Grow and Change. If you missed this event, you missed excellent presentations by very qualified presenters. You also missed an opportunity to gain valuable information as well as form new contacts and garner new ideas. One of the topics was retention. To start with, know your community. Everything changes so a community assessment is necessary periodically to keep up with changing needs. Ask all members for their ideas. Everyone is important. Assign someone in the club to be responsible to contact those who do not attend meetings. Make meetings fun. Don't be critical to those missing meetings or make them feel guilty. Make everyone feel they are valuable to the club and part of the community. Publicize what your club does and recognize them for their efforts. These are but a few tidbits that came out of the meeting. Another topic was recruiting. It is good to have a flyer to hand out describing what your club does, what Lions do, who the members are or other pertinent information your club determines is necessary. Also have a packet which includes the flyer, new member application, and letter of introduction to your club. **THEN JUST ASK!** As you interface with community minded persons and have your Lions pin on, you can discuss about your club with them and leave the packet for their consideration or sign them up with the handy application. It isn't difficult to recruit new members if you are prepared and have experienced it. New members want to be part of and do specific events so be specific about your club's projects, explaining the difference between service and fundraising projects. Other topics were discussed and were very useful. When an opportunity presents itself in the future, please don't be left out of taking advantage of this valuable information. You might think this has already been passed around before, but what has not been passed around is how these ideas have been utilized differently by different clubs.

Membership is still our greatest issue. Without members we cannot serve our communities the way they need us to do. We are not unique with this problem. We just are not as successful as we need to be replacing fallen Lions and those too mature to function fully. Every member in our clubs is important for our success serving our communities so be sure to include them all. Also, it is important to grow membership because we cannot predict when or how many of our members might fall. Each community is different, but there is a commonality in how to grow our members to insure we have the hands and feet to serve. Previously some of those methods were mentioned. Here is an opportunity to include members on a membership event.

Report submittals are important too. People in LCI read these reports with the goal of using our activities and membership volume to convince third party entities to partner with us for the purpose of approaching our communities in different ways about issues they have. Also, other clubs may see what your club does and could do the same in their clubs. Cabinet members also read your reports to determine how they might be of help to different clubs. A tool has been added to help those presidents and secretaries overloaded or too busy to submit reports by providing a club administrative assistant. By being placed in this position a person will be allowed by LCI to go to My LCI to establish a username and password and be allowed to submit your reports. Please take advantage of this tool and be consistent submitting your reports.

At this writing our District Convention is history. Hopefully everyone found something you can use as you return to your clubs. Our main goal is to support club needs. I hope you enjoyed being a part of the Convention and sharing in the information International Director Gwen White and Lion Rhett brought. If you sense a need not being met, please bring it up to a cabinet member to address the situation. If you have a question, please ask for an answer from a cabinet member. We will respond as soon as possible. As this year comes into the final months share your thoughts of improvements you think would make a difference at your club level.

Continue in the service to your communities and keep in mind your club organization is critical to your communities so grow your own organization for leadership as well as helping hands. Participate in activities outside of your own club to gain insight on different ways of doing your projects and gain new friends. It is a wonderful organization we are part of so participate and be involved as much as you can!

In some of our classes we were taught how to go about helping clubs with their problems. Listen, ask questions and understanding the problem were the most important elements of helping. I met a lot of new friends in fellow Lions from all over the world.

Bringing younger people in to our clubs was a big topic of the week. The two DGEs from Sweden ask what the USA is doing to bring in younger people? We said, "We need to change the way we have Always done it," shorter meetings, let parents bring their kids, communicate more on social media and listen to their ideas and try them. Most don't want to attend a dinner or lunch meetings. They want to get out and do things for the community. These are some things I think our clubs in District 25-E should also look at. Our clubs are unable to accomplish everything they would like to do for our communities if we don't have the people to help. Everyone talks about growth and our declining numbers in Lions throughout the world. We have created special positions to address the problem and have put many resources on the Lions websites to help the clubs with ideas and ways to help our clubs and subsequently the communities that we support. It really comes down to a few things. We need to build new clubs, like Old Vincennes. We need to rebuild our existing clubs that are having problems staying afloat. And last, but not least, we need to ask the question, "Would you like to join us in Lions?".

We need to think outside the box to form new clubs in underserved communities and in our colleges. Cyber clubs can be a way to entice younger members to serve with us. In larger Amish communities, where they won't join your club, ask them to form their own specialty club. They want to help their community out as much as you want to help yours.

