Donald was an active member of Lions International for over 40 years. He was a member of Norwood Lions Club, attaining perfect attendance for 18-1/2 years, where he progressed through the various offices and served as President, then went on to become District Governor of District A-3 in the year 1970-1971.

He transferred his membership to Clemons Lake District Lions Club as a Charter member and received a Life Membership from Lions Clubs International from that Club on their fifth anniversary year.

He was the Guiding Lion in the formation of the East City Lions Club.

During his earlier and active years with the Lions, Donald became very involved in Youth Exchange and was instrumental in starting a Youth Exchange Program which spanned over 10 years, between District A-3 Ontario, Pennsylvania and later Connecticut, USA. During those years, both he and his wife Florence spent their summers organizing, chaperoning and transporting the students on the buses to and from Ontario, Pennsylvania and Connecticut. At the end of his term approximately 1,000 students went through the program.

Donald received an International Presidential Award in 1978-1979 from International President, Ralph A Lyman, for his work with the youth.

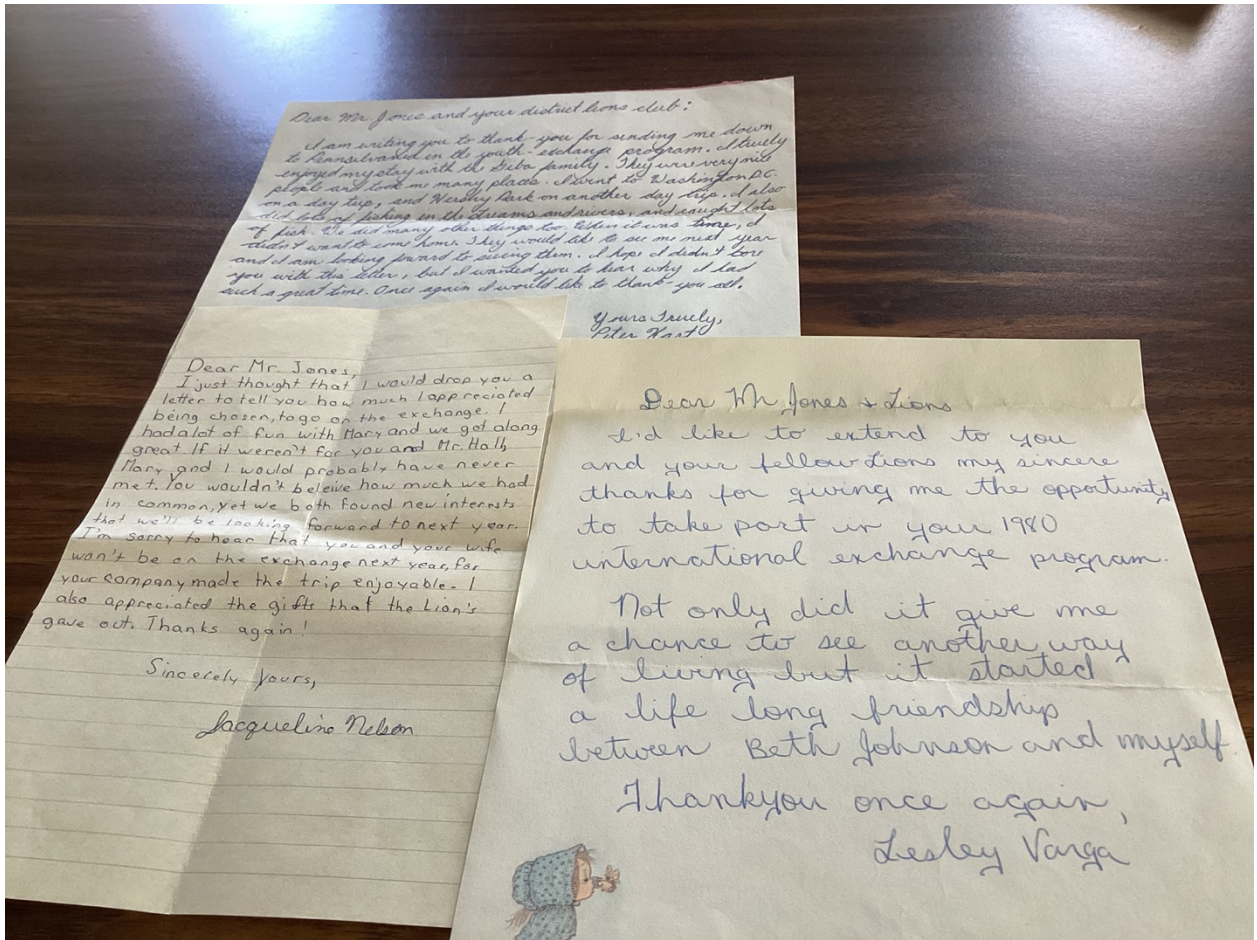
Dear Don:
