## Purdue University: INTERNATIONAL FRIENDSHIP PROGRAM

(If any Lions Clubs are located by a College or University, you might check to see if they have a program like this, that you could get involved in.)

Lafayette Lions Club has 3 members and 1 non Lion, PDG Pat Short, PDG Charlie Short, Lion Larry Fisher and his wife Esther , busy with Purdue International Friendship Program by being hosts'to foreign students attending Purdue University. Here's what's involved. Purdue University has a program called Intercultural Learning/International Friendship Group. No funds are provided by the Lafayette Lions Club. Students generally have their own funds. The hosts' are not there to support them financially, but are actually non official "parentis in loco" for these students....there to share our culture, and learn about theirs and also be someone they can call for assistance . The hosts' can take them places and pay for admission or meals. PDG Pat & PDG Charlie Short are currently hosting 2 new PhD students, one from India and one who is studying remotely from Moscow. They continue to host a student from Colombia, South America. It's a great program through Purdue...Intercultural Learning-Office of International Students & Scholars. Here is the link to check it out.... https://www.purdue.edu/IPPU/ISS/Student/Programming/IFP/events.html.

The Shorts and Fishers have been doing this for several years. The Shorts have "hosted" at least 10 students ...from India, Iran, Austria, China, Taiwan, Sweden, Colombia SA. In fact their 1st student did his undergraduate degree, masters and PhD here and now is a professor at The University of Kansas, married and they have a son. The student from Colombia SA did her undergraduate and masters here and is now working on her Phd. Another Purdue graduate is working in Dallas.

Hosting students doesn't mean they live with you, but the hosts' are supposed to keep in touch and get together at least once a month (during non-Covid). They generally take them around and show them Lafayette and Indy (maybe Chicago), state parks, events, etc. as well as take them to the mall for shopping, drive to the airport and have them over for meals (not now). Thanksgiving and Christmas are great times with them and the Shorts usually have about 10 guests. Sometimes they drive to Indy for students to take their English, as a 2nd Language, exams so they can continue their studies. Hosts' are also invited to join the students at international events on campus such as Diwali, plus the students usually cook great meals from their country. There is no stipulated agenda for the support and friendship. The Shorts and Fishers have met students' parents and family members when they graduate and formed lifelong friendships.

The International Friendship Program (IFP) publishes a newsletter, Bridging Borders, each semester to highlight stories about community hosts, student guests and IFP events. Check out the Spring 2020 issue.

## **Dear Lion Leader**,

The coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic is continuing to impact the work of Lions around the world. As you know, it has also created financial hardships for our Lions and the people for whom we care.

To support the incredible men and women serving with us, the International Board of Directors unanimously passed another resolution to help our clubs.

# Here is an overview of the new resolution approved by the Board of Directors:

• **Charter and entrance fees waiver** – We have waived all charter and entrance fees from January 1 through June 30, 2021.

• Flexible payments – No clubs in good standing on December 31, 2020 will be suspended or canceled through June 30, 2021 for late payment of dues. Full payment is required to be received before June 30, 2021 to avoid suspension or cancellation.

• **Please note** that clubs placed on financial suspension on December 31, 2020 will remain on suspension until the full balance is paid. Those clubs will still need to address their outstanding dues or make arrangements for repayment with the Accounts Receivable Department at Lions Clubs International to avoid cancellation scheduled for March 1, 2021.

These additional measures will help Lions facing financial hardships and give our clubs the support and encouragement they need during these challenging times. For more than a century, Lions have taken on the greatest challenges facing humanity, and together, we will overcome this.

The world needs Lions now more than ever, so thank you for your outstanding service and commitment to our communities and the world.

Dr. Jung-Yul Choi International President Due to the continuing concerns about the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, the board of directors voted to transition the 2021 Montreal Lions Clubs International Convention to a virtual event that will be delivered totally online. This decision was made with the health and safety of our Lions, staff and vendors in mind as limiting international travel and large gatherings is key to global containment strategies.

Although disappointed that we cannot host the event in person, we're excited about hosting our first virtual international convention that can safely connect Lions from around the world. We're still finalizing details and will share those as soon as they are ready.

