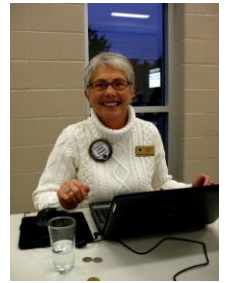

A request for \$100.00 at the Hospitality Room at the up and coming Convention, this was denied and we will place an Ad in the program as per last year.

Appeals

- A letter from the Youth Exchange Program has been received requesting \$600.00. In the past the funds have been distributed to other “youth” programs where the funds were needed, such as Effective Speaking, the Peace Poster. A motion by Lion Harvey to send \$200.00 to Graham Lewis for the Effective Speaking Program was seconded by Lion Owen. Carried.
- Lion Astrida made a motion that we send \$150.00 to the Student Exchange Program, seconded by Lion Owen. Carried
- A request was received from Lake Joe for an engraved Brick for their walkway for \$250.00. Lion Astrida made a motion that we support Lake Joe for \$250.00, second by Lion Denys. Carried
- Lion Harvey made a motion that we support the Lions Home for the Deaf for \$100.00, second by Lion Astrida. Carried
- Lion Denys made a motion that we support the VON for \$100.00, second by Lion Owen. Carried

- A request was received from the University Hospital Kingston Foundation. It was decided that we would not be sending a donation this year.
- A motion by Lion Astrida and second by Lion Harvey that we support the Big Sisters/ Big Brothers with a donation of \$100.00. Carried

Ways and Means

Lion Owen presented a report from the Ways and Means Committed. Lion Denys will forward this to Lion Jim for insertion into the bulletin.

Treasurers Report – Lion Denys: This will be sent as an email.

Public Service

- ◆ Lion Denys read a request from a single mother with one son who is a student at ENSS for a request for her Hydro bill for \$634.00, Lions Denys and Jane have been in touch with other Community groups and the Brighton Fire Department have offered to share the cost being \$317. The Kinsmen have also been approached and should they have funds available we would all contribute one third. Lion Denys made a motion to that we assist as per the above, this was second by Lion Harvey. Carried
- ◆ A request was received from St Vincent DePaul Society for \$500.00, to assist a family with their rent/Hydro. The family is in arrears \$1,950 for their rent and \$1500 for their hydro. A motion was made by Lion Denys and seconded by Lion Astrida that we assist with \$500.00. Lion Jane will continue to investigate other venues. Carried

New Business

- ❖ Lion Harvey advised that it can take up to 120 days for the Police Checks to be completed. Lion Harvey requires 2 pieces of photo ID (to be available for viewing) for each Lion along with a form to be completed by each Lion. This new check will only be done once. A motion was made by Lion Harvey

that upon acceptance into the Brighton Lions Club any new person will sign the appropriate paperwork for the Police Check, second by Lion Astrida. Carried .

- ❖ Lion Harvey reported on the meeting for the new Leo Club. Ten students were in attendance with both Lion President Don and Lion Don showing support for the new club. The next meeting will be held on Saturday March 26 at 3pm in the Brighton

Library. Lion Harvey advised that in order to start a Leo Club the minimum number of participants is 5. It was also suggested that they meet once a month with one Directors meeting. Lion Harvey has agreed to be the "Guiding Lion" and asked for club support, he was also hoping that Lions Don and Don would assist in this worthwhile effort.

Ways and Means Committee

Minutes of Meeting 2011 03 03

Present: Committee Chair Lion Bob, Lion President Don, Lions Theo, Denys, Owen, Ruth and Hugh

Committee Chair Lion Bob opened the meeting by reviewing the agreement we have with the town regarding the usage of the King Edward Community Center. We have the use of the hall as follows:

- ◆ every Monday from 5-12 pm for 10 years
- ◆ rent free for 15 days per year for 5 years (dates to be negotiated as needed)
- ◆ every Wed from 5-12pm rent free for 1 year for Bingo

This agreement took effect on 1 July 2009 so we are two years into it. Lion Bob felt that since we had the use of the hall for 15 days a year we should be looking at using it more.

The Committee looked at the *what and when* of fund raising events that we presently carry out:

1. Bingo..... All year (perhaps not in July and Aug ???)
2. Kidspiel and 50/50 draw.....March 27th
3. Canada Day including Soap Box Derby .. July ?
4. Applefest..Sat., Sept.24 & Sun. 25th
5. Art Show Oct 20-23rd
6. Christmas Hamper tickets..... Dec. 19th
7. TrueLife cookout..... July ?
8. Terry Fox Pancake Breakfast.--Sept. or Oct (no spring PB)
9. Yard Sale ????? May, Jun Jul, Aug ???
10. Jamboree for Life cookout.....April 23 ?

Lion Denys estimated that the Bingo brings in about \$300 per week which would come to about \$11 000 per

year if it does not run over the summer. It takes 8-10 people to run the Bingo. There are presently 29 members in the club but some members are unable to assist in fund-raising activities such as Bingo. There was some concern expressed that we be careful not to take on more that the Club could handle and that events be spread out over the year.

