This method reduces mailing costs and allows the publication of more information in the electronic issues. A new publisher has been selected that uses full color images. We had a guest speaker, Nancy Gelhausen from the Patoka River National Wildlife Refuge during the cabinet meeting. When your club secretary reports your attendance at the meeting, it can be Environmental in the myLion report.

During the cabinet meeting, PDG Mark Clark presented a report on the Cancer Control Project. In case you don't know, the Cancer Control Project works with IU Health and has recently expanded to partner with Riley Children's Hospital within the IU Health system. The Riley Children's Foundation made an announcement on August 4th about a \$10M matching grant opportunity. The Cancer Control Project is planning to discuss this at their September meeting. Look forward to a future Cancer Control Project article in future newsletters about how you and your club can help with the matching portion.

During the roundtable discuss PDG Mark Clark (GLT) asked DG Glen Georges to remind everyone his goals for the year. Glen's goals are to provide training to 75% of the officers, to charter one new club, and the bring service reporting up to 60%.

Then PDG Mark asked five questions for discussion, and I want to focus on one of them, "What do club officers/members see as the role of the district leaders? Does that view support or not support the club officers? Does that view need to be changed?" I know as a PDG and PCC, that we have tried to make it where the district supported the clubs. But what do you and your club think? Is there something we can do to improve the district/club relationship? Please share your thoughts with District Governor Glen.

We are also planning a zone chair officer training in French Lick on September 16. All lions are invited to attend but we specifically need the zone chairs and anyone interested in becoming a zone chair there. Emergency Preparedness

What is it?? It is a method to protect yourself and family.

In most emergencies or disasters you could need food, water, meds, or clothing. Matches may also be needed to build a fire. Battery radios and lights along with cell phones should be used sparingly.

An emergency can be in many forms: tornadoes, earthquakes, or floods. Travel, water supply, and phones can or will be affected by these disasters. Emergency personal may have a difficult time getting around in damaged areas. In this case you could be alone or cut off for some time. Know how to turn electricity, gas, and water off to your home. Check on neighbors.

An emergency kit needs to be in your auto which includes: blankets, bottles of water, first aid kit, non-perishable food, and sterno cans or candles. Water can quench your thirst and be used to clean hands or wounds and other things.

Have plans set of your own to fulfill your needs.

One thing I would ask everyone to watch out for now days is drug needles. If found, call police, or fire department who are trained to dispose of them.

I have been a firefighter for 50 years and have seen most of these conditions and the mistakes made handling Haz-Mat and poisoning.

When preparing for emergency grants, you will need pictures, number of involved, estimated dollar value, county EMA paperwork.

One of the best defenses is to be prepared!!
