"Our Pride is Lions"

Hello Lions,

Now that we have made it through the holidays, have almost remembered to write 2020 on the checks and looking forward to the bone chilling winds of February it's time for me to pass on a few things from the district treasurer's perspective.

Semi-annual Dues: Dues invoices were sent out via email for 41 clubs and postal for 9 clubs on 1/11/2020. The breakdown of dues amounts is listed on the invoice sent to your club treasurer with a CC: to the club secretary or president if email is listed on the LCI website.

In the first two weeks over 30 clubs have sent in payments and a big thank you to all for the speedy payments. As noted on the invoice dues payments must be received by 2/21/2020 so that the club may vote during the District Convention in March.

To clarify on how the member count is billed, we use the club member count as reported to LCI with your last MMR as of 12/31 or 6/30. As with your LCI dues there are no adjustments for dropped, transferred or deceased members during the following six months, but unlike LCI you are not charged state/district dues for any new members during the same six months

Project Donations: When your club sends in donations for projects, I send a receipt (if your treasurer/secretary has an email address) and write one large check to each project about once a month from the combined donations. We currently have five state projects for Indiana MD-25 and several district-level projects for 25-G.

State Projects: Cancer Control, Speech & Hearing, ISBVI *(Indiana School for the Blind and Hearing Impaired),* Leader Dog and the Eye & Tissue Bank (Vision First). District 25-G Projects: Diabetes, Law Camp and Sight Conservation *(Kid Sight & School Sight).*

There are also many committees at the state level that accept donations with the most common being the state Diabetes committee. If your club wishes to donate to "**Diabetes**" please let me know if at the state or district level when you determine the amounts.

Lions Foundations: This one causes some confusion, if you wish to donate to the "Indiana Lions Foundation" please include the amount with the other projects in one check made out to District 25-G and I will forward the amount to the state comptroller along any state committee amounts.

Do not send donations for "Lions Clubs International Foundation" (LCIF) to the district. Your check should be sent directly to LCIF from your club along with the form (on LCI website), especially if being used towards a Melvin Jones Fellowship (MJF), or as a general donation to Campaign 100 or others.

Any Lion in good standing in a club in good standing in the district can still file for one of the above positions EXCEPT FOR DISTRICT GOVERNOR. He/she should come to the February 15 District Meeting in Milford with his/her letter of intent and club's letter of endorsement or e-mail them to me by that date.

No candidates have filed for 1st or 2nd Vice District Governor positions. A Lion in good standing in a club in good standing in the district wishing to run for one of these positions should come to the February 15 District

Meeting in Milford with his/her letter of intent and club's letter of endorsement or e-mail them to me by that date.

Candidates for these 2 positions must have served as club president and either zone chairperson, cabinet secretary or cabinet treasurer (and not concurrently.)

No amendments to our District 25-G Constitution and By-Laws have been proposed to be voted on at the March 14 District Convention in Argos.

In order to be certified as a delegate or alternate at the convention your club's dues must be received in entirety by Lions Clubs International and CT Ron Guth by February 28, 2020, **15** days prior to the convention. This rule has been in effect since July 1, 2016.

Each chartered club in good standing with Lions Clubs International and the District and State shall be entitled to one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate for each ten (10) members, or major fraction thereof, who have been enrolled for at least one year and a day in the club as shown by the records of the international office on the first day of the month last preceding that month during which the convention is held. The major fraction shall be five (5) or more members.

This does not mean that a brand, new member in good standing cannot vote. Bring that new member with you and have him/her register as a delegate or alternate and have a voice in the future of our district.

In addition, the District Governor and each Past District Governor who is a member in good standing of a club in good standing in District 25-G has one vote independent of his/her club's delegate quota.

A list will be sent from LCI to DG Mary early in February with the number of delegates eligible for each club.

If you wish to know that number, please call or e-mail me at 574-457-3054 or ann_haffner@yahoo.com. If your club will have more than the number of delegates you are entitled to in attendance at the convention, please call or email me the names of members who will serve as your delegates and alternates. If I don't have that list, I will certify the first ones to arrive.

If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to contact me. I hope to see you in Milford on February 15 and in Argos on March 14.

