
nominations! District Officers/ **Trustee Positions Open for Nominations**

A Message from District 25-G LCIF Coordinator PDG Marlyn Fast



The major fundraiser, Campaign 100 for 2017-2022, has finished. The goal of raising \$300 million was surpassed by \$25 million plus, because of the hard work and dedication of Lions like you. WOW!

Lions Clubs International What happens now? We all know that the needs of the world continue to grow, and **FOUNDATION** we must build on this campaign success to ensure the future of our Foundation's ability to magnify our services. Our goal for District 25-G, July 1, 2022-June 30,

2023 is \$31,824, which is \$25.50 per member. We know this is doable since 3 of the last 5 years we have donated more than that.

Last Lion year alone, LCIF mobilized more than \$6 million for Lions service in the wake of natural disasters. To date, more than \$140 million has been awarded for disaster relief programs worldwide.

As of the end of November 2022, 9 of the 47 clubs in District 25-G have already given \$9,272, leaving about \$22,500 for the 38 other clubs that have not yet responded. Your response is urgently needed.

100% of your donation will benefit LCIF grants and programs.

But did you know that LCIF gave \$35 million in grants in 2022? 10% of what was raised during campaign 100 is now gone, in 10 years it could all be gone. LCIF has tasked Constitutional Area 1 (USA and Canada) to raise \$50 million. In Indiana, our goal this year is \$216,750 which is \$25.50 per member for the year or \$2.13 per month. Please donate if you can.

LCIF will have a table at the Mid-Winter Conference, January 20th & 21st, and I am sure we will have something to raffle along with much information about LCIF. Register for the conference and come see us.

Madison Township Lions Club Donates to Several Local Charities


