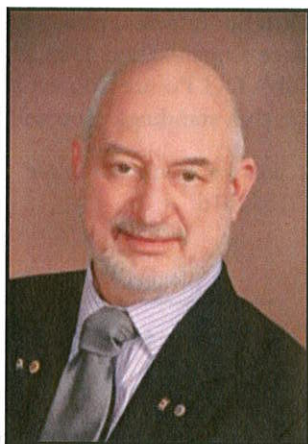

Every Lions Club that is incorporated has an ongoing responsibility to file regular business entity reports with the Indiana Secretary of State's office.

The filings are due during the anniversary month of the date of incorporation.

DO NOT RELY ON THE SECRETARY OF STATE TO SEND A REMINDER NOTICE.

Effective July 1, 2016, nonprofit businesses, that is Lions Clubs, will change from an annual payment cycle to a biennial (every two years) payment cycle.

To Login/Register use your search engine, e.g. Google, type in: "Indiana Entity Report Filing" then click on "Business Entity Report Filing-In.gov"

This will take you to the "Login" and "Register" screen.

Lions Kid Sight, USA

Jack R. Salsbery, PDG, 25F; President Vision Screening Program

In December 2015 the Vision Screening Program, with the assistance of LCIF, purchased six (6) new Plus-Optix SO9 cameras to increase our presence in the screening of pre-school children (ages 6 Mo to 6 Yrs) in our district.

So far there has been few screenings accomplished. These cameras are for the benefit of the children in our district who do not normally get vision assistance.

Where they are most valuable are in Daycares, Church schools, Pre-schools programs such as Head Start, etc.

The cameras **can not** be used in state-regulated schools due to state laws governing school screenings. This is where our other screening program steps in and screens K or 1st, 3rd, 5th, and 8th grades using the Optec 5000, SciFiMav, or charts.

Lions Kid Sight USA program is available to any and all Lions Clubs, and there is no charge for the screenings. To learn more about this program please contact Lion Sarah Getts at 317-331-9015, or Lksgetts@comcast.net.

Remember, you and your club will make a large impact on your community with this program. It is found that approximately 30% of children in that age group have eye problems that need to be identified and treated.

We've invested large sums of money into the Lion Kid Sight USA program since it started in 2014. Let's put it to good use.

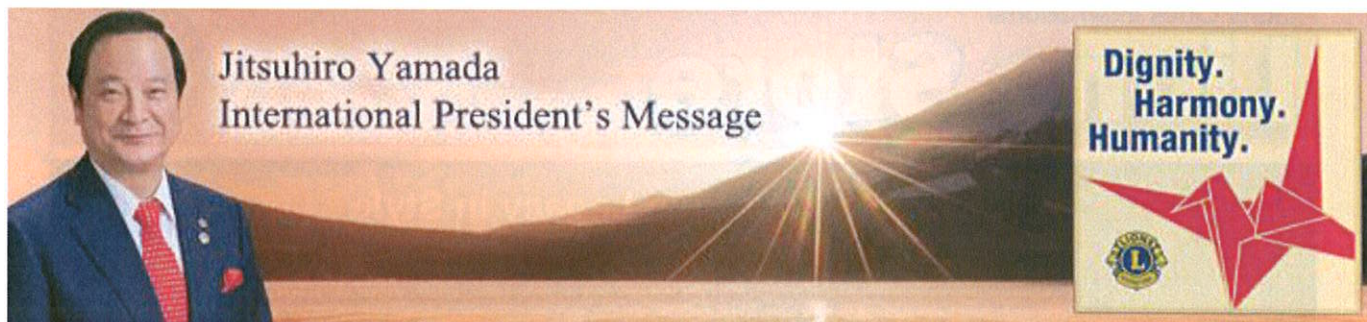

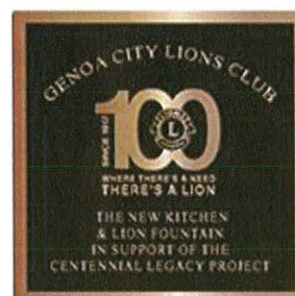

The training program could include training offered at the zone, district, multiple district or International level. Online courses from the Lions Learning Center, participation in a Club Excellence Process (CEP) Workshop or completion of the Certified Guiding Lion course also count toward the award.

