### From the Desk of DG Lion Tom Polk

### **Mentone Lions Club**


### Chartered 3/31/1933


Although the club is small in numbers, it continues to meet the Mentone Community needs. They continue to serve with a purpose.

No nominations will be allowed from the floor at the convention for the above positions unless a current candidate withdraws his/her name.

No candidacy was filed for the 3 year term as Trustee for Vision First, Indiana Lions Eye Bank, Inc. beginning July 1, 2018. Any Lion in good standing in a club in good standing in the district wishing to run for this position should come to the District Convention with his/her letter of intent and club's letter of endorsement and a Lion who will place his/her name in nomination at the convention in Wabash March 10.

No amendments to our District 25-G Constitution and By-Laws will be voted on at this convention.

In order to be certified as a delegate or alternate <u>your club's dues must be received in their entirety by Lions Clubs International and me or CT Ron Guth by February 23, 2018, 15 days prior to the convention. This rule went into effect July 1, 2016.</u>

Each chartered club in good standing with Lions Clubs International and the District and State shall be entitled to one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate for each ten (10) members, or major fraction thereof, who have been enrolled for at least one year and a day in the club as shown by the records of the international office on the first day of the month last preceding that month during which the convention is held. The major fraction shall be five (5) or more members. This does not mean that a brand new member in good standing cannot vote. Bring that new member with you and have him/her register as a delegate or alternate and have a voice in the future of our district. In addition, the District Governor and each Past District Governor who is a member in good standing of a club in good standing in District 25-G has one vote independent of his/her club's delegate quota. A list will be sent from LCI to DG Tom early in February with the number of delegates eligible for each club. If your club will have more than the number of delegates you are entitled to in attendance at the convention, please call or e-mail me the names of members who will serve as your delegates and alternates. If I don't have that list I will certify the first ones to arrive.

On Dec. 20, 2017 the Richvalley Lions Club held their 6<sup>th</sup> blood drive for the American Red Cross. What started out as potentially a one-time blood drive has turned into an ongoing event that is held every other month in the Richvalley Community Building. Our original goal was to collect 40 units and we fell a little short, only collecting 38. However, with the subsequent collection events that were held, we have driven the total units collected for the year up to 259. With that many units, the Red Cross would have been able to help 777 people that were otherwise having a very bad day and many of those units could have been a contributing factor in saving several lives.

We want to thank all the donors who take the time to come to Richvalley to make their life saving donations. A special thank you goes out to the congregation of the Richvalley United Methodist Church who are always a tremendous support at our blood drives by giving of their time, baked goods and blood donations.
