The First Twenty Five Years Of Lionism in Newcastle- Written for the 50th Anniversary, 1997

The story started fifty years ago in the spring of 1947, when members of the Bowmanville Lions Club held a meeting at the Elmhurst Hotel and invited eleven Newcastle men.

The Bowmanville Lions Club wanted to see if there was an interest in organizing a Lions Club in the Village; they felt it would be a real asset to our community.

The eleven men were Harry Ward, H.J. Toms, Archie Glenny, Jim Taylor, Ken Werry, Frank McMullen, George Walton, Stan Graham, Irwin Colwill, Percy Hare, and J.H. Jose. The Bowmanville Lions members were Ross Stevens, Nelson Osborne, J.J.Brown, R.Osborne, C.W.Carter, Ed Crawford, Russ Pollard, Stu James and Bruce Malcom. Bruce Malcom acted as Chair.

The Bowmanville members discussed and outlined the advantage of this association. It was moved by Percy Hare and seconded by Jim Taylor that a Lions Club be organized in the Village of Newcastle with a limit of 35 members. A motion was made to elect a President and Secretary immediately. This was moved by Harry Ward and seconded by Stan Graham. Percy Hare was elected as President and Frank McMullen as Secretary.

The next meeting would be held in the Council Chambers on Tuesday, April 5, 1947, at 8:00 P.M. and everyone was encouraged to bring a guest.

Valuable assistance in the organizing was given by the sponsoring Bowmanville Lions Club. Regular club meetings were held at the Elmhurst Hotel. With the Bowmanville Lions Club's assistance the Newcastle Lions Club was chartered on the 6th of May 1947.

Charter Night of the Newcastle Lions Club was held Monday 26th of May 1947 in the Newcastle Community Hall. The ticket price was \$1.25 each. Charter President Percy Hare received the charter from District Governor Dr. P. B. Rynard. Meetings were held on the 1st and 3rd Thursdays of each month at 7:00 P.M. at the Elmhurst Hotel, the meals were \$1.00 per person.

After 50 years, I am sorry to report that we have lost all the original Charter Members in our Club, due to death, moving from the area and other interests. Lion George Walton was our last Charter Member, who remained an active member until his death in 1994. It is interesting that 9 of these members through the years served us as President.

The Newcastle Lions Club was not just an average club. In the first years that we operated we had members not only from the Village of Newcastle and surrounding area, but also the Village of Orono (7). One of the first events was a field day in the Orono Community Park on August 20, 1947.

During the first years of the club, the fund raising events were Dances and Bingos in the Community Hall, Minstrel Shows, Jitney Dancing, Selling Planter Peanuts, selling Light Bulbs, a Turkey Shoot, selling Christmas Cakes, Donkey Baseball, a Stag Night and Carnivals. Some of the members will recall the Carnival that we held and had The Beauty Contest with the applause meter. (A bit of a disaster!!)

Over the years, the Newcastle Lions has raised thousands of dollars, and generously returned those thousands in service work in the community and area. To describe here all the worthy activities of the club is not possible nor desirable. The activities have been just as varied as need be. Some were expensive others were just plain hard work and good leadership.

I would at this time like to mention how some of the money was spent in the first twenty five years. The money raised was returned for youth work, support of the seniors and generally as a community helper. Hallowe'en and Christmas parties were organized and held at the Community Hall. Donations were made to Cubs, Scouts, Father and Son Banquets, Public Schools for their Field Day awards, Public Speaking and sponsorship in the local minor hockey league (sweaters). One of our committees, the sight conservation and blind committee, has made several canvases for the CNIB to collect

eye glasses and provided transportation for those people in need.

Our club has made large contributions to the Village and area. We have donated to the seniors at Christmas and needy families throughout the years. The Newcastle Lions were in the forefront in the Community Hall renovations (the main auditorium, the Bowling Alley, Centennial Room). We also helped with the park improvements, artificial ice in the arena and the fireworks displays.

All Work And No Play? No! Not The Lions.

We had some great times in the early years, visiting other clubs and attending the Past Presidents nights in Peterborough. District Conventions, Wild Goose Chases, Steak BBQ at Rod Carveth's cottage and at Doug Wright's place just to mention a few memorable times that we hope will lead up to bigger and better times for the future.

What has happened in these 25 years would not have been possible if it had not been for the people of the Village of Newcastle and surrounding area.

We all want to say thank you many times over for all their help and generosity. For a Village the size of Newcastle we have been able to accomplish a great deal.

In summing up our first twenty-five years of activity, we are like a team; we have had our good times and sad times; we have worked hard and played hard. We have helped the needy and our community and as individuals we have strengthened ourselves by knowledge that has been generated from this team of Lions.

The Newcastle Lions Club can truly say that we have fulfilled our pledge "WE SERVE"





Above left, Lions John and Gus draw the winning draw ticket for the \$1800 travel voucher. Karen Bastas stands by along with the MC, Sophie.


