All Past District A3 Governors are very busy – here are some:





The bond that develops between the Dog Guide and child allows for increased social interaction for the family and the child. These Dog Guides can be identified by their maroon harnesses.

With a growl of great compassion, The International Association of Lions Clubs offers people the opportunity to volunteer in their local areas and global community. Its more than 1 million members are involved in a range of projects, from neighborhood initiatives to farreaching international campaigns.



Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides' mission is to assist Canadians with a medical or physical disability by providing them Dog Guides at no cost.

Lions Foundation of Canada is excited to announce the launch of its Opening Doors to Independence campaign. Our goal is to raise \$1 million to launch a sixth Dog Guide program while increasing its service of the current five Dog Guide programs. To do so, there will be a renovation and expansion of the Oakville training centre to meet the needs well into the future as more people will be served from coast to coast.
