

MEXICO LIONS CLUB!

On Thursday, May 7, 2020, the Mexico Lions worked behind the scenes, despite the Corona Virus, to honor veterans from several different Wars. At the Green Lawn Cemetery in Mexico, Service Markers were placed at grave sites for veterans from World War I, The Korean War, and U S Veterans. Yesterday, Thursday, May 14, 2020, more service markers were installed for veterans from World War I, The Vietnam War, and U S Veterans.

This activity has been underway as a Mexico Lions Project for about 25 years. Since its inception, the Mexico Lions Club has installed approximately 400 markers in two cemeteries. Veterans served in the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines and Coast Guard. One veteran served in The War of 1812, and several served in the Civil War, as well as World War I, World II, The Korean War, The Vietnam War and Desert Storm.

The process begins with Sharon Linn, who does the research, and identifies the veterans, and their location. Her research is critical to the success of this endeavor. This can be a lengthy process. She puts Location stakes into place, so that the Lions can then go to the specific location.

Fred Wouster brought a portable generator on the back of his pickup, which provides electrical power to the electric drill, which is used to drill the hole for the marker.

the marker shaft and inserted it into the hole. Sharon Linn finishes the process by installing a flag into the top of the service marker.

The Mexico Lions are so grateful to the VFW, who supplies the flags annually for free. They are a blessing! Currently, there are 389 veterans in the cemetery.

We also want to extend our thanks and gratitude to Pete Wouster, who has provided this very reliable gas operated electric generator. This was a major blessing!


From the initial planting, weeding, and building a support system for the sugar snap peas (many thanks to Angie Clark from the Garden Center for

Because recent events have not allowed us to meet or continue our monthly fish fries, it does not mean that we have not been busy.

Before the shutdown, our Leos, with the Club's backing, held a Father-Daughter dance as a fund raiser. There was a photo booth, games, snacks, and dancing. It was a very successful event and enjoyed by all who attended.

The Lions Club donated its March fish fry proceeds to Compassionate Health Care. With the support of Woodlawn Hospital and volunteers, they assist the uninsured with medical needs. Our donation every year allows them to continue with the assistance of Family Eye Care to expand their service to eye exams for those who otherwise would not be able to afford them.

We also donated to the local Food Bank in Akron to help it purchase food for the extra need brought on by the recent events.

In April in conjunction with the Town of Akron, Pike Memorial Park Board and Pike Lumber, we assisted in the purchase and replacing of trees that did not make it through the winter along our hiking trails and throughout our park.

Another project Akron Lions Club and individual members were involved in was to assist Ms. Good, the Akron Elementary Physical Education Teacher, in the purchase of balls and jump ropes for the PK-3 grade children. She wanted to encourage them in getting outside and getting exercise when they were at home during the school closures.

When longtime Lion Kenny Bright passed away, he bequeathed money to establish through the Northern Indiana Foundation a \$500 scholarship for the continued education of Akron students who had ties to the Lion.
