

Stargardts's Eye Disease Treatment

Request for Donations

My mother had contacted you regarding my husband and my son. They have an incurable eye disease called Stargardts macular dystrophy. We are trying to raise funds for travel and doctor expenses in order for them to be seen by Dr. Nolan in Connecticut, whom is the only doctor in the US currently helping stop the progression and possibly improving vision in patients with this disease. We would greatly appreciate any amount that could be given to possibly help my husband's and son's vision be saved. I would like to tell you a little about them.

My husband worked at Memorial Hospital for 17 years. He is currently an active member at our church, White River Chapel, in Petersburg. He was a very talented carpenter, mechanic, electrician, and musician. He could do anything he put his mind to. In 2006, at the age of 35, he started having vision trouble and thought that he needed glasses. However, when he went for a routine eye exam he found out that his vision loss was permanent and this it would only get worse, possibly leading to complete blindness. He was sent to specialists in Evansville and Indianapolis. They diagnosed him as having Retinitis Pigmentosa and said there was nothing they could do for him and that he would eventually go blind. Then, in 2009, his vision loss had progressed so far that he could no longer do his job or drive a vehicle. Since that time, his vision has continued to decrease. Then in 2014, my 14-year-old son went for a routine eye exam and was found to be starting with the same condition as my husband. He was sent to doctors in Evansville and Indianapolis. This time, the doctors did not think it was Retinitis Pigmentosa. They ordered genetic testing which came back that they both had Stargardts disease. Stargardts is an inherited form of macular degeneration that causes progressive central vision loss usually to the point of blindness. My son does not notice much vision loss, at this time. However, my husband has very significant vision loss. He has wavy vision, blind spots, blurriness, impaired color vision, and difficulty adapting to dim lighting. He can no longer drive, work, read, or recognize faces.

We have very limited income [FYI, their 2014 1040 shows an AGI of just over \$8,100]. His Social Security Disability is our main source of income. We have 3 children, of all whom have a 50% chance of having this inherited disease (our oldest already showing signs). I am only able to work part-time as custodian of our church due to his physical limitations requiring my constant help and caring for our younger children.

We are desperate to stop his vision loss progression and to preserve my son's as well. We would so greatly appreciate any donation that could be given to enable them to be seen by Dr. Nolan in Connecticut. Thank you so much for your consideration. God bless!

Hello again. I just wanted to let you know we spoke with the Dr. in Connecticut that my husband and son are wanting to see. His charges are \$1500 each and \$45 each for eye drops. We would be required to stay a 4 days. Travel, hotel, and food expenses are great. Again, any help that can be given would be extremely appreciated. Thanks again for your time and consideration.




West Boggs Park, located in <u>Martin</u> and <u>Daviess</u> counties, bills itself as "Southwestern Indiana's Best Kept Secret". *Call 812-295-3421 for reservations.*

Though technically a county park, it could easily pass for a state park. With a 625 acre lake and 1,500 total acreage it has the space to accommodate a lot of activities for a lot of people. The lake itself is obviously the featured attraction, but you will find over 200 large campsites (all of them with water and electric hook-ups), hiking trails, organized activities, shelter houses, a beach for swimming, play areas for kids and even an old amphitheater that is scheduled for renovation. They also have both pontoon boats and john boats available to rent.

For a change of pace, West Boggs also has a golf course and a lakeside restaurant on site. The restaurant is called Stoll's Lakeview and sits right on the lake. It features Amish buffet-style dining, and Friday night seafood buffets. Facilities include:

- -Boating One (1) 3-lane Launch Ramp (launch fee required)
- -Boat Rentals Fishing boats, PFDs
- **-Cabin Rental** Pinewood Cabin is a housekeeping cabin with cookware, dishes, bed and bath linens provided. The cabin accommodates up to four adults or two adults and three children.
- -Camp Store & Ice Cream Shop: located by the miniature golf course (812-295-3421)
- -Camping (Reservable): 12 Full Hookup Sites (electric/water/sewer), 79 Electric & Water Sites, 53 Shared Electric & Water Sites, 91 Seasonal Sites (electric/water)-
- -Dock and Post Rentals
- -Dumping Station located in the campground
- **-Fishing / Ice Fishing** The lake has been stocked with bass, bluegill, channel catfish, and crappie. State regulations apply to fishing activity at West Boggs Park in addition to a 14 inch minimum size limit for Bass.
- -Fishing Pier
- -Fish Cleaning Station
- -Picnicking / Shelterhouses (Reservable) most have electricity, drinking water, flush toilets (open when reserved), grills, and picnic tables. When not reserved they are available on a first come, first served basis.
- -Playgrounds
- **-Swimming / Beach** modern bath-house provides showers, dressing facilities, restrooms, and food concessions
- -Volleyball sand court located by the beach
- -Waterskiing
