#### **District Goals**

- By the end of the 2021-2022 fiscal year, our District will start 1 new club with 20 charter members. This will be the first new club in four years.
- By the end of the 2021-2022 fiscal year, our District will show a net gain in membership.
- By the end of the 2021-2022 fiscal year, our District will have 75% of the clubs reporting services in MYLion which is a 35% increase over last year.
- By the end of the 2021-2022 fiscal year, our District will have 75% of all clubs donating to LCIF. This will be 30% increase over last year.
- By June 30, 2021, the District will have a virtual or in-person Officers Training sessions with representatives of over 50% of the clubs attending.
- By July 31, 2021, the District will have a virtual or in-person training session with at least 6 Zone Chairs attending.
- Starting July 1, 2021, the District will highlight the Eyeglass Recycling Program.

# Some things you should know for next year



Lions recently were notified of a change in the location for the 2022 International Convention. Due to the ongoing challenges presented by the coronavirus, the LCI Board of Directors voted to relocate the 2022 Lions International Convention from New Delhi, India to Montréal, Canada. The ongoing travel and health advisories, and the size and complexity of our convention, led to this difficult decision.

Unfortunately, this is not the first time COVID-19 has required our organization to make adjustments for the health and safety of our Lions, staff, vendors and local communities. In 2020, the board of directors voted to cancel the Singapore convention due to the government of Singapore restricting entry to the country. In January 2021, the 103rd Lions Clubs International Convention was transformed from an in-person event in Montréal, Canada to the organization's first virtual convention in response to the ongoing global pandemic. Future LCI conventions are scheduled for: 2022 - Montreal, Canada; 2023 - Boston, MA; 2024 - Melbourne, Australia; 2025 - Mexico City, Mexico; 2026 - Atlanta, Georgia; 2027 - Washington, DC; 2028 - Singapore.

You will shortly receive dues invoices from LCI and the District 25-G Treasurer Ron Guth. As of July 1, you can no longer remove a member without paying for the July 1-Dec 31 period. If you already removed a member PRIOR to July 1, and that Lion has subsequently paid dues for the new year, you can add that Lion back without having to pay a new member fee.

LCI recently announced that the new member fee and the fee to charter new clubs, have been waived through December 31, 2021. This \$35 new member savings should be a real plus for clubs to use in soliciting prospective members.

DG Marlyn Fast will be distributing his district directory shortly after July 1. But to help you start planning your year, here are some dates you should set aside now.

- Banner Night August 21, Camp Mack (registration form included in this newsletter)
- District Meetings August 2, October 30, February 19, and May 14.
- Mid-Winter Conference January 22, Indianapolis
- District Convention March 12, Argos UM Church
- State Convention April 29-May 1.



## **Indiana Lions Foundation Needs Your Help at the Indiana State Fair**



The Indiana State Fair project is the single largest fundraiser for the Indiana Lions Foundation. Once again, we are asking for your help to staff 3 gates at the Fair. We have more than 800 positions to fill, but only 300 are filled so far. Committee members are working diligently to recruit volunteers, but the time for recruitment is considerably shorter this year.

#### There are many changes at the Indiana State Fair this year.

- The schedule has been expanded from 3 weekends to 4, but the Fair wll be closed Monday and Tuesday of each week. The Fair will open early on the first 2 Fridays, so a few positions will start at 5:30 a.m. on those days. There are also staggered start times for the morning and afternoon shifts every day. Please check the Foundation website for details. Gates will close at 8:00 p.m. daily, instead of 9:00 p.m. or 9:30 p.m., as in previous years.
- No more riding the shuttle from the 46th Street parking lot! We will enter through Gate 10 on 42nd Street at the northeast corner of the fairgrounds. Identify yourself as a Lions Foundation volunteer and you should not be asked to pay entry or parking fees. It will help to wear a Lions shirt or hat. As you enter the gate, you will see a large gray building on your right. Park as close to that building as possible.
- Our check-in area will be set up in a small free-standing building on the west side of the large gray building. The bank will be in a similar building nearby. Volunteers will be transported to their gates after they complete the check-in process.
- In addition to ticket sellers and tickets scanners, we will also provide kiosk monitors to monitor new self-service ticket kiosks. All ticket sellers and kiosk monitors will be in air-conditioned buildings. Ticket scanners will still be outside under tents. This year, the scanning devices will be mounted on tables, fairgoers will scan their own tickets, and our ticket scanners will simply approve entry after tickets are successfully scanned.

If you work a morning shift, you will receive 1 W.P. Woods credit for each shift worked, if you work an afternoon shift, you will receive 2 W.P. Woods credits for each shift worked, or you may choose to have \$10 donated to any of the 5 state projects or your club. W.P. Woods credits are worth \$50 each when you use credits to purchase a W.P. Woods Fellowship for yourself or someone else.
