

Upcoming Lions events being held at Camp Woodsmoke:

Saturday, October 29, 2022, will be our Fall Cleanup Day. We need all the help we can get to prepare for our plans to set up for Christmas at Camp Woodsmoke and prepare the Camp for winter season.

Saturday, November 12 and Saturday, November 19 are scheduled for Lions to come to help set up the Camp with lights and decorations for Christmas at Camp Woodsmoke. This is a project that the Lions need to step up and help to make this happen! "Friends of Camp Woodsmoke" are not able to be involved this year. This is a great outreach for Lions into the community. Visitors each year have enjoyed the light show. We only ask for donations from those attending the light show and this helps to offset our costs. Donuts and coffee will be provided each workday for breakfast and will furnish Harvest Market chicken for each one of the workdays along with coffee and water and we just ask for those who volunteer to bring a covered dish to share for lunch. 
As always, many thanks to the Clubs and individual Lions who continue to support Camp Woodsmoke "The Best" both financially as well as participation in the Camp events. Without you, we could not do all that we do at the Camp. For those who have had problems locating Camp Woodsmoke, here are two routes that I use regularly.

First route: Follow I-74 out of Indy to State Route 244 which is the first exit past Shelbyville. Get off at that exit and turn left. Follow 244 through Milroy and Richland to County Road 450E. Turn right and follow to T at County Road 1000S. Turn left onto 1000S and travel to 500 E. Turn right and follow to stop sign in downtown Clarksburg. There is a Camp Woodsmoke sign at that intersection. Turn left onto 640N and follow to the Camp Woodsmoke entrance where there is a sign indicating right turn at Camp entrance. FOR THE SAFETY OF OUR VISITORS, SPEED LIMIT IS 10MPH!!!

Second route: Follow I-74 out of Indy to Greensburg and take the exit that goes north onto State Route 3. Follow State Route 3 north to 300N. Turn Right on to 300N. (There is a school on the northeast corner of that intersection.) Follow to 400E. Turn left and follow to T at 640N. (There is a church at the top of the T.) Turn right onto 640N and follow to Camp Woodsmoke. You will travel through downtown Clarksburg before getting to Camp Woodsmoke. FOR THE SAFETY OF OUR VISITORS, SPEED LIMIT IS 10 MPH!!!

LCIF Response to Hurricane Ian

I've had a couple of LCIF Coordinators and Lions ask about LCIF's Response to Hurricane Ian. I am sure many if not all of you have seen the news about the heart-breaking devastation in Florida. In my daytime job we have a supplier in Puerto Rico, and they are still with out power. My contact in PR is sleeping in his car as well using his battery to power his cell phone. He has told us that his computer was under water the last time he checked.

I asked our Vice Area Leader, PID Linda Tincher, what is LCIF's response to the devastation in Florida and in a little over two hours here is what she has said.

"I called LCIF and verified the following information.

First: LCIF Grant Staff has a meeting with Area E (which includes Florida and Puerto Rico) LCIF Coordinators FL Lions and other state officials next Monday 10/10/2022 to assess the situation at that time. This answer may include FEMA or other relief agency that has went in before Lions. In Florida's case, we know FEMA is responding.

Second: Assessments are a requirement before any type of funding can be sent.

Right now, many roads are still not accessible, and boats are being used for Search & Recovery, which has precedence now.

FEMA MUST go in next. The meeting scheduled for next week is where all involved will make the necessary assessments.

LCIF advises they ARE in constant communications with LCIF Area Leaders in FL, the Carolinas, & Puerto Rico.

The area leaders over FL also have all the islands south of there. Which all had major destruction.

When a Major grant of \$100,000 is granted that usually goes to the MD for distribution as needed. Everything else comes from smaller grants, usually requested by the governors, after a plan is put into place. Please go online and look at the LCIF Grant Toolbox which explains the steps required by a district or club BEFORE grants are distributed. If there are questions, Grant specialists at LCIF will be happy to work with you. While Indiana may not have hurricanes, we have tornados and floods, even fires as dry as it has been. Be a scout and be prepared.

One question on an Emergency Grant Application is the following:

Explain the current relief efforts being implemented by the community, the government, relief agencies and local Lions?

This answer may include FEMA or other relief agency that has went in before Lions. In Florida's case, we know FEMA is responding.

LCIF is not trying to stall, or NOT provide monetary assistance, they just have to follow the protocol and allow the process to take place.

For now, please feel assured that LCIF WILL BE PROVIDING MONEY AND ASSISTANCE AS SOON AS POSSIBLE to ALL those in need – and there are many."
