Your District Governor team attended a workshop at our last Council of Governors' meeting. It was good information and gave us that attended reenergized to lead the district in membership and retention. You will be hearing more as my year goes forward and 1st VDG Trea McCandless moves into office. We can't do it without each of you helping carry us forward.

The next big date is the 2016 State Convention in Shipshewana Indiana April 29th-May 1st 2016. There is a flyer in the newsletter. I ask that you plan to attend. International President Dr. Jitsuhiro Yamada will be there. We are one of the few states that get the honor the International President. Please help us keep this honor.

Invite a U.S. Veteran to Join Your Club

Did you know that since the *Involve a U.S. Veteran* pilot program began in 2013, over 90% of veterans who joined a Lions Club are still involved with their club? May is Military Appreciation Month. Show your support by inviting veterans to participate in your club activities, such as your next club meeting or next service project.

The *Involve a U.S. Veteran* program waives the charter or entrance fee for any qualifying veteran who joins a new or existing Lions club. Eligible veterans include retired U.S. military personnel or honorably-discharged members of the Air Force, Army, Coast Guard Services, Marines, National Guard, Navy or Reserves. Those currently serving in the National Guard or Reserves are also eligible. This special pilot program is offered only in the United States.