- ☐ **CLUB ACTIVITY** – The club has hosted regular and meaningful club events and reported Membership Service Activities, and the New Club Officers in a timely manner.

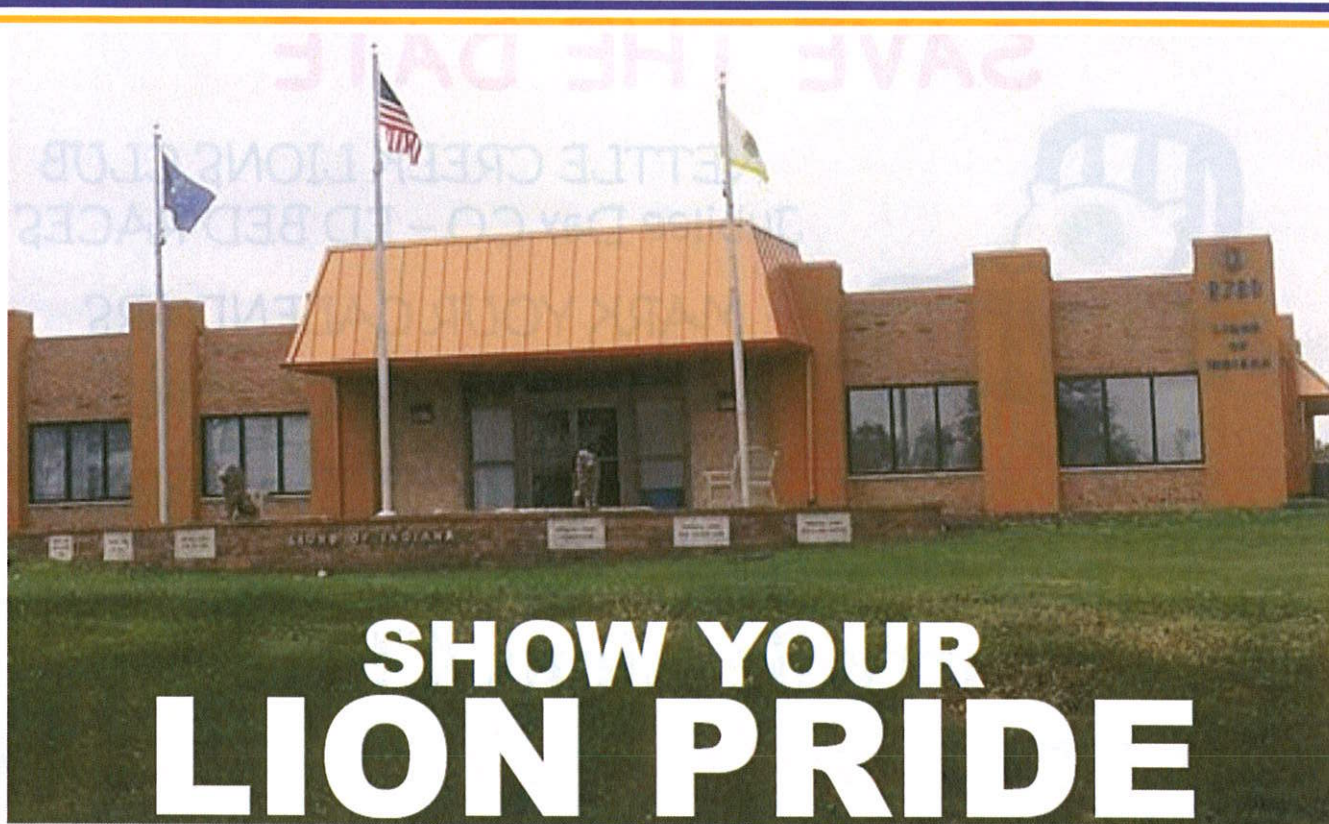
