Disaster response here is under way with an LCIF Emergency grant application filed by the District Governor (me). Supply needs have not yet been asked for but will be as the water starts to recede.

If your club wishes to help now, please consider donating to LCIF – marking it specifically for disaster response. We would also be glad to accept donations directly to the District Disaster fund. You are welcome to send donations to the District Treasurer clearly marked for flooding assistance. Funds from these accounts go specifically to the Lions Clubs in areas affected, we do not send to other relief organizations.

Emergency Grants provide up to US\$10,000 for districts impacted by a natural disaster. Lions' district governors may apply for Emergency Grants to help meet immediate needs such as food, water, clothing, and medical supplies. LCIF typically awards nearly US\$2 million in emergency grant funding each year. I have attached general information LCIF disaster grants, please be aware that these may only be applied for through the District, not clubs or individuals.

This LCIF grant for our area is only made possible by the generosity of Lions like you worldwide. Some Lions have wondered where the funding goes, especially if it appears there are more disasters overseas than here in Constitutional area 1. CA-1 includes North America, the Bahamas, even as far as Trinidad and Tobago! While this may sound like a commercial, it is the shortened version of the impact globally that we support locally.

The Lions year of 2017-18 will go down as a time of great need, specifically in North America because of the hurricanes, wildfires, and now flooding. This year we will have received much

Lions of Indiana MD 25 2018 State Convention Nomination & Elections

Nominations will be open for the positions of State Comptroller and International Convention Committee for the elections to be held at the 2018 Indiana Lions State Convention.

State Comptroller – 2 year term. Anyone interested in the State Comptroller position will need to secure their local club endorsement and the endorsement of their district. The candidate shall furnish a statement in writing showing that such candidate is willing to be nominated, will serve if elected, and set forth the candidate's qualifications for such office. Each such written statement shall be submitted by the District Governor to the State Council Chairperson with a copy to be sent to the State Nominations and Elections Committee Chairperson at least ten (10) days prior to the opening of the State Convention. Please reference Article IV, Section 4 of the MD 25 Constitution.

International Convention Committee member – three year term. Past District Governors from Districts A, B, D, E, and G may run for this office. The procedure for nomination of a candidate from a district shall follow the procedure set forth in the By-Laws of each district. Endorsement from the District shall be submitted by the District Governor to the State Council Chairperson with a copy to be sent to the State Nominations and Elections Chairperson. Notification must be sent at least thirty (30) days prior to the opening of the convention. For qualifications, please reference Article VII of the MD 25 Constitution.

LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION EMERGENCY GRANT GUIDELINES FOR APPLICANTS

Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) Emergency grants provide immediate emergency relief assistance to victims of natural disasters through the service work programs of Lions clubs worldwide. Emergency grants in the amount of up to US\$10,000 are available to Lions districts for relief aid in the wake of tornadoes, hurricanes, earthquakes, typhoons, monsoons, ice storms, wildfires, flooding caused by excessive rains and similar natural disasters.

In addition to following the criteria listed in the Emergency grant application, applicants must follow these guidelines to ensure timely and efficient receipt of funds.

WHAT ARE IMMEDIATE NEEDS?

Emergency grant funds are limited to meeting disaster victims' most urgent and vital needs immediately following a disaster. Emergency grants are not intended for more long-term needs such as rebuilding homes and buildings or replacing household and personal belongings. (LCIF Standard grants may be available for long-term projects that address the need for vital community facilities.) Emergency grants address these immediate needs:

- food
- bottled water
- clothing
- blankets
- medicine and medical supplies
- cleaning supplies
- toiletries

DETERMINING NEEDS Lions are encouraged to actively seek out and address the most pressing needs to maximize the use of funds. Lions are most appreciated when they make purchases and deliver supplies directly to victims. For instance, after the tornado in Joplin, Missouri, USA, Lions found out that a shelter had opened its doors to families left homeless from the tornado and was struggling to provide 120 additional meals each day. Lions used Emergency grant funds to take a staff member grocery shopping to ensure they purchased sufficient and correct supplies to meet their overwhelming needs. In Japan, Lions cooked hot meals and served to those left homeless as well as volunteer relief workers. After many days of eating canned foods, community members were appreciative of the hot meal. This is an opportunity for Lions to deliver a heands-on relief activity within their community. Be creative!

WORKING WITH PARTNERS

Lions are encouraged to work with partner organizations, such as the Red Cross, to combine efforts and have greater impact on devastated communities. However, Emergency grant funds are not available to present to another party; Lions must utilize the funds directly.

Disaster Grant Programs





Lions worldwide continue to prioritize disaster relief as one of their most important local service activities. Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) now offers a wide variety of funding options designed to support Lions-led relief efforts during the various stages of disaster relief operations. Lions are key figures in their communities and play a vital role in this process. Lions are responsible for assessing the needs in their district to maximize their relief efforts. Depending on the needs within the community and the Lions' plan of action, expanded funding options from LCIF enable the Lions to have a greater impact in the communities where they live and serve.



A grant for every phase of disaster



Disaster & Emergency Preparedness

The Disaster Preparedness Grant is for Lions districts interested in partnering with local authorities and other community organizations to plan and prepare for *future* relief efforts. The goal is to determine the Lions' role in the community before the disaster strikes.

- Grants available in amounts of US\$5,000 US\$10,000
- Districts may apply once in a three year period; clubs may not apply
- Local funds must account for 10% of the grant request
- Must be applied for in <u>advance</u> of a disaster
- Priority will be given to districts susceptible to regular and repeated natural disasters and those that appoint ALERT Chairpersons (or equivalent position).
- · Funds must be spent within 6 months of receipt
- The request must detail how the Lions' project supports the community's overall local emergency and disaster preparedness plan

What types of activities are eligible? Lions participation in local emergency response and ALERT training programs; stockpiling of key materials and supplies for future response including assembly of ALERT kits; advance support for first responders, food banks, medical facilities and shelters; outreach activities to community preparedness, education and awareness


