1st Vice DG Corner

Hello Lions!

A few days ago, the GMT team held their first of hopefully many membership rebuilding meetings. This first meeting was limited to the extended GMT/GLT teams so don't feel left out. This meeting was to help us formulate our plans and develop teams to work with specific clubs.



We have a minimum of nine (9) clubs that have either asked for help or we have identified as needing help rebuilding. I am not going to identify the clubs here, but if you believe your club should be on this list, please email me at kthomas@threeidesign.com and let me know.

We identified a few items that most of the weaker clubs have in common. Most of our weaker clubs do not have a focus or signature project. Developing a focus or signature project is not an easy thing to do and is not something someone outside of the club can develop for you. Without a focus, it is hard to promote your club to new members. The community needs assessment (mk9.pdf) is a useful tool to help your club develop a focus or project.

Another common item for most of our weaker clubs is a lack of involvement in their zone, region, or district functions. We all joined our local Lions club to *serve our community*. But some of our clubs could actually do more in their community by being more active in their zone, region, or district. This sounds counter-productive, but think about this for a second. By not participating outside your club, there are *no* new ideas and *no* new projects and the result is *no* new members. By being more active in your zone, region, or district, the club is exposed to more Lions and their ideas, projects, and fundraisers. You can bring these activities back to your community and try something fresh. Most of the time, members from the club you are borrowing the ideas from will be willing to assist.

Also, by doing interclub visits and attending Zone/Region meetings, you can make contacts in the surrounding clubs and make arrangements to help each other work projects for increased manpower. Both clubs will benefit by the extra workers, and learn new ways to do the projects. The new faces at your projects can help spark interest in your club by your community.

The GMT meeting ran out of time to discuss the district Guiding Lions. A Guiding Lion is a Lion that has been trained to assist a new club in developing a strong club or to help an existing club rebuild. Guiding Lions are trained and certified for three (3) years. The District currently has 52 trained Guiding Lions but only 5 are currently certified. Oh, before you ask, Erica and I are not one of the 52 yet, but we are getting ready to take the training.

This lack of Guiding Lions limits the Governor's options in selecting Guiding Lions for new or rebuilding clubs. I would like to strongly encourage every club in the district to discuss at their September or October meeting about selecting a couple of Lions in their club to become Guiding Lions. These new Guiding Lions would not have to help beyond your own club if they choose not to, although I hope they would be willing. They can help their own club on improving member orientation, office training and help to re-motivate/support new growth in the club.



Dear Lions,

Did you know that since its founding in 1968, our Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) has given out more than US\$950 million in grants? That is an incredible amount of money. What is even more incredible is that we have improved the lives of hundreds of millions of people throughout the world.

We could not have done that without you! Did you also know that LCIF relies entirely upon donations from Lions and friends? Yet, only six percent of Lions make an individual donation to LCIF each year. You read that correctly: only six percent of Lions give an individual gift to LCIF. To those who have already made a donation this year, thank you.

"Secretary's Challenge"

In August we had 75% MMR submitted and a 35% on the Activity Reports. This is a little less than we accomplished in July, so let's try to get the numbers back up in September.

MMR Tip: Go into MyLCI at the beginning of the month and submit your MMR with "no changes for the month." Then if you have changes in membership or contact information you can make the change and it will update your MMR to reflect the change (even though earlier you posted "no changes"). If you have no changes, then nothing is lost and you would have submitted your MMR on time and you don't have to worry about it at the end of the month!

Activity Report Tip: If you have activities that are repeated month after month (or even annually), create a "signature" activity and all you have to do is select that "signature" activity each month and no additional key punching is required. The only way to contribute towards the Centennial Service Challenge is to post your "Activities" using MyLCI! Let's get our clubs earning those Centennial Badges for your Banner!

That is the theme for the 2017 Indiana Lions State Convention in Evansville on April 28—30, 2017.

Make your plans now to join Lions from across the state of Indiana at the 2017 Indiana Lions State Convention to celebrate 100 years of Lionism. More than 130 Lions have already pre-registered for the convention. The convention will be hosted by the Oakland City and Petersburg Lions Clubs, assisted by Lions from throughout District 25-E.

Lions Clubs International President Robert Corlew will be our special guest at the convention. IP Corlew will participate in the presentation of awards at the Awards Luncheon on Saturday, and will be the keynote speaker at the All-State Banquet on Saturday evening. Convention attendees will have an opportunity to meet IP Corlew during a seminar session on Saturday afternoon.

A frequently asked question about the convention is: "What is the dress code for the All-State Banquet on Saturday evening?" The District Governors and other Lions leaders seated at the head table will be wearing formal dinner jackets, but this is a Lions function and Lions apparel is always appropriate at a Lions function. Woods, LCI's first International President, who just happened to be from Evansville. Theme baskets are great items to bring for the Silent Auction. A great way for your club to participate in the convention. There will be many surprises throughout the convention




