


ROAR LIONS of 25D, ROAR!

Monday, November 14, 2016: Our speaker will be Brigadier General, USAF (Ret) J. Stewart Goodwin, Executive Director of the Indiana War Memorials Commission. General Goodwin retired from the US Air Force with 37 years of service and is in charge of 24 acres of property in downtown Indianapolis consisting of a 30,000 sq. ft. and a 3,000 sq. ft. military museum with monuments honoring Hoosier Veterans visited by over 1.3 million annually. 



Dogs in that capacity typically work with child victims or witnesses before and during their testimony, providing emotional support and therapeutic intervention. Unfortunately the Federal Court program was delayed due to the many levels of clearance required, and Leader Dog felt it would be detrimental to continue to hold Nanook with no start date in sight.
