LCIF REPORT FOR DISTRICT F

WOW, what a year we had to raise funds for LCIF this past Lions Year.

District F had a goal of \$38,460 with a Chairperson's Stretch goal of \$61,938. Thanks to a generous donation by our Eyeglass recycling, District F blew both goals out of the water, as our total donation for the year was \$82,352.49. PCC Sue Topf & PDG Ed Harper arranged to donate \$1,000 for every club in the district, THANK YOU!!

It was announced at the International Convention that Lions raised \$81,579,545 worldwide for LCIF. Donations at the ICC poured in and I am positive that an adjusted amount will be announced soon. LCIF has closed the books for June 2025 and the year 2024-2025. Reports are being compiled and sent out, but I don't have specifics yet.

PCC Sue & Me were approved for another 3-year term as LCIF coordinators as well as me being chair. I'd Like to thank DG Angela for endorsing us.

Did you know that if your club didn't name a LCIF club coordinator that the Immediate Past President assumes the role? If your IPP doesn't want the job, Club Presidents please appoint a Lion. Doesn't have to be a PDG. PCC Sue and me will be having LCIF Club coordinator training after our training in September. Be on the lookout for zoom meeting invites. Please continue to support our foundation.



WORKING THE INDIANA STATE FAIR!!

Opening Day for the 2025 edition of the great Indiana State Fair is Today, Friday, August 1st, and we still have many open positions on the first weekend and throughout the Fair.

What to Expect

If you've worked at the State Fair in the past few years, you know that Indiana Lions share fun and fellowship at the Indiana State Fair. If you've never worked at the State Fair, or you haven't worked there for several years, you've been missing out on that particular brand of Lions fun and fellowship. In any case, I encourage you to sign up to work for the Indiana Lions Foundation at the 2025 Indiana State Fair. Most positions are seated, most are in the shade, a few are in air-conditioned ticket booths, most do not require you to handle money. You will meet some great Indiana Lions working for the Foundation at the State Fair - everyone from brand new Lions to multi-decade members, from ordinary everyday Lions to Past International Directors and everything in between. But, at the State Fair, we're all just Lions, having a great time and working to raise funds for our Indiana Lions Foundation.

We have a short shift very early in the morning, then a morning shift and an afternoon shift. Sign up for a morning shift, then stay to enjoy the fair in the afternoon and evening, or sign up for an afternoon shift, then come early and enjoy the fair before you work. All Indiana Lions Foundation volunteers get *FREE* parking and *FREE* admission.

Foundation Incentives for Group Participation

If you can recruit at least 5 (including you) of your club members, family members, friends, neighbors, or strangers on the street to come with you and work at least one shift at the State Fair, the Indiana Lions Foundation will help pay for your gas. If you can organize a group of 10 or more (including you), the Foundation will help pay for your van rental. Save your receipts and turn them in to Lion Rose.

How to Get from Point A to Point B

Ah, you say, but I've never been to the Indiana State Fair and I don't know how to get there. No problem! Here are directions from any point in District 25-G to the Indiana State Fair. Note: If you use a maps app on a smartphone and specify "Indiana State Fair" as your destination, it will take you to the wrong gate, so be sure to use these directions.

- 1. From any starting point in District 25-G, go to US 31.
- **2**. Take US 31 South to Westfield, Indiana.
- 3. At Westfield, take the Keystone Avenue exit.
- **4**. Take Keystone Avenue south to 46th Street. (It's a stoplight with a CVS on the NW corner of the intersection.)
- **5**. Turn right and go west on 46th Street to Evanston Avenue, approximately 1/4 mile. (Note: Use "46th Street and Evanston Avenue, Indianapolis" as the destination in your maps app and it will get you to this point.)
- **6.** Turn left and go south on Evanston Avenue to 42nd Street.

Note: In the past, I would have instructed you to take Keystone to Fall Creek Parkway, then Fall Creek Parkway to Evanston, then Evanston 1/2 block to 42nd Street, but you may encounter delays in traffic going this way due to the opening of a new Gate 5 on Fall Creek Parkway near Evanston.

- 7. Turn right and go west on 42nd Street, 1 block to Indiana State Fair Gate 4 (the gate formerly known as 10). Note: In the past, I would have instructed you to take Keystone to Fall Creek Parkway, then Fall Creek Parkway to Evanston, then Evanston 1/2 block to 42nd Street, but you may encounter delays in traffic going this way due to the opening of a new Gate 5 on Fall Creek Parkway near Evanston.
- 8. Turn left into Gate 4.
- **9**. The parking lot is on the right side of the drive after you come through the gate, adjacent to a large white utility building.
- 10. Park as close to the large white utility building as you can and come around the south end of the building. Our check-in booth is on the west side of the utility building. It is the first of several small sheds and it will have an Indiana Lions Foundation sign on it.
- 11. Check in with Lion Rose or another Foundation volunteer at the booth. A Lions volunteer will take you to your gate on a golf cart.

The top map shows the layout of the Indiana State Fair. Our gates are highlighted in yellow, as are Gate 4, the parking area, and our check-in booth.

The bottom map shows how to get into the fairgrounds via the route described above, starting at step 6.

- * Lions shirt, State Fair shirt, or plain shirt
- * No open-toed shoes




Several gates at the Indiana State Fair have been renumbered and a gate has been added.

Those which affect us are: Former Gate 10 is now Gate 4. Former Gate 12 is now Gate 3. Gate L/1W has not changed.

The best way to reach Gate 4 (formerly Gate 10) may be to go to 46th Street, come south on Evanston Avenue to 42nd Street, then west on 42nd Street to Gate 4, as shown below.
