## **High Blood Sugar and Appetite**

A constant appetite is something we all face on occasion, but excessive hunger may be a challenge for someone with consistently high blood sugar. Actually there are two ways diabetes can impact your appetite; low blood sugar and high blood sugar.

Most people with diabetes are aware that when their blood sugar drops, they have a craving for food, but high blood sugars can cause those cravings too.

High blood sugar means inevitably, you don't have sufficient insulin to transport glucose throughout your body, so your body can't actually get the glucose it needs to function. Then your brain sends out hormonal messages encouraging you to eat. A vicious circle begins because the more you satisfy your craving, the higher your blood sugar goes up causing you to crave more food.

You might have an irresistible urge to have that soda or sweet tea or candy every day. That being the case after lunch, or any meal could be an indication you should check your blood sugar to determine if you should adjust your food choices.

Whatever your sweet-food habit may be, it is time to stop and think when you feel those cravings and look at your blood sugar levels at that time of the day.

Is your blood sugar level high every single morning, so you head to McDonald's for your sweet tea or coke?

Is your blood sugar level high after lunch, so you head to the vending machine?

These are signs you need to pay attention to your body. As life changes, so do your habits about eating. You might have a different job, or may have matured since you last noticed a craving, or your stress level might have changed. All these events can directly affect your body metabolism.

Work with your health care team to determine the correct path to take in determining corrective action, but keep in mind high blood sugar affects your appetite and causes cravings which you can do something about by avoiding sweets,
