
Resignation from Lion Ruth has been received . A motion was made from Lion Hugh and second by Lion Don A that we accept this resignation with regret. Carried

This Month's Taste of the Past

(A regular feature by Lion Harvey Moore, Club Historian)





- A cable of "Season's Greetings" was sent to the Brighton-Hove Lions Club in England. (Our Club sponsored that Club.)
- On January 21, 1953, the Directors ordered new Highway Lions signs for Highway 30. Lion Royal Quick was appointed to make and install CAUTION signs on each side of the public school entrance on Highway 2.
- Our senior member, Lion P.P. Claude Thompson, was inducted into the Club on January 26, 1953, along with Austin Fulton (High School Principal) and Ed Boes (Lumber Dealer & Fire Chief).
- At the February 9, 1953 meeting, \$100 was sent to the European Flood Relief Fund. A committee was selected to attend the next Council meeting in an attempt to get artificial ice put into the arena.
- On February 26, 1953, the Club agreed to join all of the Northumberland Lions Clubs to buy two TV sets for the Home for the Aged in Cobourg. The money was shared on a per capita basis.



VISION SCREENING ANNUAL REPORT

We started out in the Fall, as usual, with testing at Brighton School but had to abort due to our auto-refractor telling us that it needed recalibration. We were surprised because we thought that having purchased a new auto-refractor it should not need calibrating after only one year's use. However, after checking with the technicians we found that it needs re-calibrating every year.

Upon receiving the auto-refractor back from recalibrating we resumed testing as follows:

6 schools screened - Brighton, Spring Valley, Smithfield, Murray Centennial, Colborne, & Grafton.

From these 6 schools 328 consent forms were sent out, and 191 were returned, for a return rate of 58%, slightly above normal. Of these 191 students tested, 118 passed our tests = 62 %.

Formerly, we tested 8 schools - S.Cramahé & Castelton in addition to the 6 listed above. S.Cramahé & Castleton have since been amalgamated into one new school called Northumberland Hills.

Since the new Lions' Club in Colborne came into being, it occurred to me to incorporate some of their members into the process of Vision Screening, since the schools in their area would come under their jurisdiction. So I asked PDG Dog Galt, who I understand is their mentor and one of their founding members, if he could provide me with names of their Club who have the necessary Police Checks.

I was pleased when he came up with 6 of their members, including himself, who were qualified & willing to do this. Accordingly, Lions Hugh McDonald, Denys Avis, Doug Galt (who has participated many times with the Brighton Club) & myself acted as self-appointed trainers to show these new members the ropes. It was really not our job to do this as Lion Susan Taylor, the District Vision Screening Co-ordinator, is the trainer. I hope she didn't mind us doing this, but it seemed appropriate.

Anyway, the 6 Colborne members were very keen & quick to learn, and expressed an interest & willingness to continue with it. We were all able to test Colborne and Grafton schools on the same day. One of them volunteered to be their Club's co-ordinator, and

she said she would get back to me to set up a date for the Northumberland School testing.

Since then, I made repeated calls to the Northumberland Hills Principal who didn't return my calls, and I didn't hear back from the Colborne Club coordinator either. Meanwhile it got to be too close to the end of the school year to pursue it any further. So I guess it kind of fell by the wayside, as the expression goes. We did our best to get Colborne Club set up & trained for it.

I would like our club to know that, in response to tentative enquiries, I have made it clear that, regrettably, we would not be in a position to loan our equipment to other clubs. We paid over \$8,000 for our kit because we were frustrated with the embarrassment of the shared Zone equipment continually breaking down due to abuse during training & sharing with other clubs, so we carefully guard our investment. I understand that the shared Zone equipment has now improved with the addition of another auto-refractor for when one breaks down.

When I contact the school Principals to set up dates, it is my practice to leave my personal business card, and to tell them that if they become aware of any children who need glasses as a result of our testing, and whose parents are unable to afford to buy them, to contact me or write to Box 37, Brighton, and either I or our Secretary will refer it to the Public Service Committee. In the past we have responded to quite a few requests for this, but when I checked with Lion Jane she said that her Committee had not been asked to respond to any requests for help with glasses as a result of Vision Screening during the past year. Of course, this doesn't necessarily mean that none of the kids we tested ended up needing glasses.

I noted that in a Financial Report I believe it was stated that \$250 was spent on eye glasses, but this must have been for people other than those in the Vision Screening age range.

I asked Lion Secretary Marion if she would search the catalogue to see if there is an official Lions' business card, upon which we could have our address printed, so I could give it to the Principals instead of my own personal one. If so, this might also be a useful tool for the members for the purpose of contacting and recruiting new members. (continued..../9)
