Indiana Lions Foundation Update

The trustees of the Indiana Lions Foundation and Indiana Lions Holding Corporation met at the state office building in Indianapolis on Saturday, June 8th, 2024. At this meeting the trustees approved six, \$1,000 matching grants for projects of the Auburn, Plainfield, South Haven, Decatur Central, Clermont and Lafayette clubs. This brings the total of matching grants for the current fiscal year to \$17,368. A \$1,000 disaster assistance grant was given to the Union City club to assist with needs caused by the storm damage earlier this spring.

The Foundation annually sponsors the Indiana Distinguished Lion of the Year award. The 2024 recipient is PDG Merle Goldman, a member of the Washington Township club in Indianapolis. Congratulations to PDG Merle and all of the nominees for the award who were recognized with a plaque presentation at the Foundation luncheon at the recent state convention.

This year, only auto parking fees will be charged at the access roads. Four new gates are being created on the infield, and Lions will sell and scan tickets at these new gates. On the website sign-in sheets they are designated as NW, SW, NE and SE gates.
