## Vision Screening Milestone Can Increase Awareness of Lions Service

Indiana Lions Clubs have reached an incredible milestone that shines a bright light on the "We Serve" pledge. And what exactly is this achievement?

We've surpassed the 1 million mark for children's vision screenings. Think about that for a moment.

1 million.

It's this kind of success and dedication that shows what Lions are really about. It is a tangible and measurable result that can help boost the public's awareness of Lions service

projects, and accomplish other important goals as outlined by State Vision Services Chairman, PDG Charlie Short:

- Increase awareness of pediatric vision problems in schools and pre-schools.
- Attract the interest of potential sponsors for visionrelated efforts and raise \$50,000 for vision support by June 30.
- Add 1,000 new members statewide as supporters of vision and service by June 30.

The 1 million milestone provides an excellent foundation for clubs to promote their participation in vision screenings in local media as well as an opportunity to let the public know about other Lions endeavors -- which could help attract new members and broader community support.

## Stepping Out of Our "Comfort Zone"

#### Greetings Fellow Lions of 25F,

Below are a couple of articles I ran across the first part of 2018 and wanted to share them.

Two of our biggest fears are failure and criticism. And they never completely go away. You can overcome them, but they'll show up when you face your next challenge. In accepting fear as part of life's journey instead of running from it, you learn to conquer it. Indeed, as you look back at what you've already overcome, you realize that most times failure doesn't do permanent damage -- you actually grow stronger through it.

An unknown poet wrote: "I used to have a comfort zone where I knew I couldn't fail; the same four walls of busywork were really more like jail. I longed so much to do the things I'd never done before but stayed inside my comfort zone and paced the same old floor. I said it didn't matter that I wasn't doing much; I said I didn't care for things like dreams and goals and such. I claimed to be so busy with the things inside my zone, but deep inside I longed for something special of my own. I couldn't let my life go by just watching others win; I held my breath and stepped outside and let the change begin. I took a step, and with new strength I'd never felt before, I kissed my comfort zone goodbye, then closed and locked the door. If you're in a comfort zone, afraid to venture out, remember that all winners were at one time filled with doubt."

When you challenge your fears, you master them. When you wrestle with your problems, they lose their grip on you. When you dare to confront the things that scare you, you open the door to the future.

A wise man once said, "Take the bull by the horns until you have him screaming for mercy."

Author John Mason writes: "The desire for safety stands against every great and virtuous dream. Security, many times, is the first step toward stagnation. Boldness in vision is the first, second, and third most important thing. If you dare nothing, you should expect nothing." So whatever opportunity or obstacle you're facing today; what you have is always greater than whatever you lack.

I wanted to share these thoughts because our District is always in need for Lions to step out of their "comfort zone." Many Lions have served as trustees or on committees. Many have served for years and would appreciate taking a break and having new Lions step up into leadership roles and help guide our District into the next 100 years. By being involved, you help set the precedents for the future of Lions.

I will tell you that I was stuck in my comfort zone and our minister at that time preached a sermon about "our comfort zone." A dear friend came to me about 12 years ago (about 2 weeks after the sermon) and told me that they were in need of a basketball coach for their Special Olympics Junior team. I had virtually no basketball experience and had been around special needs youth only a very small level. I had a meeting with the parents of these youngsters who agreed to give it a go. So I stepped into the coach's role after reading 3 to 4 books for guidance. As it turned out, I was blessed so much more than I ever dreamed.

Later I had two much younger coaches who continued to grow the program, giving me the opportunity to grow with Lions, but I am still in touch with these families to this day.

It is not something that I had planned, but the rewards from it turned out to be immeasurable. So look at what Lions are doing that interests you and let District leaders know that you would like to serve in that area or if asked to serve please consider the opportunity.

The word for you today is: This year, get out of your comfort zone! Opportunity is knocking!

# Teaming Up

It appears, during visit conversations, the same question is being asked. That question concerns membership growth.

One wonders what we do and don't understand about volunteerism in today's busy environment. We should never stop "just asking" someone to be a member. An old sales axiom states that standing on a busy street corner, asking 100 people to buy insurance, you'll get at least one person to say yes. Whether true or not, it's pretty inefficient. There's more to it than that.

There is more to recruiting new members, particularly young people. While the 45 to 60 age demographic is always good, there is nothing wrong with the 25 to 44 age range. Put time into understanding what young people find attractive and what they don't. While approaches may vary, we should educate ourselves to these facts. We obviously cannot wave a magic wand; it will take effort and commitment. Internally develop separate membership and service teams. They can work together by inviting a prospective member to a service project. Ask them what they feel would be a good service project. Ask them how they see themselves serving the community. Ask them what kind of time they realistically can give. Consequently, let them tell you how to recruit them. Invite them to bring spouse and kids to meetings (that may require a paradigm shift).

Many studies show that people volunteer to service but not meetings. Being flexible in this regard could reward the club. Continuing business as usual only generates the same result.

Moving forward, can this be considered an acceptable result?

# Lions of Indiana MD 25 2018 State Convention Nomination & Elections

Nominations will be open for the positions of State Comptroller and International Convention Committee for the elections to be held at the 2018 Indiana Lions State Convention.

State Comptroller – 2 year term. Anyone interested in the State Comptroller position will need to secure their local club endorsement and the endorsement of their district. The candidate shall furnish a statement in writing showing that such candidate is willing to be nominated, will serve if elected, and set forth the candidate's qualifications for such office. Each such written statement shall be submitted by the District Governor to the State Council Chairperson with a copy to be sent to the State Nominations and Elections Committee Chairperson at least ten (10) days prior to the opening of the State Convention. Please reference Article IV, Section 4 of the MD 25 Constitution.

**International Convention Committee member** – three year term. Past District Governors from Districts A, B, D, E, and G may run for this office. The procedure for nomination of a candidate from a district shall follow the procedure set forth in the By-Laws of each district. Endorsement from the District shall be submitted by the District Governor to the State Council Chairperson with a copy to be sent to the State Nominations and Elections Chairperson. Notification must be sent at least thirty (30) days prior to the opening of the convention. For qualifications, please reference Article VII of the MD 25 Constitution.