Here are some important details about the 2021 virtual convention to share:

•Everyone's invited – Our 2021 convention will be a virtual event that's open to all Lions and Leos around the world.

•**Registration fees** – The registration fee will be US\$50 until March 31, then \$75 beginning April 1. The registration fee for Leos will be \$30 regardless of date. Convention is currently scheduled for June 25-29. Additional event and registration details will be provided soon.

•Current registrants – Lions who are registered for convention will receive an email with more information about registration options.

•Elections – Executive officer and international director elections will be conducted electronically and voting procedures will be forthcoming.

•Convention updates – Check our convention website <u>LCICon</u> for convention updates and details as they become available.

This global health pandemic has forced us all to make decisions and changes that place health and safety first. However, we are optimistic that there is hope, and as Lions, we continue to find new ways to stay connected, safely serve our communities and continue our global mission of service.

We appreciate your understanding during this challenging time and thank you for your incredible service as a Lion.

This year's Mid-Winter Conference will be a trailblazer on many fronts in Indiana Lions leadership history. Most significant will be the online format, being the first such leadership opportunity offered to Lions throughout the state.

Of course, there will be several items missing from the conference due the uncertainties of what restrictions the coronavirus might have by the January 23, 2021 date. Gone are the numerous displays by state projects, the silent auction, other Lion-sponsored programs, and projects, as well as the opportunities for personal, one-on-one interactions among Lions and visitors to the MWC.

This year the conference will have four seminars, allowing all attendees to attend. Earlier this year, past MWC attendees were surveyed to help the organizing committee plan and schedule seminar topics that were identified as the most interesting and useful. The list was narrowed to four in attempt to respond to the requests of over 100 previous MWC attendees.

The 2021 MWC will begin at 9:30 a.m. with an introduction by a special LCI guest. Seminars will be at 10 a.m., 11 a.m., 1 p.m. and 2 p.m., with a one-hour break for lunch. The conference will conclude at 3:15 p.m., allowing all attendees to return home by, well of course, 3:15 p.m. There will be NO SNOW cancellations.

The four topics follow.

- **Conducting online meetings and seminars-** Lion Jennifer Drapalik, a seasoned organizer and moderator of several online meetings, including Zoom, the one that will be used to host this year's MWC, will de-myth the mysteries of setting up, host-ing and handling other details in holding a successful online meeting.
- **Everything you want to know about recruiting new Lions-** PDG Charles Short will moderate this panel discussion, featuring winning programs and tactics from successful club marketers, area specialists, and recruiters from around Indiana and the Great Lakes Region. Special guest Dave Wineman, LCI's North American Membership Initiative Regional Chair will be on the panel.
- The 'magic' of membership retention- PCC Ross Drapalik will talk about the two most significant reasons Lions leave our organization: They are either 'pulled' away or we 'push' them away from our organization. His powerful presentation has received recognition from those groups where his seminar was given.
- Putting 'FUN' in FUNdraising- Even with restrictions imposed on clubs by the Covid-19 pandemic, PDG Mary Jane Bodnar will moderate this discussion that will feature several innovative fundraising projects that have proven to be profitable as well as FUN. MWC participants are encouraged to share their experiences.

Mentioned earlier was the 'no registration fee' feature of this year's MWC. Holding our conferences previously was extremely costly. Several years ago, we were forced to move our conferences from the school buildings in Plainfield, which severely restricted our ability to expand the conference and required travel from hotel facilities to the conference location. Few hotels matched our needs in terms of meeting rooms, banquet areas and affordable overnight accommodations. In addition, hotels required our use of their food service. The MWC had to highly subsidize previous conferences to bring the cost to their previous registration fees. This year's MWC virtual conference eliminates all these associated costs and will allow the first NO FEE conference of its type in Indiana Lions history.

Even with no fees required, ALL MWC ATTENDEES <u>must pre-register for the conference</u>. Details to host the online conference requires the committee to have enough capacity in the Zoom meeting that will accommodate those who want to attend. 
