James Edward Brown**December 11, 1936 – August 29, 2020**

James Edward Brown, 83, of Atlantic Beach, NC passed away on Saturday August 29, 2020. James was the son of the late James L. and Fannie Bruce (Forrest) Brown. He is survived by his Loving wife, Mollie (McCotter) Brown and a son, Mark Leslie Brown.

James served his Country with Pride for over 20 years, retiring as Chief Petty Officer in the U.S. Navy. During his military career he served two tours in Vietnam in Air Sea Rescue. He also received the Navy Commendation Medal, Navy Achievement Medal, Vietnam Service medal and the National Defense Service Medal. After his retirement from the US Navy, James went on to be an instructor at Nash Community College in Rocky Mount, NC, IVY Technical College in Columbus, IN and Marshall Institute, teaching Industrial Maintenance Management. James was a Master Mason with memberships in Ocean Masonic Lodge No.401 in Morehead City and Jackson Masonic Lodge No. 46 in Seymour, Indiana.

He is a Past District Governor for Lions Clubs International District 25 E1 and was a member of the Seymour Evening Lions Club for 23 years.

In addition to his parents James was preceded in death by a son, Douglas Leslie Brown. A graveside service with full military Honors and Masonic Rites took place on Tuesday, September 8, 2020, 2:00 pm at Cedar Grove Cemetery Extension in New Bern.

Hello Lions,

This article is somewhat related to last month's article. Since part of the discussion was regarding costs of membership and payment of dues, below is from the International Constitution Article XII regarding Fees and Dues.

Section 1. MEMBER REPORTS. In the manner and within the time prescribed by the International Board of Directors each club shall report to the international office of this association, the names of all new members elected, and shall remit there-with such entrance fee for each new member as shall be determined by the International Board of Directors.

Section 2. MEMBERSHIP DUES.

(a) Semi-annual membership dues of twenty-one dollars and fifty cents (US\$21.50) denominated in U.S. dollars shall be levied on each club member based upon the membership of each club as shown by its membership report of June and December and shall be paid by each club to the international office as shall be determined by the International Board of Directors, except as provided in subsections (b) and (c) herein.

(b) For family membership programs as adopted by the International Board of Directors, the following dues shall apply:

(1) The first family member shall pay semi-annual membership dues as provided in sub-section (a) above.

(2) Subsequent qualifying family members, not to exceed four additional qualifying members per household, shall pay semi-annual membership dues equal to one-half (1/2) of the total amount paid by the first family member as described in subsection (b) (1) above.

(c) For student membership programs as adopted by the International Board of Directors, eligible student members shall pay semi-annual membership dues equal to one-half (1/2) of the total amount of dues as provided in sub-section (a) above.

(d) An annual fee shall be paid by each Lions club for each Leo club sponsored by it, in an amount and at such time as shall be determined by the International Board of Directors.

It was discussed that most clubs collect member dues either annually or semi-annually, but it was pointed out that even monthly is an option, although it may be more work on the club's secretary and treasurer.

While on the discussion of dues, since the Singapore Convention was cancelled, the amendment to raise the dues was not voted on. I contacted the International Director Billy Blankenship since we discussed this amendment back in March prior to the pandemic. The board of directors has pulled the original amendment so it will not be voted on at the convention in Montreal Canada. As of the writing of this article, no dues-related amendment is slated to be on the ballot in July. He did not know if one would be proposed between now and the convention.

I have also recently been asked about the International, State and District dues breakdown and what the club should be charging for dues. Here is a breakdown that past Cabinet Treasurer Richard Kaiser prepared:

If your club is not charging at least \$61.75 for the annual dues, the club may want to consider increasing the dues to keep from draining the administration funds.

So at least for now, no dues increase for the 2020-2021 Lions years.

- **MOST IMPORTANT** – all of your communications and meetings should be planned to include **EVERYONE**

Acknowledge the change, don't ignore it

- If you wait until everything is back to normal, you will have waited too long
- If you abandon everything that was a start anew, you will lose too many members
- You aren't redefining your club or your members' commitment to service – you are finding new ways to be who you are in this “brave new world”

Bedford Lions Complete Building of 250th Ramp

Bedford Lions Club members started building wheelchair ramps in 1989 but they didn't realize how successful a project it would become. The ramp building project has not only been one of our most popular projects, it has been one of our most satisfying for members in the long history of the club. They also didn't imagine the number of appreciative individuals they would assist and the impact the project would have on those people's lives. In July of 1989, the Lions heard about a local woman who was confined to a wheelchair and had been able to get out of her home only once in six years. Building her a ramp would be a great World Service Day Project for the Lions to donate time and serve their community. The Lions decided to construct a wooden wheelchair ramp from her porch to the ground in order to improve her quality of life. The first ramp, which was 18 feet long, was made from plywood sheets placed on wooden framing covered with carpeting and this type construction was continued until 2004, when the Lions started using 5/4 deck boards with no carpeting to cover the wooden framing and that construction continues today. There are no professional carpenters among the Lions who work on the ramps, but you couldn't tell that by the great work that is turned out by this caring group. In most cases they are senior citizens taking pride in aiding other senior citizens. Since that first ramp, members have now donated their time and effort in building a total of 250 wheelchair ramps and 40 handrails of various lengths, donating more than 9,600 hours to people in need in the Bedford area. In the last 10 years the Lions ramp builders have averaged building 12 ramps per year. The Lions always donate all the labor in the construction of the ramps and the club will contribute a portion of expenses toward the required building materials from its ramp building fund, if the family is unable to afford them. Over the years the Lions ramp building fund has received assistance from various individuals, many local churches, and other grant sources in the community. Lengths of the ramps have ranged from 8 feet to 86 feet with many platforms, direction changes, and sturdy handrails. Most ramps are finished in a day with an average of 6 to 10 Lions working 4 to 6 hours each to complete a ramp. One 86-foot ramp built in 2015 took two days and 164 man-hours to complete. The Bedford Lions Club was honored in 2000 with a story and photo in an issue of "The Lion" official magazine of Lions Clubs International about their ramp building project. In addition the local club in 2002 received an award from their Lions Club District for the Lions District Most Outstanding Project and later that year were honored at the Indiana Lions Club's State Convention with a Lions Club's State of Indiana Activities Award for the best Lions project in the state. The Bedford Lions Club was also asked to have an informational booth at the 2011 Indiana Lions Club's State Convention to guide other Lions Clubs in the state on how to build wheelchair ramps in their communities. Various dedicated Lions have served as the ramp project chairman over the years and, along with the present chairman Ken Brumbaugh, have all done a fantastic job of living the Lions Motto, "We Serve." Lion Brumbaugh summarized this project very well in saying, "We all really enjoy the camaraderie of working together for someone in need. This is a great way to serve our community through the Lions Club. We all have a warm feeling in our hearts when a ramp is finished and the person we built it for uses it for the first time. That person's smile makes all the hard work worth it and gives us the incentive to help the next person in need by building another ramp."
