IN LOVING MEMORY OF PDG JERI SEELY



July 26, 1940 – November 17, 2019

The loss of Geraldine Rae "Jeri" Seely on Sunday, Nov. 17, has left a void not only in the lives of her husband and brother, in-laws, and nephews, but those who knew her as a Lion and a friend.

Jeri grew up in Milford, daughter of Jerry and Kathryn Bushong, and graduated from Milford High School in 1958. She married Durwood "Bud" Seely on Sept. 11, 1960, purchasing a home in Milford and later building a new home southeast of town.

She started with The Papers Incorporated in a part-time position, but that only lasted a couple months when her responsibilities and job rapidly evolved into full-time employment on Aug. 7, 1961, and eventually became the editor in chief, which was her position most of her 58-year career with the company. When The Milford Mail and Syracuse-Wawasee Journal consolidated in February 1962 into The Mail-Journal, her duties also grew.

She was actively involved with Lions Club, both on a local and statewide level. She was deeply involved with the Leader Dog Program. Her commitment to Milford Lions Club began in 1991 and continued at the local level where she served as club president and held the position of club secretary for numerous years. She also actively participated in the club's local projects and served as the managing editor of the state-wide Hoosier Lion.

As a Life Member of LCI, she served as Zone, Regional and District chairman, and from 1996-97 served as District Governor for District G. She has been the District public relations chairman and was appointed as the Centennial Chairman three years ago, with her term ending in July at the International Lions Convention.

Additionally, she has served as convention promotions chairman, protocol chairman and district trustee for Leader Dogs for the Blind. She served two terms as Cabinet Secretary and Cabinet Treasurer at the District level.

At the state level she was state PR chairman, served on the Mid-Winter Committee, where she has served as a presenter. She also was Vice-Chairman of the Credentials Committee in Germany in 2013 on the International level. She and Bud have also attended many USA/Canada Forums.

Seely was one of the first two women to serve on the Indiana Lions State Council. She, along with her husband, have gone on numerous Lions Club eye-related mission trips to Guatemala, Mexico and Kenya.

She received the 2018 Indiana Distinguished Lion Award in May, being the first woman to receive the recognition award. She also received the Melvin Jones Fellowship Award through Lions Clubs International Foundation and the Progressive W.P. Woods Award from the Indiana Lions Foundation Inc. She received the International Leadership Medal in 2001, International Presidential Medals 2007 and 2013, and the Indiana Distinguished Lion in 2018.

She was a Life Member of LCI. Jeri will be missed for her caring ways, her involvement, her words of wisdom and advice and her friendship. Jeri, you lived the motto of Lions. YOU SERVED!

THE IMPORTANCE OF CLUB REPORTS

CLUB SECRETARIES: I hope you are aware of the important position you hold in your club.

You are the liaison officer between your club and District 25-G and Lions Clubs International. Your promptness in submitting reports on time keeps LCI and 25-G's officers informed and is much appreciated.

Most of you are doing a great job, but a few are behind several months with MMRs and some haven't reported activities for many months, if ever!

MONTHLY MEMBERSHIP REPORT: The MMR is used to report membership changes: new, transfer, deceased, reinstated and dropped members; address, phone, e-mail and name changes; corrections and additions.

Either the club president or secretary can file this report on MyLCI. If you don't have a username and password you can set this up following the directions after clicking on "MyLCI/MyLion LOGIN" on the LCI home page, <u>www.lionsclubs.org</u> and then clicking on "REGISTER."

You'll need your LCI membership number to do this. The MMR <u>must</u> be filed every month by midnight CST the last day of the month even if there are no changes.

Filing online with MyLCI does not mean that DG Mary will receive a copy. It must be viewed and saved to your computer and then sent as an attachment to her at maryrsb@comcast.net. It is a nice gesture to also send it to your zone chairperson and 1st VDG Brian Thomas at <u>brian10k@aol.com</u>.

New Lions will not receive the HOOSIER LION or LION magazine until their membership is recorded with LCI. Several clubs have members on the rolls at LCI with no or incorrect addresses. Hence, they do not receive these publications.

If your club still has members on record at LCI that are deceased or have dropped out your club is liable for paying LCI, district and state dues for them. Please make sure this is taken care of when submitting your December MMR or your club will be liable for January through June dues for those unreported dropped or deceased members.

INSTRUCTIONS: If you need directions, look under "Resources" once you've logged into MyLCI. To file your MMR, click on "My Lions Club" and then "Members" to update a member's information, drop or add a member, or file no changes for the month.

Click on "Reports" for a number of reports you can view or save to print. Click on "Membership Cards" to print them for your members. Only Club Secretaries and Presidents can make changes or additions. Treasurers can view and print reports if they have activated a username and password.

If you have difficulty filing reports, making changes, or need help securing a username and password contact me at ann_haffner@yahoo.com or 574-457-6118 and I will be happy to assist you.

CLUB ACTIVITIES REPORT: Activities reports can no longer be filed on My/LCI. They must be reported on MyLion. They can be reported ahead of time or filed after the date of the event. I've found it's much easier to wait until after the date of the activity, donation, meeting, etc.

Reporting our activities is especially important as we strive to reach Lions Clubs International's Service Challenge Goal of serving 200 million people every year.

WHEN YOUR CLUB RECEIVES YOUR JANUARY LCI AND DISTRICT AND STATE DUES BILLINGS PLEASE MAKE SURE THOSE BILLINGS ARE PAID IMMEDIATELY.

