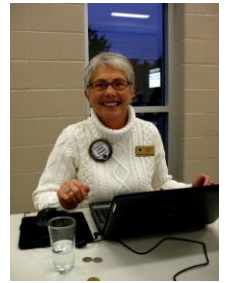

- ❖ Lion Owen spoke regarding the hamburgers that were left over indicating that payment for any purchased should be made to Lion Keith.

- ◆ A request from Lion Joe Menna for assistance with the medical care of his sister Mary Simonitto who is having to travel to the USA for treatment of her spinal cord. Lion Astrida moved for a payment of \$400.00, being the cost of one treatment . Seconded by Lion Harvey. Carried
- ◆ Lion Denys reviewed the Bingo results for the past 8 months and we have made a profit of \$8000.00. Negotiations will soon begin for the hall rental starting in September.
- ◆ Lion Denys made a motion for a request from a Grade 5 student with Cerebral Palsy for funds to help purchase a mobility device. Lion Denys suggested a donation of \$400.00, seconded by Lion Astrida. Carried

- ◆ Lion Denys also had a request from a local resident for assistance with glasses and made a motion that we pay \$250.00 toward their purchase, seconded by Lion Owen. Carried

- Lion Harvey made a motion that we contribute \$200.00 for Infant resuscitators at Belleville General Hospital. Seconded by Lion Keith. Carried
- Lion Astrida made a motion that we support the Special Olympics for \$100 Astrida. Seconded by Lion Harvey. Carried
- Lion Harvey made a motion that we contribute \$200.00 to University Hospital Kingston Foundation, seconded by Lion Astrida. Carried

This Month's Taste of the Past

(A regular feature by Lion Harvey Moore, Club Historian)



- ★ On April 21, 1952, our guests were the officers and players of the R.C.A.F. Flyers, who were the Trent Valley Hockey League Champions in 1951-52.
- ★ On May 5, 1952, Lion President Mark Scanlon announced a plan to establish a blood bank at Trenton Memorial Hospital for Brighton patients. The three finalists from the High School Speaking Contest spoke at the meeting. They were Gay Bonisteel, Gail Ireland and Frances Hatfield.
- ★ At the May 12, 1952 Directors' meeting, \$10 was donated to the Salvation Army Red Shield Appeal. A picture of the Queen was purchased for \$3.15. Arrangements were made to transport patients to the Crippled Children's Centre at Port Hope on May 14th. On May 19th, it was reported that twelve children had gone to the clinic.
- ★ On June 2, 1952, the Easter Seal Committee reported \$315 collected. Two indoor toilets and sinks were ordered to be installed at the Summer Camp at Presqu'île. Ten Lions received 100% attendance pins.
- ★ On June 16, 1952, the Easter Seal Committee paid \$65 for braces for a three year old girl. The Officers for 1952-53 were installed. Lion Roy Spencer became President. (Lion Roy at a later date, became Deputy District Governor. He was the 1st Brighton Lion to be a District Officer.)

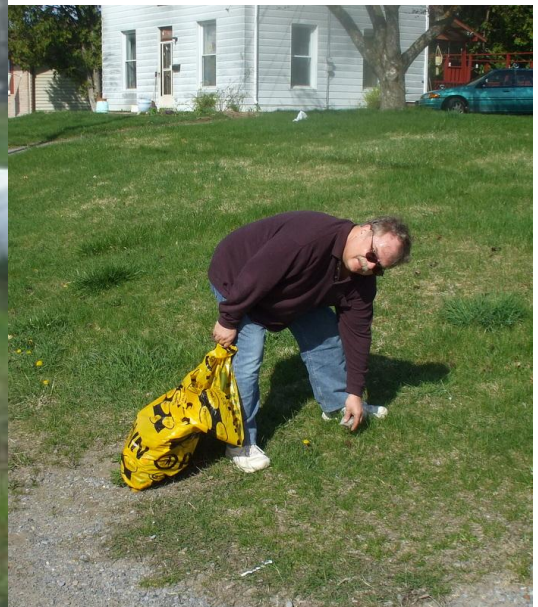
Clean Sweep
