

The Power of \$100 For many Lions, a donation of just \$2 a week is a small sacrifice to make. Yet small gifts like this have a big impact over time! Club members regularly take their spare change to their meetings, leaving with empty bags in tow to start the saving over again. "Time for Change clearly proves that a little each week can transform into something life-saving or life-changing – surgery, education, food, water, shelter. This fundraising effort has also been effective in helping Lions develop a habit of sustained and ongoing giving to LCIF."

SEMINAR 3 HAS GAT IN SESSION 1 AND EYE BANK IN SESSION 2