UNLESS THEY ARE RECORDED AS PAID ON MyLCI AND WITH CT RON GUTH BY FEBRUARY 28, 2020 YOUR CLUB WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO VOTE AT OUR DISTRICT CONVENTION IN ARGOS MARCH 14.

Districts may apply for a maximum amount of \$5,000 in the Standard Grant, while the Large-Scale Grant is a 3 year duration, with a maximum of \$15,000 per year.

We, as Lions, may think that what we do in our local community has little bearing to LCI, and therefore don't bother to file their reports.

This couldn't be further from the truth. By letting LCI know what you are accomplishing through service, they can use the information on a large scale to pave the way to partnerships with other organizations.

It also enhances LCI's support in identifying projects which could be implemented in other regions of the world. Your reported activity may be



some of your questions. Talk about this with your Lions mentor.

But the best thing is, even though it is a lot of work, there any many people happy to help you during these important years. You aren't alone.

The real point here is that we need you. Be a Lion. Step up and help fulfil this need for 25-G. You won't regret it.

High School Coach to highlight Saturday MWC Luncheon

Mike Kirschner, a 1979 Warren Central graduate, will provide a motivational talk at the Saturday noon luncheon at the 2020 Mid-Winter Conference. The conference will be held January 10-11 at the Crowne Plaza at the Indianapolis International Airport.

Kirschner was a two-year letterman in football and received his BS degree from Ball State University in May of 1983, his teaching license from the University of Indianapolis in December of 1989, and his master's degree from Olivet Nazarene University in May of 2006.

Coach Kirschner served as assistant football coach, girls' basketball coach, and softball coach at Warren Central High School from 1990-1996. From 1996-2000, he served as the head football coach, assistant girls' basketball coach and head boys' track coach at Cascade High School.

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ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM INDIANA LIONS SPEECH AND HEARING, INC.



The disciplines of Audiology, Speech-Language Pathology, and American Sign Language/English Interpreting include trained specialists providing services in a variety of educational and healthcare settings. Each year brings new knowledge and advancements that will help individuals overcome difficulties associated with speech, hearing, and language deficits. Advances in medicine and an increasingly aging population necessitate numerous additional professionals in these fields.

Colleges and universities throughout the United States offer degrees in these fields. A degree in one of these areas requires a minimum of a Bachelor's Degree. Encouragement by Lions throughout Indiana may be a decisive factor in a career choice for an Indiana youth to select one of these professions. Indiana Lions Speech and Hearing, Inc. (ILSH) may provide scholarships of \$750.00 per student for up to four students per academic year. Students who are entering their *junior* year or above are eligible to apply for this scholarship. If more than four applicants per year, the scholarships will be awarded based on academic achievement. Please refer to the eligibility requirements listed on the application for further information.

Students are eligible to receive the scholarship for a maximum of two years. Renewals are not to be considered automatic. The student must repeat the application process to be considered for a scholarship for the second year.

Once approved for the scholarship, the student will be notified by one of the Trustees of Indiana Lions Speech & Hearing, Inc. A check will be issued and sent to the appropriate department at the university in which the student is enrolled.

FOR A STUDENT TO BE ELIGIBLE, S/HE MUST:

- Be majoring in a program in the field of Audiology, Speech-Language Pathology, or American Sign Language/English Interpreting;
- Be entering their 3rd or 4th year in said program, or into graduate school at an accredited college or university offering a minimum four year degree in one of the above mention fields;
- Make application to a ILS&H Trustee or Indiana Lions Club and be sponsored by a Lions Club in Indiana;
- Demonstrate an accumulative GPA of a 3.0 on a 4.0 scale or higher;
- Verification of meeting eligibility requirements by University advisor or department faculty member;
- Submit an essay of at least 200 words explaining how the scholarship will be used.

FOR A LIONS CLUB TO PARTICIPATE, THEY MUST:

- Promote career paths consistent with ILSH scholarship program and seek out deserving students who may require financial support;
- Consider providing financial support in addition to the \$750 from Indiana Speech & Hearing, Inc.;
- Furnish eligibility date and the recommended support to a District Trustee of Indiana Lions Speech & Hearing, Inc. 120 days prior to the enrollment date;
- Recommend the student for scholarship renewal for the second year with satisfactory progress and the club's continued support; and
- Complete the application form.

Make a list of possible programs. Ask your club members the

- following questions: • What do you like about
 - your community?
 What do you want to improve in the community?
 - What kinds of skills, resources, people and funding is required for the improvements you want to make?

Following the discussion, identify and rank the top five features and top five improvements to consider.

Appoint tasks.

Further discuss possible projects and identify three to five club opportunities. Set up task forces, or committees, to research each project further. Task force members should collect ideas for implementation, discuss possible action steps and recruit interested Lions.

Conduct research.

Make the necessary contacts in the community to find out more about your opportunity, and consider asking the following questions:

- Do you think this project will help the community?
- How do you think the improvement could be made?
- What resources do you have to help make the improvement?
- Are there other needs you think the club should consider?

Communicate with your contacts closely and remember to keep an open mind!

Write a plan.

Develop a written plan that includes goals and objectives, time frame, and people and resources needed.

Implement the plan!

Involve your members and reward their successes along the way. Include progress reports in club newsletters and meetings. When the project is complete, take a moment to review the actions, including what worked and what didn't work, and identify ways to improve for the next project.
