CS Ann Haffner — *Please share this information with Club Officers and Board of Directors*

To assure that the Lions of District 25-G begin the new year with information needed throughout the year, a reprint of information for your use:

Dues: In July, your club will receive your July-December State & District Semi-Annual Dues Statement from Cabinet Treasurer Ron Guth. You will be billed \$9 per member on record at Lions Club International on July 1.

In addition, LCI will bill your club \$21.50 per member for July-December dues. For spouses and family members recorded as a Family Unit on MyLCI, you will be billed \$10.75.

Dues are payable within thirty (30) days to both CT Ron and LCI. Checks for International dues should be made out to “*International Association of Lions Clubs*” and mailed to LCI at the Chicago address (not Oak Brook) in the upper right - hand corner of the billing statement.

District and State dues checks should be made out to “District 25-G” and mailed to:

Bunker Hill, IN 46914.

Your club should be collecting at least \$61 in dues per year from each member.

Family members enrolled in a Family Unit (except for the Head of Household) should be paying at least \$39.50 per year in dues. (Family members’ international dues are \$21.50 per year, rather than \$43.)

Dues must be paid from your club’s Administrative Fund, not from your club’s Activities (Project) Fund. All money raised from the public must be used for charity.

Monthly Reports: Club Secretaries, it is extremely important that you file the Monthly Membership Report on MyLCI by the last day of each month. After that, it is considered late, and may jeopardize your club’s chances of earning the Club Excellence Award for 2019-2020. As of July 1, 2019, Monthly Activities should be reported each month on the new MyLion website, rather than on MyLCI.

Club Excellence Award: If your club finished positive in membership for the 2018-2019 Lions year, you may be eligible to receive the coveted “Club Excellence Award” if you fulfilled the other requirements. The form can be downloaded from the LCI website or I can email you a copy. Complete the form and mail it to:

If you qualify, he will sign it and forward it to LCI. At the top right of the form, be sure you list three SERVICE projects, not FUNDRAISERS.

The Club Excellence Award application for 2019-2020 will soon be available on the LCI website. Please print a copy and use it as your roadmap to success!

Budget: As your club’s Board of Directors plan for this new Lions year, I encourage you to prepare both an administrative and activities budget of income and expenses to be approved by your club’s membership. This will help to ensure that your club remains financially sound, provides well-defined guidelines for spending, keeps the membership well-informed, alleviates unnecessary discussion and disagreement during club meetings, and helps to establish proof that your club is a charitable organization.

I hope the start to your Lions year is going well. As the District GST I am charged with seeing that clubs file their MMR and Activity reports.

The MMR reports are due by midnight on the last day of every Month, whether you meet during that month or not. The reports can be entered by the Club Secretary, President or the Club GST or Club Administrator if your club has these offices.

It is a vital part of your office responsibility to see to it that these reports are entered. In order to make these reports you must have a Lion Account as noted below.

In March, Lions Clubs International launched our new single sign on system called Lion Account. Your Lion Account gives you access to MyLCI, MyLion, Shop, Insights (our newest data

dashboard application) and future applications. While many Lions and Leos have created a Lion Account, there are key officers in your district who have not yet registered. These Lions need to register so they can file club MMR and Activity reports.

If you are a Club Secretary, President or Treasurer and do not have a Lion Account please register as soon as you can. I will help you to register in any way I can, but I cannot do it for you. I am willing to meet somewhere there is WIFI to help with setting up an account.

How do Lions register for a Lion Account?

1. **If they are registered on MyLion:** Registered MyLion users can use their MyLion username and password to login today. Their MyLion username and password are their Lion Account.

2. **If they are not registered on MyLion:** MyLCI users who did not register on MyLion must create a Lion Account. They will need their member ID and a valid email address or mobile phone number on record in MyLCI.
3. There is a Lion Account registration guide to assist Lions in this process. Lions that need additional help, they can reach out to our support team at mylion@lionsclubs.org or by phone at 1- 630-468-7000, available Monday-Friday, 8:00am – 4:30 pm CST (Chicago time).

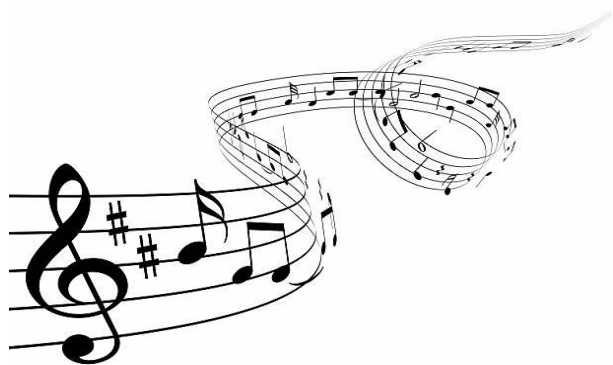

When you organize a Lions club service activity that is meaningful to your community, you can make a more significant impact on the people you serve. Whether you're just getting started or your club is in need of a fresh plan of action, here are some steps to help guide you through the process of organizing a meaningful, effective service project.

Make a list of possible programs.

Ask your club members the following questions:

- What do you like about your community?
- What do you want to improve in the community?
- What kinds of skills, resources, people and funding is required for the improvements you want to make?

Following the discussion, identify and rank the top five features and top five improvements to consider.

Appoint tasks.

Further discuss possible projects and identify three to five club opportunities. Set up task forces, or committees, to research each project further. Task force members should collect ideas for implementation, discuss possible action steps and recruit interested Lions.

Conduct research.

Make the necessary contacts in the community to find out more about your opportunity, and consider asking the following questions:

- Do you think this project will help the community?
- How do you think the improvement could be made?
- What resources do you have to help make the improvement?
- Are there other needs you think the club should consider?

Communicate with your contacts closely and remember to keep an open mind!

Write a plan.

Develop a written plan that includes goals and objectives, time frame, and people and resources needed.

Implement the plan!

Involve your members and reward their successes along the way. Include progress reports in club newsletters and meetings. When the project is complete, take a moment to review the actions, including what worked and what didn't work, and identify ways to improve for the next project.