Suggestions for new activities that we could take part in were brought forward such as

- ✓ A concert made up of local talent...Lion Bob will talk to Ron Waddling about this
- ✓ Cricklewood Farm corn maze... they have offered us 7% of the gross if we help out with certain aspects of the promotion and put on a BBQ on Sat.Sept. 3. Any money we get from this event would go to the Guide Dogs
- ✓ A comedy show...we have an offer from a promoter to put on a comedy show at a cost to us of \$1500 plus accommodation for three comedians. Lion Bob will look into this further.
- ✓ A cookout at Cricklewood on the Aug. Civic Holiday long weekend (Sat. July 30th)
- ✓ A combined Casino night and spaghetti dinner. After a long discussion this idea was put on hold because of the large numbers of people involved in putting it on and our inexperience at both these things. Some further investigation will be carried out on this one.
- ✓ The Dragon Boat cookout..... not known if we will be asked to do this one or not.
- ✓ Pop and popcorn at the Concert in the Park

evenings. General agreement that this could continue without very many workers and that while it did not raise a lot of money it did put Lions in the public eye.

- ✓ Canada Day Bingo. It was suggested that we run a Bingo on the afternoon of Canada Day but it was agreed that we could not do both a Bingo and the Soap Box Derby on the same day. This prompted a long discussion about the "effectiveness" of the Soap Box derby and Kidspiel. Some felt that the manpower required to stage these events was large compared to the number of kids who took part. It was generally agreed that those involved thought both events were well received by those who took part but that neither event had grown over the years. Lion Denys said that he had organized the Soap Box Derby for 10 years and he did not wish to do it another year. It was agreed that Lion Pres. Don would ask the Club for direction and that the Committee would recommend that the Soap Box Derby be discontinued unless someone in the Club would agree to take it over and it be replaced by a special Bingo. (So what happens to the carts if we discontinue asked Lion Hugh ???)
- ✓ Lion Theo brought forward the idea of selling "prize

calenders"... they would sell for \$20 (or so) and would offer a prize of \$20 every day and \$1000 twice a year. About 600 would need to be sold for us to make money.

- ✓ Lion Theo brought forward the idea of a "donation box " located somewhere around town. He already has a giant pair of glasses that could be used with donations going to causes like SightFirst.
- ✓ Lion Theo also wondered about selling hot dogs on the street from time to time or on special days.

Some concern was expressed about taking on too much for the Club to handle. It was thought that we should be careful about spreading things over the whole year. This led to a casual discussion about cooperation with Rotary, Kinsmen etc on projects where we needed lots of people to help out. There was even mention of the possibility of combining all three clubs into a single "Community Service Club". Not something we would like to see but with dwindling memberships and aging members it is a thought.

Thanks to Lion Denys for hosting the meeting and providing coffee, cookies and a friendly dog to pet !

This Month's Taste of the Past

(A regular feature by Lion Harvey Moore, Club Historian)



- ❖ On June 4, 1951, the Club approved of the purchase of furniture for the old Gun Club house at Presqu'ile. This was to aid the Northumberland and Durham Children's Aid Society of Port Hope to use the house as a summer camp for their wards, that summer.
- ❖ At the same meeting, \$100 was donated to send a young woman to Tacoma, Washington, for treatment of multiple sclerosis. The Club found that they could not send the woman to Tacoma via R.C.A.F. airplane, so they contacted the Tacoma Lions Club, who agreed to make a reservation for her at the Tacoma Hospital and made arrangements for all transportation for her and her mother while they were in Tacoma. Our Club did a canvass and collected \$1,000 for their trip.
- ❖ On June 18, 1951, we received a Thank-you letter from the Brighton Hove Lions Club for gifts we had sent to them.
- ❖ On October 1, 1951, a taxi bill of \$15 was paid to take a child to Kingston General Hospital for a polio check.
- ❖ On October 29th, \$10 was donated as a prize for the Public Speaking contest at Brighton P.S. (They now call it Effective Speaking.)

Chairperson Wirfs' Update on New Zealand

March 3, 2011

I'm sure that you have been following the news reports of the devastating earthquake in Christchurch, New Zealand. Much of the city is still without water and sewage systems and aftershocks continue. Thousands are homeless as a result of the destruction.

Right now, Margit and I, and LCIF staff, are on our way to New Zealand to meet with Lions and view their current relief efforts. We will also meet with the mayor and Red Cross to discuss future plans.

Lions have been providing assistance since the devastating earthquake February 22, and LCIF is providing US\$110,000 to help Lions in providing relief to their communities. In the past week Lions services include:

- Delivering 500 portable toilets to Doctors Surgery's, Nurse Maud Assn. and households in eastern suburbs
- Going door to door in the suburbs with the Red Cross to find those who need assistance
- Providing grocery and fuel vouchers to families in need as well as food, bedding and water
- Volunteering at welfare centers in Christchurch and Timaru

- Raising \$34,000 during a weekend fund-raiser
- Distributing meals through a food caravan in Christchurch
- Lions from neighboring areas traveling to Christchurch to assist in relief projects, such as door-to-door outreach, delivering food and helping with clean-up
- Lions in neighboring towns are organizing dinners for displaced families and housing for Lions in need
- Staffing two daily shifts to assist at the national Red Cross coordination office in Wellington
- Delivering a 40,000 litre tanker of fresh water to the suburbs of Christchurch
- Providing weekend breaks to families to escape from the city for two days

Wherever there is a need, there is a Lions club nearby, ready to respond with their hearts and hands. In the case of disasters, we are among the first to offer help, and the last to leave. If you want to help the people of New Zealand, the most effective and immediate way to do this is through a designated donation to LCIF for New Zealand relief.
