

Last year at the International Convention in Boston, International Leadership rolled out Mission 1.5. The stated goal for Mission 1.5 is to increase worldwide membership to 1,500,000 members by July 1, 2027. At that time, we had just over 1.3 million members. So this year we gathered in Melbourne, Australia and guess what? Membership had actually fallen to around 1,295,000 worldwide members.

But there is an underlying goal of this e ort and that is to serve ONE BILLION PEOPLE BY 2027. When I heard that it put Mission 1.5 in a di



erent light for me. After all, we're LIONS and WE SERVE is our motto. I don't know about you but I became a LION because WE SERVE. When I volunteer to help out at my Club's Annual Kids Christmas Party I see a four year old's eyes get as big as saucers when they go up to sit on Santa's lap. THAT'S WHY I BECAME A LION. Because in serving, we do good. Acts of Service are a true reflection of the evolution as human beings and become our connection to God.

As LIONS our purpose is to make our communities that much better. We take pride in our community and in our role as LIONS and our community, hopefully, is that much better because WE SERVE. Right?

BUT, and here's the Catch-22, to serve our communities more, we need more members. That really is what it boils down to. I don't know about your club but my Lakes of the Four Seasons Club is one of the largest in the District but our members are pretty well stretched out as far as doing more activities. If we wish to do more we need more members.

Mission 1.5 addresses the need for more members. Below is what is said about this e ort on the LCI headquarters webpage.

Lions Clubs International's Mission 1.5 is a global initiative aimed at expanding the organization's membership to 1.5 million by July 1, 20271. This mission is not directly associated with specific projects but rather focuses on strengthening the clubs and their service capacities. Here are some key aspects of Mission 1.5:

1. Membership Growth: The mission aims to revitalize existing clubs and charter new ones to reach the membership goal

2. Global Membership Approach: This approach is designed to inspire all Lions through fellowship and exciting service

3. Resources and Tools: Mission 1.5 provides various resources and tools to help clubs grow, such as guides for inviting members and chartering new clubs.

4. Awards: Lions participating in Mission 1.5 have the opportunity to earn exclusive patches, pins, plaques, and presidential medals...

However, the mission's broader goal of serving more people has led to the creation of clubs focused on specific causes. We call those specialty clubs.

In summary, while Mission 1.5 is primarily a membership growth initiative, it indirectly influences the creation of clubs and projects that align with the Lions Clubs International's global causes.

I know clubs in the district are struggling. Symptoms include low and/or declining membership, the same CLUB officers year after year, average age of the club over 60 with some being over 70 years of age, and low participation in club events and activities. We have closed 4 clubs in the last two years and all those that were dropped exhibited all or most of those symptoms.

Your District Team DG Patty, 2VDG Dave, and I have a goal to visit all clubs in the district in the coming year. But right now, all clubs in the district should be asking themselves questions like: Where will our club be in five years, where are potential new members and what help do we need to recruit them.

Membership must stop being passive about recruiting new members. For goodness sakes, call DG Patty (219) 671-4668 or myself (630) 699-4278 and ask for assistance.

I know each and every member has a stake in a club with a long tradition of serving their community. Let's be proud of that tradition let's share our enthusiasm with potential new members.

Club Excellence Award

The Club Excellence Award is the ideal way to set your club on the path to continued success while gaining prestige for excelling in the areas of membership, service, leadership and organizational excellence, and marketing.

Upon receiving the award, a banner patch and pin will be awarded to your club president. But more importantly, your club's membership will be revitalized, your service impact will grow and your members will see greater leadership opportunities.

The Club Excellence Application is attached to your email with this Newsletter.

The form can also be found in the Member Center at <u>www.lionslubs.com</u>.

The requirements for the 23-24 Club Excellence Award are as follows:

<u>Membership</u> :Achieved a new growth of two members or 10% or more members (whichever is greater).

<u>Service</u>: Started a new service project —*consider one of our Global Causes!* List three service activities your club participated in that were reported to Lions Club International.

<u>LCIF</u>: Contributed to LCIF an amount equal to or greater than the club's membership total multiplied by US\$10.

- Leadership and Organization: Reported club officers to Lions International
- Key officers participate in club officer training
- Club is in good standing you paid your bills

The application must be filled out and sent to the District Governor for her signature. This can be done via email. DG Patty will then sign the application and forward it to LCI. The deadline for all signed applications is **August 31, 2024.**

Dear Lions of District 25A,

I am happy to be serving you again as District Treasurer. I will, to the best of my ability, keep and record all funds of the District and pay all bills in a timely fashion.

One of the first duties I encountered this term was to issue dues statements to each club. The assessed fee includes payment to the state and district for the period July 1 through December 31, 2024. This is based on the number of members on record with LCI on June 30. These statements were e-mailed to the Club, President, Secretary, and Treasurer (if the e-mail address was available on the new Lions portal). If your club has not received it please contact me.

All donation checks to Lions projects should be made to the project and mailed to me. This insures that your club will receive credit for that amount in the district convention book. When writing a check please include "Lions of 25A" on the check. For example, "Lions of 25A - Ed Paine Helping Hands". This insures that there is no difficulty in cashing the check at the bank. (One time the bank refused to cash a check that was made to Ed Paine. They asked where is Ed?)

Any request for disbursement from the district projects must be accompanied by a completed form. Find one attached. It is also available on the district web page.
