Step Up

Karen and I have visited 31 clubs out of the 56 that are in District C. We have been well received at all of them. All the clubs are essentially the same, but each is unique. The cultures differ from one end of the state to the other. It is amazing what clubs do for fundraising. (Someone should put a book together listing and describing each fundraiser for use by all clubs.) We have been lucky so far in that all of the really farther away clubs have been visited now that the snow and ice are upon us. It can still be treacherous since in most cases you are usually traveling after 9 p.m. on the way home. We have received some very nice gifts, one being gas cards from various clubs. By the time we are through with our official visits we will have traveled over 7,000 miles. We have been passing out some Centennial Challenge patches and pins, and this is a good thing. For those of you who may not know, your District is comprised

of 18 counties, 56 clubs and approximately 1,546 members. Why not raise this in the final six months of this Lion year to 1,646? You can do it!

You wouldn't probably know this, but when I return home I have to develop a report for LCI as part of the official visit. Having to do this opens up some new visions about the club that can be both helpful and well worth remembering.....sort of a lesson in transition. We try to carry good ideas from one club visit to another.

I am well pleased with the district so far. We amazing some statistics developed by our 1st vice district governor, Ross Drapalik. A couple of those are the MMR and activity reporting. **MMR** last month was almost 100% with only one club The activity not filing! reports have been on a real upswing, and we are now above 70% participation by the 25 C clubs, and we have logged approximately

27,000 with hours 77,000 approximately people served (isn't this what Lions are all about!) Keep it up and keep on improving the record. Activity reports are extremely important to LCI in that this is how they track what Lions are doing terms of service. Another stat: up until December 1st of 2015, we were +13 in membership. Then as it always happens, it is time to clean out the books and into December dropped we to zero. Wonder how much cleaning out we would have to do each year if we could but just develop a really good mentoring program to keep our folks on board?

Finally, there are 5 project trustee positions opening up for the new Lion year and one Indiana Lions Foundation trustee position. We have a new governor to elect (Ross Drapalik), a new first VDG (Chloe Weyrauch) AND a second VDG (Douglas Eversole of the Young

America Lions Club.) Yes, we have a person for position for the that coming year!



CELEBRATION OF LIFE -- LION BOB DALE OF THE LAFAYETTE LIONS CLUB

Lion Robert ("Bob") Dale of the Lafayette Lions Club passed away peacefully on February 1, 2016, following a stroke at the age of 95.

Since joining the Anchorage Alaska Club in March of 1950, Lion Bob's Lion experience moved with him to San Francisco, then to Ames Iowa, and finally here to Lafayette and Purdue – a great example of the reach of Lions clubs. A Lion with a truly great heart, Bob has worked on eye glass recycling, diabetes projects, the Indiana Lions Eye Bank, and a host of other Lions programs to help the needy.

His dedication led to perfect attendance for 66 years, the sponsoring of five new members, and being Secretary and President of the Lafayette Club. Lion Bob served as Zone Chair from 1993-1995, helping keep the smiles and perspiration coming and was awarded a Melvin Jones Fellowship in 2001. Then in 2011, Lion Bob received a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellowship for his continued support of the values and ethics of Lions. A 95-year old, Lion Bob was always willing to do what he could to reach out and help others. A good, kind, thoughtful and brilliant man of faith and charity, Lion Bob will be missed by many.

Lion Bob was recognized at our 25C District Convention last year by Past International Director Steve Tremaroli for being the longest serving Lion in the District!

President of the Lafayette Lions Club, Lion Bob Goldberg commented, "The word "beloved" is generally only used in connection with spouses and paramours. However, I know I can say without fear of contradiction that Lion Bob was beloved by all of us. Not simply because he was a great person, but because he simply refused to stop helping people through Lions."

Funeral plans have not yet been finalized. This information will be sent out as soon as it is available.



Editor's Note: I had the great honor of sitting next to Lion Bob during the luncheon where he was honored by ID Tremaroli. Bob had the knack of entertaining everyone at the table. When I was thanked for my work at a Children's Lunch Program and another at our table was likewise honored for Lions work, his eyes sparkled and he remarked he felt he'd landed at the winners table. He certainly made us all feel special. His zest and sparkle shall be greatly missed.
