Over the last few weeks, the MyLion portal has had issues with access. LCI is working on the issues. But in the meantime, LCI member services recommends the following:

The blank screen can be remedied by clearing the cache in the internet browser that you are using. Instructions are provided here for Google Chrome and Mozilla Firefox. You will need to delete any bookmarks (i.e. saved favorites) that you have for the MyLion page.

SUMMARY OF WHAT YOU ARE GOING TO DO:

- 1. Clear your internet browser cache.
- 2. Close your browser then open it again.
- 3. Navigate to the MyLion web page.
- 4. Try again to sign in.

GOOGLE CHROME - Clearing the cache:

While in the Google Chrome internet browser:

- Press and hold the two keys: [CTRL] + [SHIFT]
- While holding the two keys, tap the [Delete] key
- You should get a window option to clear the cache
- Select "All Time" for the TIME RANGE (click down arrow to make selection)
- Make sure there is a check mark next to the three selections:
 - Browsing History
 - · Cookies and other site data
 - Cached Images and Files
- Click Clear Data

FIREFOX - Clearing the cache:

- While in the Firefox internet browser:
- Select the Menu option (the three parallel lines at top-right corner)
- Select Options (from the drop-down menu)
- Select Privacy and Security
- Select Cookies and Site Data [scroll downward to see]
- Select Clear Data
- Make sure there is a check mark next to the two selections:
 - Cookies and site data (check mark)
 - Cached web content (check mark) [under the Clear Data Button]
- Select Clear

ENVIRONMENTAL EXPRESSIONS...

As one who loves trees and who is trying harder to understand our environmental situation here in the U.S., it breaks my heart as I read about the fires in the western part of our country. Thousands upon thousands of acres of trees have been burned, homes destroyed, lives lost. As Lions here in Indiana and across the U.S. we need to make a gigantic effort to plant more trees to replace those that have been lost. (If we think we have had trouble the past few months finding toilet paper, just think what it will be in the next few years with all the trees lost.) Also, I read the other day that already there is a lumber shortage due to the fact that more people are at home now because of Covid-19, and are remodeling and working on their homes. Let's talk about that. Fall is an excellent time to plant trees. It is always better to plant trees that are native to our area; they adapt to the climate and soil better. Think about oak trees, flowering dogwood, different kinds of maple trees. (Beware of the silver maple; we have one in our side yard and the roots grow up on top of the grass and make it very hard to mow.)

What are some other ways we can help the environment?

SAVE ELECTRICITY

Sharing Events on Social Media

Ready to make your event a success? Facebook is a great tool to utilize before, during and after the event for promotion, networking and recruitment.

BEFORE: Create a Public Event from Your Facebook Page

The Event feature on Facebook allows you to create a promotional space for your event that is connected to your club's page. Your club's page will be listed as the host.

Schedule your event – Include the event date, time, location, ticket info, and schedule.

Invite your friends – The event page has an Invite feature to allow you to invite your page's followers and your Facebook friends. They can mark if they're going, interested, or not going.

Share the event – Share the page link with members and encourage them to invite their Facebook friends. The more shares and invites of your event, the more people it will reach!

Share updates – As the event approaches, post updates to get people excited about the event.

To create an event from your computer, go to your Facebook page to create a post. Click the Event option and fill in the fields.

DURING: Tell Attendees to Follow You on Facebook

While you're at the event, make sure attendees know your club has a Facebook page where they can learn more, stay updated, ask questions, and connect with members.

Get a handle on things – Include your page's URL or handle on all your printed materials, handouts, and signage. For example, include the message "Follow @lionsclubs on Facebook!" or "Visit facebook.com/lionsclubs to learn more!" (Hint: Your Facebook handle starts with @ and is displayed under your Facebook profile picture.)

Use a hashtag – Does your club or event have a hashtag (#ChicagoWindyCityLions or #LClCon2019)? Consider coming up with a hashtag and including it on signage. Encourage attendees to post their photos to their social profiles using the hashtag or by tagging/mentioning your page's handle.

Make friends – As you meet new people, ask if you can connect on Facebook through your personal profiles. Friend them on Facebook as you're talking. Later, you can invite them to like your page through Facebook.

AFTER: Network, network, network!

Facebook is more than just a promotional tool – it's a networking tool that allows you to connect with members of your community!


Share photos on your club page – Post photos of your event on your club's page and your personal profile. Tag or mention any of the new Facebook friends you met during the event to expand your post's reach.

Share photos on member pages – Encourage members to post photos to their personal profiles, and to include your hashtag and page handle. Share their photos on your page.

Stay in touch – Through your personal profile, message the new friends you connected with on Facebook. Follow up about the event, invite them to your next service activity, and share your club's page so they can stay updated.



Lions Club Tax Time is Coming Up!

All Lions clubs, districts and multiple districts that have annual gross receipts of less than US\$50,000 and do not have to file Forms 990 or 990-EZ must file the e-Postcard (also known as 990-N). If your Lions club, district, or multiple district has a foundation, which is a separate legal entity, the appropriate form will need to be filed as well. All filers must register at IRS.gov prior to filing their next Form 990-N. This is a one-time registration if the designated Lion files annually. If the designee changes from a prior year, the new designee must register with the IRS.

The e-Postcard is due by the 15th day of the fifth month after the close of your tax year. Lions clubs operate on a fiscal year, July 1-June 30, so the e-Postcard is due by November 15 each year. Please note that an organization cannot request an extension for filing the Form 990-N. If you do not file, you risk losing your tax-exempt status.
