member on the family plan paying discounted dues, Leo Lions, student member or young adult member.” Discounted members can be sent as a delegate to a convention to cast a vote at an election.

Amendment #2

To Amend ARTICLE V Section 2 D of the Constitution

ARTICLE V Section 2 D. now reads: All District records shall be turned over to the new District Governor within ten (10) days following the International Convention, except the PU-101 forms which shall be forwarded as received. This shall include an audited report of any LCIF Disaster Relief Fund received by the District during the year of the outgoing Governor.

Amend ARTICLE V Section 2.

D. All District records shall be turned over to the new District Governor within ten (10) days following the International Convention, except the ~~PU-101 forms~~ **Officer Reporting Forms (formerly the PU-101)** which shall be forwarded as received. This shall include an audited report of any LCIF Disaster Relief Fund received by the District during the year of the outgoing Governor.

Reason for change: Lions Club International changed the name of the form to submit new officers of the District.

Amendment #3

Amend ARTICLE VI Section 1 of the Constitution

ARTICLE VI Section 1 now reads: Section 1. Multiple District Projects each having three (3) elected representatives with staggered terms of office are: Cancer Control, Eye Bank, Leader Dog, Speech and Hearing, Indiana Lions Foundation and Indiana School for the Blind and Visually Impaired.

Amend ARTICLE VI District Projects having three (3) elected representatives with staggered terms of office are: Cancer Control, ~~Eye Bank~~ **Vision First (formerly Eye Bank)**, Leader Dog, Speech and Hearing, Indiana Lions Foundation, and Indiana School for the Blind and Visually Impaired.

Reason for the change: The new name for the Eye Bank is VISON FIRST.

Amendment #4

Amend ARTICLE VIII Section 1 of the Constitution

ARTICLE VIII Section 1 now reads:

Section 1. General Administration: The District is subject to the annual Administration Fund per capita “dues” established by the Lions of Indiana Multiple District 25 collected in advance from each club in two (2) semiannual payments to the District Cabinet Secretary. The first payment shall be no later than September 10 of each year, and the second payment shall be no later than March 15 each year. Dues shall be based on the number of members on the roster of each club as indicated on the roster of each club as indicated on the June and December Monthly Membership Report (MMR) of each club.

Newly chartered clubs and reorganized clubs will be exempt from club dues for 6 months.

The distribution of dues assessed shall be in accordance with the Constitution of Multiple District 25. Disbursement in the sub district shall be by check drawn and signed by the Cabinet Secretary, Cabinet Treasurer, or by the District Governor. A minimum of two (2) signatures shall be required on all disbursements.

Amend ARTICLE VIII Section 1.

Section 1. General Administration Dues: The District is subject to the annual Administration Fund per capita dues established by the Lions of Indiana Multiple District 25 collected in advance from each club in two (2) semiannual payments to the District Cabinet Secretary. ~~The first~~ **Both** payments shall be ~~no later than September 10 of each year, and the second payment shall be no later than March 15 each year.~~ **due upon receipt of billing.**

Dues shall be based on the number of members on the roster of each club ~~as indicated on the roster of each club~~ as indicated on the June and December Monthly Membership Report (MMR) of each club.

The Multiple District 25 annual Administration Fund per capita dues shall be \$16.00 collected from each club in advance in two (2) semiannual payments. Each payment to the District Secretary shall be \$8.00 per club member. The District shall keep \$1.00 per member of each semiannual payment and then submit \$7.00 per member to the State Comptroller.

Newly chartered clubs and reorganized clubs will be exempt from club and state dues for ~~6 months~~ **the one half year the club was chartered or reorganized.**

The ~~distribution~~ **amount** of dues assessed shall be in accordance with the Constitution ~~/Bylaws~~ of Multiple District 25. Disbursement in the sub-district shall be by check drawn and signed by the Cabinet Secretary, Cabinet Treasurer, or ~~by the District Governor. A minimum of two (2) signatures shall be required on all~~ disbursements

Reason: Lions Clubs International and MD 25 expects the dues to be paid upon receipt of billing. This also explains the amount of administrative dues paid to Multiple District 25. The Cabinet Treasurer is audited annually to insure dues are spent properly.

Amendment #5

Amend ARTICLE VIII BY Deleting Section 4 of the Constitution

Amend ARTICLE VIII By deleting Section 4 and re-numbering the remaining sections of ARTICLE VIII.

~~Section 4. District Committee Operating Fund: The Cabinet Secretary/Treasurer shall bill each Lions Club of the District, twenty five cents (\$.25) per member on the first billing remitted to the Cabinet Secretary. This fund shall be made to the District Chairpersons for expenses incurred. The District Governor and his Cabinet will authorize any payments. Any balance in excess of three hundred dollars (\$300.00) shall be disbursed at the discretion of the Cabinet.~~

Reason for the amendment: By eliminating the twenty-five cents (\$.25) fee, dues for the clubs of the district shall be the same for each half. The fund isn't necessary since the District has a large carryover balance.
