

She has been working with this project for the last five years. Ana also works with the Community Development Coucil Durham on a Trillium Project. She has two sons and resides in Whitby.





The project provides healthy breakfasts and snacks for students in schools across the Region of Durham. Children who start their day hungry often struggle with learning and can also have behavioural problems. 31% of elementery students and 62% of secondary school students start their day without a nutritional breakfast. The Project secures funding from several sources for the nutrition programs and provides necessary training to the volunteers for running and sustaining the nutrition programs. Making the public aware of this program is key to generating funding through donations. They have no administration costs, Ana is the only paid staff member and she works from her home. They are currently looking for sponsors for next year's school year. This was an excellent presentation, Ana fielded numerous questions from the membership.

Lion Don MacKay thanked Ana and presented her with a cheque.

A motion was made to follow-up on a sponsorship of a school for September.

Birthdays - The tailtwister paid a visit to Lion Ed Johnston's table and my table (sorry about that). It is just amazing how short the time seems to be getting between birthdays. On a age related topic Lion Robbie told me if you add your age for this year and the year you were born it adds up to 111 in the year 2011. Apparently this works for everyone. Clearly math was one of Lion Robbie's good subjects in school.

Lion Don MacKay introduced our speaker Linda Sharpen. Linda has worked as the manager at the Eye Bank in Toronto since 2003.

Linda highlighted the importance of eye donation. As long as you are between the age of 2 and 100 you are eligable to donate your eyes. The Eye Bank was formed in 1955 to help soldiers returning from war. Over 1100 corneal transplants are done a year, with over 86,000 eyes donated to date. Unfortunately there is still a 3 year wait for a transplant. Transplants can be done on infants at 6 weeks of age, the oldest person that has received an eye transplant is 94. Children that receive transplants will require a transplant later in life as they grow. All eye donations are used, if not for transplant, they can be used for research or teaching, eyes from people who are blind can also be used. Linda told some of the recipient's stories of the independence they have gained from getting their sight back, things we take for granted and stories from families who have made that decision to donate a loved ones eyes. The eyes have to be harvested from the deceased within 12 hours of the persons death and the transplant must take place within 12 hours of being harvested.

Lion Bill Shackleton stated that our club has made 229 trips to the Eye Bank to date. With our club providing this service to the Eye Bank Linda said the Eye Bank has saved over \$30,000.00

Linda is looking for more service clubs to help with transportation in particular in the Hamilton area. Lion Bill Shackleton offered to accompany Linda the next time she is speaking in Hamilton to help recrute service clubs.

Lion Bill thanked Linda and Linda thanked our club for our support of the Eye Bank and presented President Steve with a plaque in appreciation.

Once again The Lions Club of Bowmanville can say "We Serve".

Induction – President Lion Steve Simic, Regional Chair Lion Albert Munneke and Membership Chair Lion Jim Coombes inducted Dave Best into the club. Dave was sponsored by Lion Doug Kemp and Lion Charles Stevens. Dave was raised on a dairy farm in Solina. He attended the University of Guelph with Lion Charles Stevens and Lion Ken Burgess. Dave worked in Alberta for 25 years before returning to Ontario. He has 1 brother and 2 sisters.