To rebuild our existing clubs that are struggling with low membership, we need to form some mobile teams to get with that club and go to the community and ask others to join. We need to give them a shot in the arm every so often. This is a way for the District to help pump up our clubs. When Ellettsville needed a hand, PDGs Gary Lawson, Vern Tincher, and DG Richard Halladay showed up in my office to help us rebuild.

The last thing is the most critical. We must own our club's membership. Each club needs to develop a list of potential members and have someone armed with the clubs brochure go see those people face to face. Invite them to a meal and meeting, then ask for the order. I think sometimes we are embarrassed to ask because we may feel we are imposing. Get over it or send someone else that doesn't feel that way. We are a great organization that does so much for our communities. Let's do a lot more by asking the question every time you meet someone you think will be a good fit.

Using [MyLCI](#), you will be able to access information about them such as the number of delegates allowed for your club and any outstanding dues or fees that need to be remitted.

The information will be available in MyLCI in the first week of the month in the month preceding the convention, or the day after the convention is reported in MyLCI, whichever is later.

To access this information in MyLCI, select "Convention" from the "My Lions Club" menu, and scroll to the district convention.

Finally, your club's balance must be paid at least 15 days prior to participation in your district and multiple district's convention. Nonpayment may make your club ineligible to vote.

We have just concluded our first Worldwide Report Day of Campaign 100. On 22 January 2019, we had the distinct pleasure to speak with 46 of our 59 LCIF area leaders worldwide. We offer our deepest expression of thanks to these Lion leaders for their careful preparation for our calls and their continued commitment to advancing Campaign 100.

Throughout the day, we were given reports from every constitutional area. Our area leaders shared fundraising progress and Model Club activity. Information on engagement and training of multiple district and district coordinators, and club LCIF coordinators was also included. Each area leader provided important and valuable information that will help to guide campaign activity and strategy.

During Worldwide Report Day, we heard:

- Campaign 100 is gaining momentum. More and more clubs are joining together with Lions Clubs International Foundation to empower Lion service, fight diabetes, and support our expanded global causes.
- Exciting progress is being made towards assertive goals in some areas, while others have not yet clearly defined their fundraising or participation goals.
- Many clubs across the world are leading by example and have committed to become Model Clubs. However, the Foundation office has yet to receive hundreds of these forms. This could represent as much as US\$3,600,000 in additional fundraising potential. All are encouraged to turn in their Model Club forms to campaign100@lionsclubs.org
- Some LCIF multiple district coordinators are clearly in close contact with their districts and some are not. This must be an area of focus moving forward.

Our first Worldwide Report Day clearly identified the following needs:

- Support of district governors is critical. We must increase our efforts to involve these important Lion leaders and ask for their adoption and promotion of Campaign 100. Thorough training of district governors-elect will be extremely important in the coming year.
- Continued training and engagement of Campaign 100 leaders, especially club LCIF coordinators, will help to ensure the campaign's success.

In response to these needs, we will encourage our district governors to promote Campaign 100 as a priority in their districts and share the importance of supporting Campaign 100 with district governors-elect during the upcoming DGE School in February. We will also complete a Lions Clubs International Foundation and Campaign 100 seminar in Milan, and make more club LCIF coordinator training materials, including on-demand webinars, available through the Resource Center at www.lionsclubs.org.

You are among the most critical aspects of success for our campaign. You are an important advocate for our Foundation in your community. We need your leadership more than ever! In turn, we ask you to assist us in advancing Campaign 100 in four important ways:

- First, take action. Learn more about Campaign 100 at www.lcif.org/be100. Include a campaign presentation at your next club meeting and choose to support the campaign through personal contributions, fundraisers, or a donation from the club treasury.
- Second, encourage your club to consider becoming a Model Club. Model Clubs are leading the way for Campaign 100 by committing to raise an average of US\$750 for each club member. Learn more about [Model Clubs](#).
- Third, invite your LCIF district coordinator to speak to your club about LCIF and Campaign 100. Share the good work and Lion service that is empowered through your support of the Foundation.
- Finally, encourage every Lion to consider a gift of US\$100 each year. We understand that in some parts of the world, this is challenging; however, we ask you to encourage it where possible and acceptable. Where it is not, strive to raise the equivalent of this amount through fundraising events and activities.

In closing, we offer our thanks, once again, to our Lion leaders. Your continued support of Lions Clubs International Foundation and Campaign 100 is vital to our efforts and will help us to positively impact the lives of hundreds of millions across the world each year.
