

- ❖ At the 1st meeting of the 1950-51 year, it was reported that the Street Dance proceeds were \$675.25 and the Donkey Baseball proceeds were \$25.93. \$300 was donated to the Community Centre.
- On October 16, 1950, it was noted that a young woman was being transported to Toronto for an eye examination. The Lion Secretary was asked to send a letter of Greetings to the new Lions Club in Helsinki, Finland. Wednesday, October 25th was set as the date for Lions to paint the dressing rooms in the Community Centre.
- On October 30, 1950, the Club donated \$10 to the Children's Aid Society and \$10 to the C.N.I.B.
- ❖ The Club joined the Frankford Lions Club on November 8, 1950, to attend the Governor's Night. Over 100 Lions attended this meeting, to honour Lion District Governor Alf Cadman, of Montreal.
- On December 4, 1950, it was decided that the Club would enter a float in the Santa Claus Parade, at a cost not to exceed \$25.
- ❖ On December 10, 1950, \$10 was donated to the Northumberland T.B. Association.