Send in YOUR brainstorm ideas for community service projects!

When you organize a Lions club service activity that is meaningful to your community, you can make a more significant impact on the people you serve. Whether you're just getting started or your club is in need of a fresh plan of action, here are some steps to help guide you through the process of organizing a meaningful, effective service project.

Make a list of possible programs.

Ask your club members the following questions:

- What do you like about your community?
- What do you want to improve in the community?
- What kinds of skills, resources, people and funding is required for the improvements you want to make?

Following the discussion, identify and rank the top five features and top five improvements to consider.

Appoint tasks.

Further discuss possible projects and identify three to five club opportunities. Set up task forces, or committees, to research each project further. Task force members should collect ideas for implementation, discuss possible action steps and recruit interested Lions.

Conduct research.

Make the necessary contacts in the community to find out more about your opportunity, and consider asking the following questions:

- Do you think this project will help the community?
- How do you think the improvement could be made?
- What resources do you have to help make the improvement?
- Are there other needs you think the club should consider?

Communicate with your contacts closely and remember to keep an open mind!

Write a plan.

Develop a written plan that includes goals and objectives, time frame, and people and resources needed.

Implement the plan!

Involve your members and reward their successes along the way. Include progress reports in club newsletters and meetings. When the project is complete, take a moment to review the actions, including what worked and what didn't work, and identify ways to improve for the next project.

If you are a supporter of someone else's LCIF Facebook fundraiser and would like your donation to be applied towards your MJF/PMJF or applied to the organizer's as credit, you will need to share with LCIF Donor Services at <u>donorassistance@lionsclubs.org</u> a copy of your Facebook donation receipt.



ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM INDIANA LIONS SPEECH AND HEARING, INC.



The disciplines of Audiology, Speech-Language Pathology, and American Sign Language/English Interpreting include trained specialists providing services in a variety of educational and healthcare settings. Each year brings new knowledge and advancements that will help individuals overcome difficulties associated with speech, hearing, and language deficits. Advances in medicine and an increasingly aging population necessitate numerous additional professionals in these fields.

Colleges and universities throughout the United States offer degrees in these fields. A degree in one of these areas requires a minimum of a Bachelor's Degree. Encouragement by Lions throughout Indiana may be a decisive factor in a career choice for an Indiana youth to select one of these professions. Indiana Lions Speech and Hearing, Inc. (ILSH) may provide scholarships of \$750.00 per student for up to four students per academic year. Students who are entering their *junior* year or above are eligible to apply for this scholarship. If more than four applicants per year, the scholarships will be awarded based on academic achievement. Please refer to the eligibility requirements listed on the application for further information.

Students are eligible to receive the scholarship for a maximum of two years. Renewals are not to be considered automatic. The student must repeat the application process to be considered for a scholarship for the second year.

Once approved for the scholarship, the student will be notified by one of the Trustees of Indiana Lions Speech & Hearing, Inc. A check will be issued and sent to the appropriate department at the university in which the student is enrolled.

FOR A STUDENT TO BE ELIGIBLE, S/HE MUST:

- Be majoring in a program in the field of Audiology, Speech-Language Pathology, or American Sign Language/English Interpreting;
- Be entering their 3rd or 4th year in said program, or into graduate school at an accredited college or university offering a minimum four year degree in one of the above mention fields;
- Make application to a ILS&H Trustee or Indiana Lions Club and be sponsored by a Lions Club in Indiana;
- Demonstrate an accumulative GPA of a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale or higher;
- Verification of meeting eligibility requirements by University advisor or department faculty member;
- Submit an essay of at least 200 words explaining how the scholarship will be used.

FOR A LIONS CLUB TO PARTICIPATE, THEY MUST:

- Promote career paths consistent with ILSH scholarship program and seek out deserving students who may require financial support;
- Consider providing financial support in addition to the \$750 from Indiana Speech & Hearing, Inc.;
- Furnish eligibility date and the recommended support to a District Trustee of Indiana Lions Speech & Hearing, Inc. 120 days prior to the enrollment date;
- Recommend the student for scholarship renewal for the second year with satisfactory progress and the club's continued support; and
- Complete the application form.


