 He will be missed. Lion David has left his legacy in many ways for those who knew him. He has also given 4 people a second chance at life.  
 In addition he gave someone the chance to see and enjoy the world around them.  
 What a Knight of the Blind! Since January 1 2011 there have been 5 heart, 18 kidney and 14 liver transplants from deceased donors.  
 The motto I've been using for A-3 Organ and Tissue Donation program:  
 "We are Lions out to change the statistics one signature at a time."  
Lion David and his family have changed the statistics!
