## 2<sup>nd</sup> Vice DG Corner:

Hello Lions,

As promised, here is my thought on the concept of club burn out. So is club burn out possible? Can a club experience burn out? It can, and it is extremely serious for the health of the club. So what can cause a club to burn out?



Have you ever attended a meeting where one person opens the meeting, gives the pledge and prayer, gives all the reports, and does most of the talking? This isn't healthy for the club. This limits the number of members participating and growing in their club. No one joins a club to listen to one person do all the talking and making all the decisions.

Have you visited a club that has the same officers year after year? In this situation, no one is able to advance or learn new positions. I know in a small club, the pool to recruit new officers from limited, but rotating officers should be encouraged. The Lions who are not officers often feel left out, become bored, and feel not needed. No new ideas are introduced and those members will probably leave.

Can you remember a club meeting that was long and disorganized? Members will quickly get discouraged when meetings are like this and they will lose interest. Before long, the attendance at your meetings drop and your membership numbers follow. The simplest solution to solve for problem is to have an agenda. The agenda should be shared with all the members of the club prior to the meeting if possible. This helps everyone be prepared for any topics of discussion ahead of the meeting. This will keep the meeting organized and shorter, which results with more getting done, more involved members and less burn out.

Does your club always do the same projects? This isn't always a bad thing, but clubs should always review the project before and afterwards. Projects must be reviewed to keep them relevant for the community, interesting and enjoyable for the club members and affordable to the club. By keeping the projects interesting, and maybe trying something new, members will feel needed and appreciated. Just be sure not the overwork them, that will burn out members too.

It is easy to burn out members and clubs so we have to be careful to not bore our members and to not overwork them as well. We must all strive to have more fun in our meetings and projects. By having more fun, we can help prevent burn out in ourselves and in the Lions around us.

Did you know that since the *Involve a U.S. Veteran* pilot program began in 2013, over 90% of veterans who joined a Lions Club are still involved with their club? May is Military Appreciation Month. The *Involve a U.S. Veteran* program waives the charter or entrance fee for any qualifying veteran who joins a new or existing Lions club. Those currently serving in the National Guard or Reserves are also eligible. This special pilot program is offered only in the United States.

Lions Clubs International President Dr. Jitsuhiro Yamada will be our special guest at the convention. IP Dr. Yamada will participate in the presentation of awards at the Awards Luncheon on Saturday, and will be the keynote speaker at the All-State Banquet on Saturday evening. Convention attendees will have an opportunity to meet IP Dr. Yamada during a seminar session on Saturday afternoon.

One of the most frequently asked questions about the convention is: What is the dress code for the All-State Banquet on Saturday evening? 


