PDG Gary Ochs (Bedford) was elected to the International Convention Committee and he'll continue for another 3 years as the MD25 LCIF Chairperson. Finally, on Sunday the incoming Council of Governors for 2015-2016 selected our own DG Jeff Schafer to be their Council Chairperson (CC). Our last CC for 25-E1 was PCC Richard Halladay (Brown County, 2009-2010) and for 25-E2 it was PCC Carole Morris (Paoli-Meridian, 1997-1998).

Only two more months before my year is over. However, as stated above I'll still be plenty busy helping all Lions within the district and the state. Our membership dropped a little in April with a net loss of -6, thus giving us a net loss of -55 for the year. Having said this, I can see that everyone is working really hard in retaining their current members and recruiting new members. We have also met with the Brownstown Lions club on recruitment efforts to help increase their membership.

Remember the "Keep One" program where we're trying to improve our retention. Keep your Lions gainfully employed because it's much easier to keep a member than it is to recruit a new member. Also, take the time to commit to "Ask One" person to join your Lions Club. Let's finish out these last two months with a positive growth vice the historical huge drop that most districts have in the month of May and June. Start NOW and keep your current members and "Add One!"

LCIF & Nepal Earthquake

In the wake of the 7.9 magnitude earthquake in Nepal, LCIF has awarded a US\$100,000 Major Catastrophe grant. Local Lions are already hard at work providing disaster relief in the affected areas. Our thoughts and prayers go out to the victims, their families and the Lions of Nepal in this time of need.

With three months remaining in the fiscal year, there is a chance that LCIF may not reach its established annual financial target. This target is based on projected grant requests from Lions for the coming year, and missing the mark means we may not be able to meet vital community needs. Please consider making a donation to the Lions Measles Initiative or, consider making an unrestricted gift to support worthy Lions community service projects so we don't need to scale back initiatives due to funding limitations.

Millions of people around the world have benefited through more than 11,340 Foundation grants, which have totaled more than \$826 million. However, the vast majority of LCIF's funding comes through the generous donations from Lions clubs and individual members.

Last week during the training session I was one of the few dogs that made it through the distractions with little to no issues. Woo Hoo!

Over the next few months I'll be concentrating on lose leash walking, extended times on sitting, standing and in the down position, along with more greeting and grooming exercises. DG Jeff and Lion Sheryl will be driving out to El Paso so I'll have plenty of opportunity to practice these drills along with meeting their daughter's pets. DG Jeff will be flying to Hawaii for the International Convention, and if the convention was state side, I would be flying too! Oh well, maybe next time!

Soon the weather up at our Lake House will be warm enough for me to begin swimming lessons. I'm sure I'll enjoy the water as most Labs do. It is the time of the year that all clubs should be having their elections for next year's officers. Club secretaries should file their PU-101 (officer report) no later than May 15, 2015. A copy of the report should be sent to the District Governor, District Governor Elect and the Cabinet Secretary as soon as possible. This is to allow the DGE time to assemble the new district directory and have it ready in July. This also helps LCI to contact the new officers and setup access to the MyLCI website.

Instructions to file PU101 on the NEW LCI Web site.

- 1. Go to LCI Web site www.lionsclubs.org and click submit reports at top of page.
- 2. Click Lions Logo, then log in with appropriate information. (Be sure to review membership information in the MMR Section first --- Check to see that your newly chosen officers have the correct address listed, email address, telephone number...if they use a cell only make it the home phone--- if this information is not correct they may have a problem getting a password in July to get into to do reports everything must be current!) MAKE CORRECTIONS IF NECESSARY BEFORE GOING ANY FURTHER WITH PU101!!!
- Then Select MY LIONS CLUB box and click.....Choose Club Information
 If you need to change your clubs meeting location, date, time –
 <u>check with club Treasurer and add TAX ID number and/or verify that it is correct</u>
 CHOOSE appropriate boxes and fill in the meeting address make sure you scroll to bottom of page and SAVE.
- 4. Now go back to Home Page and in the first square box (left side) under MY TASKS
- 5. Choose ENTER CURRENT YEAR'S OFFICERS
- 6. CLICK ON CURRENT YEAR'S OFFICERS ---- THEN select NEXT YEAR.
- 7. You should then see a list of officer titles. Click on President, on the far right side click ADD OFFICER.

 A list of your club members will show up....scroll through and select the person elected for the office and then click on their name....It will automatically put the information in the right spot for you!!!!
- 8. Repeat for remaining officer selections
- 9. BE SURE TO SAVE
- 10. Go back to Home Page and click on MY LIONS CLUB ---- SELECT REPORTS
- 11. Select the LIONS CLUB OFFICER REPORT FOR NEXT YEAR
- 12. When the report comes up, please verify that everything looks correct and save a copy to your computer for your records.
- 13. Almost done......Now send an email to the following individuals so they can now put the correct information into the new District Directories they will be printing and distributing to you after July 1st.




