How Well Do You Know LCIF?

Did you know it takes a \$1000 to honor a well deserving Lion or non -Lion with a Melvin Jones Fellowship? Did you know that you may already have money in your account? Many times, throughout the year, I will get asked, "How much money do I have in my account for a Melvin Jones Fellowship? I or any of your District Coordinators can run that report for you.

Did you know that you can honor non -Lions with an MJF? Yes, you can! There may be many times we would want to honor someone in our communities. For example, if there was a first responder that did a heroic deed or someone who responded to a need in the community without being asked to do so. Presidents and Secretaries, do you know how much is in your Club's account? Did you even know that you had an account with LCIF? Again, any District Coordinator can run that report for you, too.

Did you know that there is an online link to "apply" for a Melvin Jones Fellowship? If there is money in your account, it's easy to fill out and send it in. Need help? Contact your District Coordinator and they can help you fill it out. But what happens if you or your club wants to make the donation and apply for a Melvin Jones Fellowship at the same time? You can print the application, fill it out, and send it in with your check. Please make the check payable to LCIF and put MJF in comment section of the check. One word of advice, take a picture so you have photographic evidence of what you sent in. It may help, in case LCIF misplaces the application, as it has happened. Remember, LCIF is staffed and managed by people just like you and me. We all make mistakes. Once your check is cashed, it will take about 8 weeks for you to receive the plaque. When it arrives via UPS, please open it up and inspect it for damage, spelling of the recipient, and that the pin is enclosed. If anything is wrong, contact your District Coordinator or your Multiple District Coordinator. We can assist with missing or damaged items.

If there are any questions, contact your District LCIF Coordinator and we can assist.

This is your Foundation, so let's make it work for you. More to come next month.

ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM INDIANA LIONS SPEECH AND HEARING, INC.



The disciplines of Audiology, Speech-Language Pathology, and American Sign Language/English Interpreting include trained specialists providing services in a variety of educational and healthcare settings. Each year brings new knowledge and advancements that will help individuals overcome difficulties associated with speech, hearing, and language deficits. Advances in medicine and an increasingly aging population necessitate numerous additional professionals in these fields.

Colleges and universities throughout the United States offer degrees in these fields. A degree in one of these areas requires a minimum of a Bachelor's Degree. Encouragement by Lions throughout Indiana may be a decisive factor in a career choice for an Indiana youth to select one of these professions. Indiana Lions Speech and Hearing, Inc. (ILSH) may provide scholarships of \$750.00 per student for up to four students per academic year. Students who are entering their junior year or above are eligible to apply for this scholarship. If more than four applicants per year, the scholarships will be awarded based on academic achievement. Please refer to the eligibility requirements listed on the application for further information.

Students are eligible to receive the scholarship for a maximum of two years. Renewals are not to be considered automatic. The student must repeat the application process to be considered for a scholarship for the second year.

Once approved for the scholarship, the student will be notified by one of the Trustees of Indiana Lions Speech & Hearing, Inc. A check will be issued and sent to the appropriate department at the university in which the student is enrolled.

FOR A STUDENT TO BE ELIGIBLE, S/HE MUST:

- Be majoring in a program in the field of Audiology, Speech-Language Pathology, or American Sign Language/English Interpreting;
- Be entering their 3rd or 4th year in said program, or into graduate school at an accredited college or university offering a minimum four year degree in one of the above mention fields;
- Make application to a ILS&H Trustee or Indiana Lions Club and be sponsored by a Lions Club in Indiana:
- Demonstrate an accumulative GPA of a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale or higher;
- Verification of meeting eligibility requirements by University advisor or department faculty member;
- Submit an essay of at least 200 words explaining how the scholarship will be used.

FOR A LIONS CLUB TO PARTICIPATE, THEY MUST:

- Promote career paths consistent with ILSH scholarship program and seek out deserving students who may require financial support;
- Consider providing financial support in addition to the \$750 from Indiana Speech & Hearing, Inc.;
- Furnish eligibility date and the recommended support to a District Trustee of Indiana Lions Speech & Hearing, Inc. 120 days prior to the enrollment date;
- Recommend the student for scholarship renewal for the second year with satisfactory progress and the club's continued support; and
- Complete the application form.




